WHAT'S THE SECRET?

The secret about scholarship essays is that most applications ask the SAME questions. This gives you the perfect opportunity to use old essays to win new money. It just takes a little finesse.

This workshop will prepare you with the top 5 most common scholarship essay prompts. Through this process, we will work to craft your unique story. The goal of this workshop is to get you on the path to writing scholarship-winning essays.

Don't be afraid of the five essays, you already know all the information needed to complete these prompts. It's all about you, after all! Through this process, you will get in touch with your passions, goals, and future life as a college student.

ESSAY #1: THE "WHY YOU?" QUESTION

The question: Why do you deserve this scholarship?

Why are they asking me this?

This question might seem a bit shady, but these organizations want to know they are investing in the right person.

What do I write about?

1. How will the money help you pursue your career/goals?
2. What have you done so far to pursue your goals and how will the money help?
3. What will the scholarship help you do in the future?

ESSAY #2: THE "GOAL DIGGER" QUESTION

The question: What are your academic and/or career goals?

Why are they asking me this?

Once again, people want to know that their money is going in a good place. You need to show them that you have a clear plan for their financial contribution.

What do I write about?

- 1, What is your goal?
2. What/who inspired you to pursue your goal?
3. What are you doing to show your interest (clubs/organizations/workshops/classes)?

ESSAY #3: THE "LIFE LESSON" QUESTION

The question: Talk about a time you failed at something/made a mistake. What did you learn from it?

Why are they asking me this?

Learning from your mistakes shows maturity and perseverance. This is an important mindset to have in order to succeed in college.

What do I write about?

1. What was the mistake?
2. How did you adjust?
3. What did you learn from this?

ESSAY #4: THE "PUSH THROUGH" QUESTION

The question: Talk about a time you've overcome an obstacle

Why are they asking me this?

College is tough, it's important that you can learn to roll with the punches and throw a few of your own. This is your time to show you're not afraid to back down from a challenge.

What do I write about?

1. What was the obstacle?
2. How did you push through?
3. What did you learn?

ESSAY #5: THE "ROLE MODEL" QUESTION

The question: Who do you admire and why?

Why are they asking me this?

You are the people you look up to! This is your time to show love to those that have encouraged you to aim high.

What do I write about?

1. Who is your role model?
2. How do they inspire you?
3. How do you use their inspiration to set/accomplish your goals?

TIPS & TRICKS

You may be asking, “Wait...How do I even write an essay?”

Don't worry, I got you.

QUICK TIPS

1. Check your grammar

Grammarly.com is a great place to catch typos and grammar issues. You DON'T need to pay, the free version works pretty well on it's own.

2. Find your voice

Focus on capturing your natural voice. Reading your essay back to you is a good way to catch any weird sentence structure that a grammar checker can't pick up.

3. Be a victor (not a victim)

Writing a scholarship is not about who has the best sob story, it is about showing colleges you have the drive and motivation to push through challenges. Dig deep and share your personal stories but make sure you always provide examples of how these stories have shaped your life. This is your time to show your strengths.



Basic Essay Structure

This is a traditional essay structure that helps you gather your ideas in an easily readable format.

Your essay format will be:

Double spaced, Times New Roman font, and 12 point font. 1-2 pages

Introduction

Strong opener

Your opener needs to catch the readers attention. Think about something that will make people stop and want to continue reading your essay

Thesis Statement

Your thesis statement explains what your essay is going to cover. It should address every point you're going to make in your body paragraph. Aim for one sentence that briefly covers each point.

Body

Paragraph 1

Address the first point of your thesis. Provide supporting evidence.

Paragraph 2

Address the second point of your thesis. Provide supporting evidence.

Paragraph 3

Address the third point of your thesis. Provide supporting evidence.

Conclusion

Wrap everything up! Restate the essay prompt and summarize everything you said in the body paragraph. End with a strong closer.
