

OUR DAILY BREAD


'Give us this day our daily bread' means the bread which is sufficient for our nature and existence. He removes the care for tomorrow. The body of Christ is the daily bread, and we pray that we may share in it blamelessly.

St Germanus of Constantinople

This prayer book was compiled to provide the lifegiving 'daily bread' to fulfil each day as our Lord commanded. Jesus Christ is the "Bread of Life" the "Bread of God which has come down from heaven and given life to the world" (John 6:33-36); the bread which "a man may eat of it and not die," but "live forever" (John 6:50-51). Thus the prayer for "daily bread" becomes the petition for daily spiritual nourishment through abiding communion with Christ so that one might live always with God.

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MORNING PRAYERS

O God, be merciful to me, a sinner! (Thrice)

In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

Glory to You, our God, glory to You.

Heavenly King, Comforter, Spirit of Truth, Who are everywhere present and filling all things, Treasury of good gifts and Giver of Life, come and abide in us, and cleanse us of all impurity, and save our souls, O Good One.

Holy God, Holy Mighty, Holy Immortal, have mercy on us. (Thrice)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Suddenly the Judge will come, and the deeds of each will be laid bare; but at midnight let us cry with fear: Holy, Holy, Holy are You, O God; through the Mother of God, have mercy on us.

Lord, have mercy (12 times)

Prayer of St. Basil the Great to the Most Holy Trinity As I rise from sleep I thank You, O Holy Trinity, for through Your great goodness and patience You are not angered with me, an idler and sinner, nor have You destroyed me in my sins, but have shown Your usual love for men, and when I was prostrate in despair, You have raised me to keep the morning watch and glorify Your power. And now enlighten my mind's eye and open my mouth to study Your words and understand Your commandments and do Your will and sing to You in heartfelt adoration and praise Your Most Holy Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

The abridged morning prayer service ends here, concluding with 'Through the prayers of our holy father, Lord, Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.' or you may continue saying: O come let us worship God our King.

Psalm 50

Have mercy on me, O God, according to Your great mercy and according to the abundance of Your compassion, blot out my transgression. Wash me thoroughly from my lawlessness and cleanse me from my sin. For I know my lawlessness, and my sin is always before me. Against You only have I sinned and done evil in Your sight; that You may be justified in Your words, and overcome when You are judged. For behold, I was conceived in transgressions, and in sins my mother bore me. Behold. You love truth: You showed me the unknown and secret wisdom. You shall sprinkle me with hyssop, and I will be cleansed; You shall wash me, and I will be made whiter than snow. You shall make me hear joy and gladness: my bones that were humbled shall greatly rejoice. Turn Your face from my sins, and blot out all my transgressions. Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. Do not cast me away from Your presence, and do not take Your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of Your salvation, and uphold me with You guiding Spirit. I will teach transgressors Your ways, and the ungodly shall turn back to You. Deliver me from bloodguiltness, O God, the God of my salvation. My tongue shall greatly rejoice in Your righteousness. O Lord, You shall open my lips and my mouth will declare Your praise. For if You desired sacrifice, I would give it; You will not be pleased with whole burnt offerings. A sacrifice of God is a broken spirit, a broken and humbled heart God will not despise. Do good, O Lord, in Your good pleasure to Zion, and let the walls of Jerusalem be built; then You will be pleased with a sacrifice of righteousness, with offerings and whole burnt offerings; then shall they offer young bulls on Your altar.

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible. And in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten from the Father before all ages, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten not made, one in essence with the Father; through him all things were made. For our sake and for our salvation He came down from heaven, and was incarnate of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and became man. He was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate, and suffered and was buried; He rose again on the third day, in accordance with the Scriptures, And ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He is coming again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and His kingdom will have no end. And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Giver of Life, who proceeds from the Father, who together with the Father and the Son is worshiped and together glorified, who spoke by the Prophets. I believe in one Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins. I look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the age to come. Amen.

First Prayer of St. Macarius the Great

O God, cleanse me, a sinner, for I have never done anything good in Your sight; deliver me from the evil one, and may Your will be in me, that I may open my unworthy mouth without condemnation, and praise Your holy Name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Second Prayer of St. Macarius the Great

Having risen from sleep, I offer You, O Saviour, the midnight song, and I fall down and cry unto You: grant me not to fall asleep in the death of sin, but have compassion on me, O You Who were voluntarily

crucified, and hasten to raise me who am prostrate in idleness, and save me in prayer and intercession, and after the night's sleep, bless me with a sinless day O Christ, our God, and save me.

Third Prayer of St. Macarius the Great

Having risen from sleep I hasten to You, O Lord, Lover of men, and by Your loving-kindness I strive to do Your work, and I pray to You: help me at all times, in everything, and deliver me from every evil thing of the world and every attack of the devil, and lead me into Your eternal Kingdom. For You are my Creator, the Giver and Provider of everything good, and all my hope is in You, and to You I send up glory, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Fourth Prayer of St. Macarius the Great

O Lord, Who in Your abundant goodness and Your great compassion have granted me, Your servant, to pass the time of this night without the temptation of any opposing evil, Lord and Creator of all, by Your true light and with an enlightened heart grant me to do Your will, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Fifth Prayer of St. Macarius the Great

Almighty Lord God, Who does receive from Your Heavenly Powers the thrice-holy hymn, receive also from me, Your unworthy servant, this song of the night, and grant me every year of my life and at every hour to send up glory to You, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

First Prayer of St. Basil the Great

Almighty Lord, God of the Powers and of all flesh, Who lives in the highest and cares for the humble, Who searches our hearts and affections, and clearly foreknows the secrets of men: eternal and ever-living Light, in Whom is no change nor shadow of variation; O Immortal King, receive our prayers which at the present time we offer to You from unclean lips, trusting in the multitude of Your mercies. for action, ready to accompany Him into the joy and divine palace of His glory, where there is the ceaseless sound of those keeping festival and the unspeakable delight of those who behold the ineffable beauty of Your Face. For You are the true Light that enlightens and sanctifies all, and all creation sings to You throughout the ages. Amen.

Second Prayer of St. Basil the Great

We bless You, O most high God and Lord of mercy, Who is ever doing numberless great and mysterious things with us, glorious and wonderful; Who grants to us sleep for rest from our infirmities, and repose from the burdens of our much toiling flesh. We thank You that You have not destroyed us with our sins, but have loved us as ever, and though we are sunk in despair, You have raised us up to glorify Your power. Therefore we implore Your incomparable goodness, enlighten the eves of our understanding and raise up our mind from the heavy sleep of indolence; open our mouth and fill it with Your praise, that we may be able undistracted to sing and confess You, Who are God glorified in all and by all, the eternal Father, with Your only-begotten Son, and Your all-holy and good and life-giving Spirit, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Midnight Song to the Most Holy Mother of God

I sing your grace, O Sovereign Lady, and pray to you to grace my mind. Teach me to step right in the way of Christ's commandments. Strengthen me to keep awake in song and dispel the dream of despondency. Release me, bound with bonds of sin, O bride of God, by your prayers. Guard me by night and also by day, and drive away my foes who defeat me. O Bearer of God, the Giver of Life, enliven me who am deadened by passions. O bearer of the unfailing Light, enlighten my blinded soul. O Marvellous Palace of the Master, make me a house of the Divine Spirit. O Mother of the Healer, heal the perennial passions of my soul. Guide me to the path of repentance, for I am tossed in the storm of life. Deliver me from eternal fire, from wicked war and from hell. Expose me guilty as I am of many sins. Renew me, grown old from senseless sins. O most Immaculate One. Present me untouched by all torments, and pray for me to the Lord of all. Grant me to receive the joys of Heaven with all the Saints. O most holy Virgin, hear the voice of your unprofitable servant. Grant me torrents of tears, O most Pure One, to cleanse my soul from impurity. I offer the groans of my heart to You unceasingly. Strive for me, O Sovereign Lady. Accept my service of supplication and offer it to the compassionate God. O you who are above the Angels,

raise me above this world's confusion. O Light-bearing heavenly Tabernacle, direct the grace of the Spirit in me. I raise my hands and lips in your praise, defiled as they are by impurity, O All-Immaculate One. Deliver me from soul-corrupting evils, and fervently intercede to Christ to Whom is due honour with adoration, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Prayer to our Lord Jesus Christ

My most merciful and all-merciful God, Lord Jesus Christ, through Your great love You did come down and take flesh to save all. And again, O Saviour, save me by Your grace, I pray, for if You should save me for my works, this would not be grace or a gift, but rather a duty. Indeed, in Your infinite compassion and unspeakable mercy, You O my Christ have said: Whoever believes in Me shall live and never see death. If faith in You saves the desperate, save me, for You are my God and Creator. Impute my faith instead of deeds, O my God, for You will find no deeds which could justify me, but may my faith suffice for all my deeds. May it answer for and acquit me, and may it make me a partaker of Your eternal glory. And may satan not seize me O Word, and boast that he has torn me from Your hand and fold. O Christ, my Saviour, whether I will or not, save me. Make haste, quick, quick, for I perish. You are my God from my mother's womb. Grant me, O Lord, to love You now as once I loved sin, and also to work for You without idleness, as I worked before for deceptive satan. But supremely shall I work for You, my Lord and God, Jesus Christ, all the days of my life, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Prayer to the Guardian Angel of Human Life

O Holy Angel, interceding for my wretched soul and my passionate life, forsake me not, a sinner, nor shrink from me for my intemperance. Give no place for the subtle demon to master me through the violence of my mortal body. Strengthen my poor and feeble hand, and guide me in the way of salvation. O holy Angel of God, guardian and protector of my wretched body and soul, forgive me for all the insults I have given you every day of my life, and for whatever sins I may have committed during the past night. Protect me during the present day, and guard me from every temptation of the enemy, that I may not anger God by any sin. And pray to the Lord for me, that He may strengthen me in His fear, and make me, His slave, worthy of His goodness. Amen.

Prayer to the Most Holy Mother of God

My most holy Lady, Mother of God, by your holy and allpowerful prayers banish from me, your humble, wretched servant, despondency, forgetfulness, foolishness, carelessness, and all impure, evil and blasphemous thoughts out of my wretched heart and my darkened mind. Prayers to the Mother of God

Rejoice O Virgin Theotokos, Mary full of grace; the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, for you have borne the Saviour of our souls.

Most glorious Ever-Virgin, Mother of Christ our God, present our prayer to your Son and our God and pray that through you He may save our souls.

Pray for me Saint.... (name), for with fervour I come to you, speedy helper and intercessor for my soul.

The Troparion to the Cross

O Lord, save Your people and bless Your inheritance. Grant victory over all enemies to Orthodox Christians and protect Your people with Your Cross.

Commemoration of the Living and Departed

Remember, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, Your mercies and bounties which are from all eternity, and through which You did become man and did will to suffer crucifixion and death for the salvation of those who rightly believe in You, and having risen from the dead did ascend into heaven, and sit at the right hand of God the Father and regards the humble entreaties of those who call upon You with all their heart: incline Your ear, and hear the humble prayer of me, Your worthless servant, as the fragrance of spiritual incense, which I offer to You for all people. And first remember Your Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church, which You have provided through Your Precious Blood. Confirm, strengthen, extend, and increase her, and keep her in peace, and for ever proof against the power of hell. Calm the dissensions of the Churches, and foil the plans of the powers of darkness, dispel the prejudice of the nations, and quickly ruin and root out the risings of heresy, and frustrate them by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Save, O Lord, and have mercy on Orthodox Patriarchs, Metropolitans, Archbishops and Bishops, the Priests and Deacons, and all who serve in the Church, and whom You have ordained to feed Your spiritual flock; and by their prayers, have mercy on me, a sinner.

Save, O Lord, and have mercy on our father (parish priest), with all his brethren in Christ, and by their prayers have mercy on me, wretch that I am.

Save, O Lord, and have mercy on my Spiritual Father (name) and by his prayers forgive me my sins.

Save, O Lord, and have mercy on all workers in this holy community, our brethren and all manual workers, and lay-workers, and all Christians.

Save, O Lord, and have mercy on my parents (names), my brothers and sisters and all my relatives, and the neighbours of my family, and friends - and grant them Your worldly and spiritual goods.

Save, O Lord, and have mercy according to the multitude of Your bounties, on all priests, monks and nuns, and on all living in virginity, devotion and fasting, in monasteries, in deserts, in caves, on mountains, on pillars, in hermitages, in the clefts of rocks, and right faith in every place of Your dominion, and devoutly serving You, and praying to You. Lighten their burden, console them in their afflictions, and grant them strength, power and perseverance in their struggle and by their prayers grant me remission of sins.

Save, O Lord, and have mercy on the old and the young, the poor and destitute, the orphans and widows, and all those in sickness and sorrow, misfortune and tribulation, captives and exiles, in mines and prisons and reformatories, and especially on those of Your servants suffering persecution for Your sake and for the Orthodox Faith from godless peoples, apostates and heretics.

Visit, strengthen, comfort, and heal them, and by Your power quickly grant them relief, freedom and deliverance.

Save, O Lord, and have mercy on those whom I have offended or scandalized by my madness or carelessness, and whom I have turned from the way of salvation, and whom I have led into evil and harmful deeds. By Your divine providence restore them again to the way of salvation.

Save, O Lord, and have mercy on those who hate and offend me, and do me harm, and let them not perish through me, a sinner.

Illumine with the light of grace all apostates from the Orthodox Faith, and those blinded by pernicious heresies, and draw them to Yourself, and unite them to Your Holy, Apostolic, Catholic Church.

Good Shepherd of Your sheep, deliver me not to the revolt of the serpent and leave me not to the will of satan, for the seed of corruption is in me. Lord, adorable God, Holy King, Jesus Christ, guard me asleep by the unwaning light, Your Holy Spirit, by Whom You did sanctify Your disciples. O Lord, grant me, Your unworthy servant, Your salvation on my bed. Enlighten my mind with the light of understanding of Your Holy Gospel. Enlighten my soul with the love of Your Cross. Enlighten my heart with the purity of Your Word. Enlighten my body with Your passionless Passion. Keep my thoughts in Your humility. Prayer of St. Ephrem the Syrian

O Lord, Heavenly King, Comforter, Spirit of Truth, have compassion and mercy on Your sinful servant and pardon my unworthiness, and forgive me all the sins that I humanly committed today, and not only humanly but even worse than a beast - my voluntary sins, known and unknown, from my youth and from evil suggestions, and from my brazenness, and from boredom. If I have sworn by Your Name or blasphemed it in thought, blamed or reproached anyone, or in my anger have detracted or slandered anyone, or grieved anyone, or if I have got angry about anything, or have told a lie, if I have slept unnecessarily, or if a beggar has come to me and I despised or neglected him, or if I have troubled my brother or quarrelled with him, or if I have condemned anyone, or have boasted, or have been proud, or lost my temper with anyone, or if when standing in prayer my mind has been distracted by the glamour of this world, or if I have had depraved thoughts or have overeaten, or have drunk excessively, or have laughed frivolously, or have thought evil, or have seen the attraction of someone and been wounded by it in my heart, or said indecent things, or made fun of my brother's sin when my own faults are countless, or been neglectful of prayer, or have done some other wrong that I cannot remember - for I have done all this and much more - have mercy, my Lord and Creator, on me Your wretched and unworthy servant, and absolve and forgive and deliver me in Your goodness and love for men, so that, lustful, sinful and wretched as I am, I may lie down and sleep and rest in peace. And I shall worship, praise and glorify Your most honourable Name, with the Father and His only-begotten Son, now and ever, and for all ages. Amen.

Queen of the Heavenly Host, Defender of our souls, we your servants offer to you songs of victory and thanksgiving, for you, O Theotokos, have delivered us from dangers. But as you have invincible power, free us from conflicts of all kinds that we may cry to you: Rejoice, O unwedded Bride.

Most glorious, Ever-Virgin, blessed, Mother of Christ our God, present our prayer to your Son and our God, and pray that through you He may save our souls.

I put all my hope in you, O Mother of God. Guard me under your protection. O Virgin Mother of God, despise not me, a sinner, needing your help and protection, and have mercy on me, for my soul hopes in you.

Prayer

O God, absolve, remit, and pardon our voluntary and involuntary sins, in word and deed, known and unknown, by day and by night, in mind and thought; forgive us all, in Your goodness and love for men.

Prayer of Intercession

O Lord, Lover of men, forgive those who hate and wrong us. Do good to those who do good. Grant our brothers and relatives their saving petitions and eternal life. Visit the sick and grant them healing. Guide those at sea. Travel with travellers. Struggle alongside the Orthodox. To those who serve and are kind to us, grant remission of sins. On those who have charged us, unworthy as we are, to pray for them, have mercy according to Your great mercy. Remember, O Lord, our fathers and brothers who have fallen asleep, and grant them rest where the light of Your countenance shines. Remember, O Lord, those who bear fruit and do good works in Your holy churches and grant them their saving petitions and eternal life. Remember also, O Lord, us Your humble, sinful and unworthy servants, and enlighten our minds with the light of knowledge of Yourself, and guide us in the way of Your commandments, by the prayers of our immaculate Lady, Theotokos, and Ever-Virgin Mary, and of all Your Saints, for You are blessed to the ages of ages. Amen.

Daily Confession of Sins

I confess to You, my Lord, God and Creator, to the One glorified and worshipped in Holy Trinity, to the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, all my sins which I have committed all the days of my life, at every hour, in the present and in the past, day and night, in thought, word and deed; by aluttony, drunkenness, secret eating, idle talking. despondency. indolence, contradiction, neglect. aggressiveness, self-love, hoarding, stealing, lying, dishonesty, curiosity, jealousy, envy, anger, resentment, and remembering wrongs, hatred, mercenariness; and by all my senses: sight, hearing, smell, taste, touch; and all other sins, spiritual and bodily, through which I have angered You, my God and Creator, and caused injustice

to my neighbours. Sorrowing for this, but determined to repent, I stand guilty before You, my God. Only help me, my Lord and God, I humbly pray You with tears. Forgive my past sins by Your mercy, and absolve me from all I have confessed in Your presence, for You are good and the Lover of men. Amen.

Prayer of St. John of Damascus

O Lord, Lover of men, is this bed to be my coffin, or will You enlighten my wretched soul with another day? Here the coffin lies before me, and here death confronts me. I fear, O Lord, Your Judgment and the endless torments, vet I cease not to do evil. My Lord God, I continually anger You, and Your immaculate Mother, and all the Heavenly Powers, and my holy Guardian Angel. I know, O Lord, that I am unworthy of Your love, but deserve condemnation and every torment. But, whether I want it or not, save me, O Lord. For to save a good man is no great thing, and to have mercy on the pure is nothing wonderful, for they are worthy of Your mercy. But show the wonder of Your mercy on me, a sinner. In this reveal Your love for men, lest my wickedness prevail over Your unutterable goodness and mercy. And order my life as You will.

Prayer to the Venerable Cross

Let God arise, and let His enemies be scattered; and let those who hate Him flee from His presence. As smoke vanishes, let them vanish; and as wax melts from the presence of fire, so let the demons perish from the presence of those who love God and who sign themselves with the Sign of the Cross and say in gladness: Hail, most precious and life-giving Cross of the Lord, for You drive away the demons by the power of our Lord Jesus Christ crucified on you, Who went down to hell and trampled on the power of the devil, and gave us His venerable Cross, for driving away all enemies. O most precious and life-giving Cross of the Lord, help me with our holy Lady, the Virgin Mother of God, and with all the Saints throughout the ages. Amen.

Guard me, O Lord, by the power of Your holy and lifegiving Cross, and keep me from all evil. Into Your hands, O Lord Jesus Christ, my God, I surrender my spirit and body; bless me, save me, and grant me eternal life. Amen.

It is truly meet to bless you, O Theotokos, ever blessed and most pure and the Mother of our God! More honourable than the cherubim and more glorious beyond compare than the seraphim: without corruption you gave birth to God the Word, True Theotokos, we magnify you!

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Lord, have mercy (Thrice)

Through the prayers of our holy fathers, Lord, Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.

Before retiring go through all the points suggested below in your mind and memory.

1. Give thanks to Almighty God for granting you during the past day, by His grace, His gifts of life and health.

2. Examine your conscience by going through each hour of the day, beginning from the time you rose from your bed, and recall to memory: where you went, how you acted and reacted towards all persons and other creatures, and what you talked about. Recall and consider with all care your thoughts, words and deeds from morning till evening.

3. If you have done any good, do not ascribe it to yourself but to God Who gives us all the good things and thank Him. Pray that He may confirm you in this good and enable you to do other good things.

4. But if you have done anything evil, admit that this comes from yourself and your own weakness, from bad habits or weak will. Repent and pray to the Lover of men that He may forgive you, and promise Him firmly never to do this evil again.

5. Implore your Creator with tears to grant you a quiet, undisturbed, pure and sinless night, and to enable you on the coming day to devote yourself wholly to the glory of His holy Name.

6. If you find a soft pillow, leave it, and put a stone in its place for Christ's sake. If you sleep in winter, bear it, saying: Some did not sleep at all.

A BRIEF MORNING PRAYER

Lord, give me the strength to greet the coming day in peace. Help me in all things to rely on Your holy will. Reveal Your will to me every hour of the day. Bless my dealings with all people. Teach me to treat all people who come to me throughout the day with peace of soul and with firm conviction that Your will governs all. In all my deeds and words guide my thoughts and feelings. In unexpected events, let me not forget that all are sent by You. Teach me to act firmly and wisely, without embittering and embarrassing others. Give me the physical strength to bear the labours of this day. Direct my will, teach me to pray, pray in me. Amen. Through the prayers of our holy Fathers, Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.

A BRIEF EVENING PRAYER

And now as we lay down to sleep, O Master, grant us repose both of body and of soul, and keep us from the dark passions of the night. Subdue the assaults of passions. Quench the fiery darts of the wicked one which are thrown insidiously at us; calm the commotions of our flesh and put away all thoughts about worldly and material things as we go to sleep. Grant us, O God, a watchful mind, chaste thoughts, a sober heart, and a gentle sleep, free from all the fantasies of Satan. And raise us up again at the hour of prayer, established in Your commandments and holding steadfast within ourselves the remembrance of Your judgments. Give us the words of Your glorification all night long, that we may praise, bless, and glorify Your most honourable and magnificent name, O Father, Son and Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto ages of ages. Amen. Through the prayers of our holy Fathers, Lord Jesus

Christ our God, have mercy on us and save us. Amen.

said in my madness: every man is a liar. What shall I give in return to the Lord for all that He has given me? I will receive the cup of salvation and call on the Name of the Lord. I will pay my vows to the Lord in the presence of all His people. Precious in the sight of the Lord is the death of His Saints. O Lord, I am Your slave; I am Your slave and son of Your handmaid. You have broken my bonds asunder. I will offer You the sacrifice of praise, and will pray in the Name of the Lord. I will pay my vows to the Lord in the presence of all His people, in the courts of the Lord's house, in the midst of you, O Jerusalem.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and unto the ages of ages. Amen.

Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia. Glory to You, O God. (Thrice)

Lord, have mercy (Thrice)

Overlook my faults, O Lord Who was born of a Virgin, and purify my heart, and make it a temple for Your spotless Body and Blood. Let me not be rejected from Your presence, O You Who have infinitely great mercy.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit.

How can I who am unworthy dare to come to the communion of Your Holy Things? For even if I should dare to approach You with those who are worthy, my garment betrays me, for it is not a festal robe, and I shall cause the condemnation of my sinful soul. Cleanse, O Lord, the pollution from my soul, and save me as the Lover of men.

Now and ever, and unto the ages of ages. Amen. Great is the multitude of my sins, O Mother of God. To You, O pure one, I flee and implore salvation. Visit my sick and feeble soul and intercede with Your Son and our God, that He may grant me forgiveness for the terrible things I have done, O You who alone are blessed.

Lord, have mercy. (40 times)

When you intend, O man, to eat the Master's Body, approach with fear, lest you be burned – for it is fire! Before drinking the divine Blood in Communion, make peace with those who have grieved you. Only then may you dare to eat the Mystical Food. Before partaking of the dread sacrifice, the life-giving Body of the Master, pray trembling in this manner:

First Prayer of St. Basil the Great

O Sovereign Lord Jesus Christ our God, source of life and immortality, Who are the Author of all creation, visible and invisible, the equally everlasting and coeternal Son of the eternal Father. Who through the excess of Your goodness did in the last days assume our flesh and was crucified for us, ungrateful and ignorant as we were, and did cause through Your own Blood the restoration of our nature which had been marred by sin: O immortal King, accept the repentance even of me a sinner, and incline Your ear to me and hear my words. For I have sinned, O Lord, I have sinned against heaven and before You, and I am not worthy to gaze on the height of Your glory; for I have provoked Your goodness by transgressing Your commandments and not obeying Your orders. But You, O Lord, in Your forbearance, patience, and great mercy, have not given me up to be destroyed with my sins, but You await my complete conversion. For You, O Lover of men, have said through Your Prophet that You desire not the death of the sinner, but that he should return to You and live. For You do not will. O Lord, that the work of Your hands should be destroyed, neither do You delight in the destruction of men, but You desire that all should be saved and come to a knowledge of the Truth. Therefore, though I am unworthy both of heaven and earth, and

even of this transient life, since I have completely succumbed to sin and am a slave to pleasure and have defaced Your image, yet being Your work and creation, wretch that I am, even I do not despair of my salvation and dare to draw near to Your boundless compassion. So receive even me, O Christ Lover of men, as the harlot, as the thief, as the publican, and as the prodigal; and take from me the heavy burden of my sins, You Who takes away the sin of the world, Who heals men's sicknesses. Who calls the weary and heavy laden to Yourself and gives them rest; for You came not to call the righteous but sinners to repentance. And purify me from all defilement of flesh and spirit. Teach me to achieve perfect holiness in the fear of You, that with the clear witness of my conscience I may receive the portion of Your holy Things and be united with Your holy Body and Blood, and have You dwelling and remaining in me with the Father and Your Holy Spirit. And, O Lord Jesus Christ, my God, let not the communion of Your immaculate and life-giving Mysteries be to me for condemnation nor let it make me sick in body or soul through my partaking of them unworthily; but grant me till my last breath to receive without condemnation the portion of Your holy Things, for communion with the Holy Spirit, as a provision for eternal life, and as an acceptable defence at Your dread tribunal, so that I too

with all Your elect may become a partaker of Your pure joys which You have prepared for those who love You, O Lord, in whom You are glorified throughout the ages. Amen.

First Prayer of St. John Chrysostom

O Lord my God, I know that I am not worthy or sufficient that You should come under the roof of the house of my soul, for all is desolate and fallen, and You have not with me a place fit to lay Your head. But as from the highest heaven You did humble Yourself for our sake, so now conform Yourself to my humility. And as You did consent to lie in a cave and in a manger of dumb beasts, so also consent to lie in the manger of my unspiritual soul and to enter my defiled body. And as You did not disdain to enter and dine with sinners in the house of Simon the Leper, so consent also to enter the house of my humble soul which is leprous and sinful. And as You did not reject the woman, who was a harlot and a sinner like me, when she approached and touched You, so also be compassionate with me, a sinner, as I approach and touch You, and let the live coal of Your most holy Body and precious Blood be for the sanctification and enlightenment and strengthening of my humble soul and body, for a relief from the burden of my many sins, for a protection from all diabolical

practices, for a restraint and a check on my evil and wicked way of life, for the mortification of passions, for the keeping of Your commandments, for an increase of Your divine grace, and for the advancement of Your Kingdom. For it is not insolently that I draw near to You, O Christ my God, but as taking courage from Your unspeakable goodness, and that I may not by long abstaining from Your communion become a prey to the spiritual wolf. Therefore, I pray You, O Lord, Who alone are holy, sanctify my soul and body, my mind and heart, my emotions and affections, and wholly renew me. Root the fear of You in my members, and make Your sanctification indelible in me. Be also my helper and defender, guide my life in peace, and make me worthy to stand on Your right hand with Your Saints: through the prayers and intercessions of Your immaculate Mother, of Your ministering Angels, of the immaculate Powers and of all the Saints who have ever been pleasing to You. Amen.

Prayer of St. Symeon the Translator

O only pure and sinless Lord, Who through the ineffable compassion of Your love for men did assume our whole nature through the pure and virgin blood of her who supernaturally conceived You by the coming of the Divine Spirit and by the will of the Eternal Father; O Christ Jesus, Wisdom and Peace and Power of God. Who in Your assumption of our nature did suffer Your life-giving and saving Passion - the Cross, the Nails, the Spear, and Death - mortify all the deadly passions of my body. You Who in Your burial did spoil the dominions of hell, bury with good thoughts my evil schemes and scatter the spirits of wickedness. You Who by Your lifegiving Resurrection on the third day did raise up our fallen first Parent, raise me up who am sunk in sin and suggest to me ways of repentance. You Who by Your glorious Ascension did deify our nature which You had assumed and did honour it by Your seating at the right hand of the Father, make me worthy by partaking of Your holy Mysteries of a place at Your right hand among those who are saved. You Who by the descent of the Spirit, the Paraclete, did make Your holy Disciples worthy vessels, make me also a recipient of His coming. You Who are to come again to judge the World with justice, grant me also to meet You on the clouds, my Maker and Creator, with all Your Saints, that I may unendingly glorify and praise You with Your Eternal Father and Your all-holy and good and life-giving Spirit, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

First Prayer of St. John Damascene

O Sovereign Lord Jesus Christ our God, Who alone

have authority to forgive men their sins, overlook in Your goodness and love for men all my offences whether committed with knowledge or in ignorance, and make me worthy to receive without condemnation Your divine, glorious, spotless, and life-giving Mysteries, not for punishment, nor for an increase of sins, but for purification and sanctification and as a pledge of the life and kingdom to come, as a protection and help, and for the destruction of enemies, and for the blotting out of my many transgressions. For You are a God of mercy and compassion and love for men, and to You we send up the glory, with the Father and the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Second Prayer of St. Basil the Great

I know, O Lord, that I partake of Your immaculate Body and precious Blood unworthily, and that I am guilty, and eat and drink judgment to myself by not discerning the Body and Blood of You my Christ and God. But taking courage from Your compassion I approach You, for You have said: "He who eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood abides in Me and I in him." Therefore have compassion, O Lord, and do not make an example of me, a sinner, but deal with me according to Your mercy; and let these Holy Things be for my healing and purification and enlightenment and protection and salvation and sanctification of body and soul, for the turning away of every fantasy and all evil practice and diabolical activity working subconsciously in my members, for confidence and love towards You, for reformation of life and security, for an increase of virtue and perfection, for fulfilment of the commandments, for communion with the Holy Spirit, as a provision for eternal life, and as an acceptable defence at Your dread Tribunal, not for judgment or for condemnation.

Prayer of St. Symeon the New Theologian

From sullied lips, from an abominable heart, from an unclean tongue, out of a polluted soul, receive my prayer, O my Christ. Reject me not, nor my words, nor my ways, nor even my shamelessness, but give me courage to say what I desire, my Christ. And even more, teach me what to do and say. I have sinned more than the harlot who, on learning where You was lodging, bought myrrh, and dared to come and anoint Your feet, my Christ, my Lord and my God. As You did not repulse her when she drew near from her heart, neither, O Word, abominate me, but grant me Your feet to clasp and kiss, and with a flood of tears as with most precious myrrh dare to anoint them. Wash me with my tears and purify me with them, O Word. Forgive my sins and grant me pardon. You know the multitude of my evil-doings,

You know also my wounds, and You see my bruises. But also You know my faith, and You behold my willingness, and You hear my sighs. Nothing escapes You, my God, my Maker, my Redeemer, not even a tear-drop, nor part of a drop. Your eyes know what I have not achieved, and in Your book things not yet done are written by You. See my depression, see how great is my trouble, and all my sins take from me, O God of all, that with a clean heart, trembling mind and contrite spirit I may partake of Your pure and all-holy Mysteries by which all who eat and drink You with sincerity of heart are guickened and deified. For You, my Lord, have said: "Whoever eats My Flesh and drinks My Blood abides in Me And I in Him." Wholly true is the word of my Lord and God. For whoever partakes of Your divine and deifying Gifts certainly is not alone, but is with You, my Christ, Light of the Triune Sun which illumines the world. And that I may not remain alone without You, the Giver of Life. my Breath, my Life, my Joy, the Salvation of the world, therefore I have drawn near to You as You see, with tears and with a contrite spirit. Ransom of my offences, I beseech You to receive me, and that I may partake without condemnation of Your life-giving and perfect Mysteries, that You may remain as You have said with me, thrice-wretched as I am, lest the tempter may find me without Your grace and craftily seize me,

and having deceived me, may seduce me, from Your deifying words. Therefore I fall at Your feet and fervently cry to You: As You received the Prodigal and the Harlot who drew near to You, so have compassion and receive me, the profligate and the prodigal, as with contrite spirit I now draw near to You. I know, O Saviour, that no other has sinned against You as I, nor has done the deeds That I have committed. But this again I know that not the greatness of my offences nor the multitude of my sins surpasses the great patience of my God, and His extreme love for men. But with the oil of compassion those who fervently repent You do purify and enlighten and make them children of the light, sharers of Your Divine Nature. And You do act most generously, for what is strange to Angels and to the minds of men often You tell to them as to Your true friends. These things make me bold, my Christ, these things give me wings, and I take courage from the wealth of Your goodness to us. And rejoicing and trembling at once, I who am straw partake of fire, and, strange wonder! I am ineffably bedewed, like the bush of old which burnt without being consumed. Therefore with thankful mind, and with thankful heart, and with thankfulness in all the members of my soul and body, I worship and magnify and glorify You, my God, for You are blessed, now and throughout the ages.

Second Prayer of St. John Chrysostom

I am not worthy, O Lord and Master, that You should enter under the roof of my soul; but since You in Your love for men do will to dwell in me, I take courage and approach. You command: I will open wide the doors which You alone did create, that You may enter with love as is Your nature, enter and enlighten my darkened thought. I believe that You will do this, for You did not banish the Harlot who approached You with tears, nor did You reject the Publican who repented, nor did You drive away the Thief who acknowledged Your Kingdom, nor did You leave the repentant persecutor (Paul) to himself; but all who had been brought to You by repentance You did set in the company of Your friends, O You Who alone are blessed always, now and to endless ages. Amen.

Third Prayer of St. John Chrysostom

Lord Jesus Christ my God, remit, forgive, absolve and pardon the sins, offences and transgressions which I, Your sinful, useless and unworthy servant have committed from my youth, up to the present day and hour, whether with knowledge or in ignorance, whether by words or deeds or intentions or thoughts, and whether by habit or through any of my senses. And through the intercession of her who conceived You without seed, the immaculate and ever-virgin Mary Your Mother, my only sure hope and protection and salvation, make me worthy without condemnation to receive Your pure, immortal, life-giving and dread Mysteries, for forgiveness of sins and for eternal life, for sanctification and enlightenment and strength and healing and health of soul and body, and for the blotting out and complete destruction of my evil reasoning's and intentions and prejudices and nocturnal fantasies of dark evil spirits. For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory and the honour and the worship, with the Father and the Holy Spirit, now and ever, and to the ages of ages. Amen.

Second Prayer of St. John Damascene

I stand before the doors of Your sanctuary, yet I do not put away my terrible thoughts. But O Christ our God, Who did justify the Publican, and have mercy on the Canaanite woman, and did open the gates of Paradise to the Thief, open to me the depths of Your love for men, and as I approach and touch You, receive me like the Harlot and the woman with an issue of blood. For the one received healing easily by touching the hem of Your garment, and the other by clasping Your sacred feet obtained release from her sins. And I, in my pitiableness, dare to receive Your whole Body. Let me not be burnt, but receive me even as these; enlighten the senses of my soul, and burn the stains of my sins: through the intercessions of her who bore You without seed, and of the Heavenly Powers, for You are blessed to the ages of ages. Amen.

THE JESUS PRAYER

Saint John Chrysostom says: "It is necessary for everyone, whether eating, drinking, sitting, serving, traveling, or doing anything, to unceasingly cry: 'Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me,' that the name of the Lord Jesus Christ, descending into the depths of the heart, may subdue the pernicious serpent, and save and quicken the soul.

Saint Seraphim of Sarov: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me a sinner": let all your attention and training be in this. Walking, sitting, doing, and standing in church before the divine service, coming in and going out, keep this unceasingly on your lips and in your heart. In calling in this manner on the name of God

you will find peace, you will attain to purity of spirit and body, and the Holy Spirit, the Origin of all good things, will dwell in you, and He will guide you unto holiness, unto all piety and purity."

Bishop Theophanes the Recluse: "In order to more conveniently become accustomed to the remembrance of God, for this the fervent Christian has a special means, namely, to repeat unceasingly a brief prayer of two or three words. Most often this is: 'Lord, have mercy!' or 'Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me a sinner.' If you have not yet heard of this, then hear it now, and if you have not done it, then begin to do it from this time.

"Through such practice, by guarding oneself from distraction and by the preservation of the peace of one's conscience, it is possible to draw near to God and to be united with Him. For, according to the words of Saint Isaac the Syrian, 'Without unceasing prayer we cannot draw near to God' (St. Seraphim of Sarov)."
