2019 Husky Greenhands Program



In 2019, Husky developed the Greenhands Program with Ridgeline Canada Inc. and the Battleford's Agency Tribal Chiefs (BATC).

This program allowed for local Indigenous communities to gain practical remediation & reclamation field training that compliments First Alliance Energy Service's existing training program with the BATC.

The program was unique in that it offered practical experience or a "Practicum First" mentality, then a specialized post-secondary education opportunity as opposed to the traditional education/practicum model





Pilot Projects

2021 Northern Lights College Practicum



In partnership with the BC Ministry of Education, the BC Oil and Gas Commission, and Northern Lights College, Ridgeline completed a pilot project in 2021 that provided work-integrated environmental learning opportunities and college credit to Indigenous Students.

The students took virtual classes through Northern Lights College, assisted by Ridgeline Canada on various subjects such as ecology, botany, weed management, forest ecology, and soil taxonomy. The online training was also substantiated with hands-on training exercises.

The classes for this program started in May 2021 and 23 students completed the project in December 2021.

Upon successful completion of the training program, students receive college credit, equivalent to 6 courses, that are transferrable to any BC post-secondary institution.

Graduates can further continue their studies at the Northern Lights College Land & Water Program to earn their diploma or continue on to any post-secondary institution in BC to obtain their degree.
