Introducing our Key Note Speakers

Catrina Lowri



Catrina founded Neuroteachers to help educational settings work with their autistic and neurodivergent learners to find simple solutions for inclusive practice.

Catrina is neurodivergent herself, having the dual diagnosis of dyslexia and bipolar disorder. She is a qualified special needs teacher and an experienced SENCO and advisory teacher.

In her popular keynote speech, Catrina talks about how the concept of neurodiversity grew from a fringe idea amongst online communities of autistic and ADHD adults to an umbrella term, used to describe the infinite variety of minds and brains we find amongst humanity. Catrina includes examples from her lived experience as a neurodivergent teacher and the latest research and thinking from this exciting social movement. She also discusses simple, practical ideas about how you can support your neurodivergent child or pupil to thrive in a neurotypical world.

Peter Wharmby



"After being diagnosed as autistic at the age of 34 in 2017, I have immersed myself in working to improve autistic awareness, acceptance and making the world a more suitable place for the neurodivergent community. I am most active on Twitter, where I go by the handle '@Commaficionado' and on YouTube, where my channel is approaching 3000 subscribers. My first book, What I Want to Talk About, was published by Jessica Kingsley Publishers in September 2022, and my second book, Untypical, was published by HarperCollins in March 2023. I have also written a number of articles, interviews and book chapters, and appeared on BBC Radio 2. I am a former secondary English teacher and a father-of-one."

Peter's speech is about how the world is not set up for autistic people. In this talk, Pete will explain some of the ways things could change for the better for autistic people of all ages.

Loren Snow, is an autistic autism consultant with over ten years experience teaching people to understand autism. They have delivered training to tens of thousands of parents of autistic children, autistic adults, and NHS staff.

They work with NHS England teaching NHS staff and reviewing autistic patients' care in psychiatric hospitals on Care, Education, and Treatment Reviews and as a Tier 2 Lead Trainer on the Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training.

They also work with many organisations from transporting bodies to public health, employers, schools, and charities and regularly speak at public events like conferences.

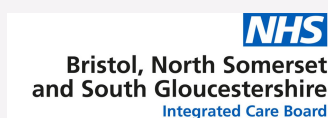
Jacqui Scott



“I have been in education for many years now. My various pursuits and projects have taken me overseas to teach in Europe and Southeast Asia which were both wonderful and challenging experiences. Closer to home, I trained to teach French and German and loved my time teaching languages. I was lucky to be given the opportunity to train as SENDCo and worked in the field of SEND for five years. I went on to become the Head Teacher at Worle Community School Academy in 2016. I was privileged and proud to lead the school for six and a half years and am always delighted when I see students when I am out and about; they were wonderful young people. At the beginning of 2023, I joined Education Partnerships here in North Somerset and continue my enthusiasm for working with education providers”.

Charlotte Pay

After many years working in healthcare and support work, Charlotte qualified as a Learning Disabilities Nurse in 2019.

While training, Charlotte was hand-picked to represent Learning Disability Nursing in a team commissioned by NHS England to support individuals in long term segregation, specialising in transition from CAMHS to adult services, and saw great success in treatment and recovery.

She spent 3 years working for South London and Maudsley NHS foundation trust in behavioural developmental psychology, forensic mental health, and the National Autism Unit; before abandoning her secret dreams of West End stardom and moving to Weston-super-Mare to start her family.

Charlotte has worked for the last 2 years in Acute mental health, learning many new skills as part of a vast MDT in the Avon and Wiltshire partnership NHS trust.



Charlotte talks with passion about the importance of recognising, understanding, and taking care of your own mental health and wellbeing. She looks at ways to recognise signs of burn-out and finding skills to manage and prevent overwhelm. She will consider reflective practice and other methods in taking stock of and minding your own mental health. It's time to prioritise yourself and your mental wellbeing as you put your all into supporting your children and family navigate through life.

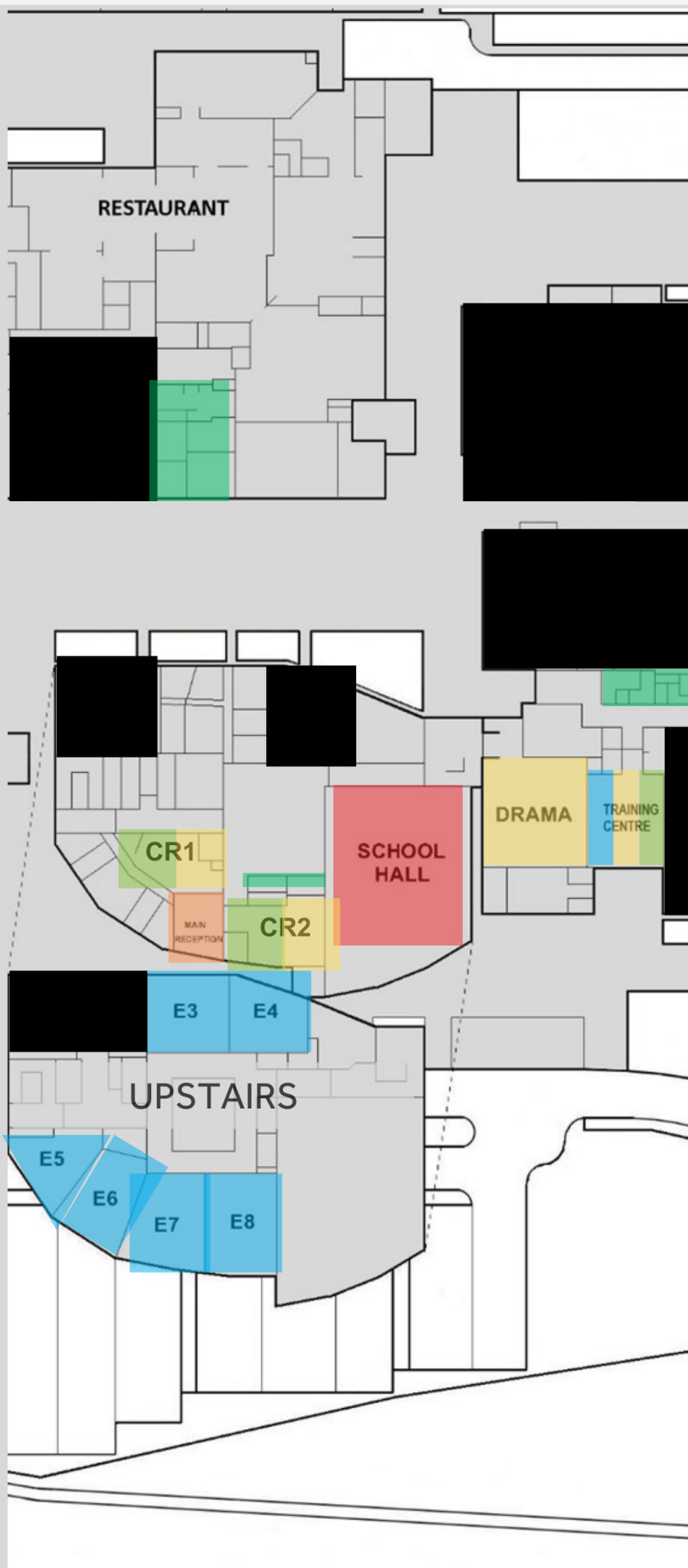

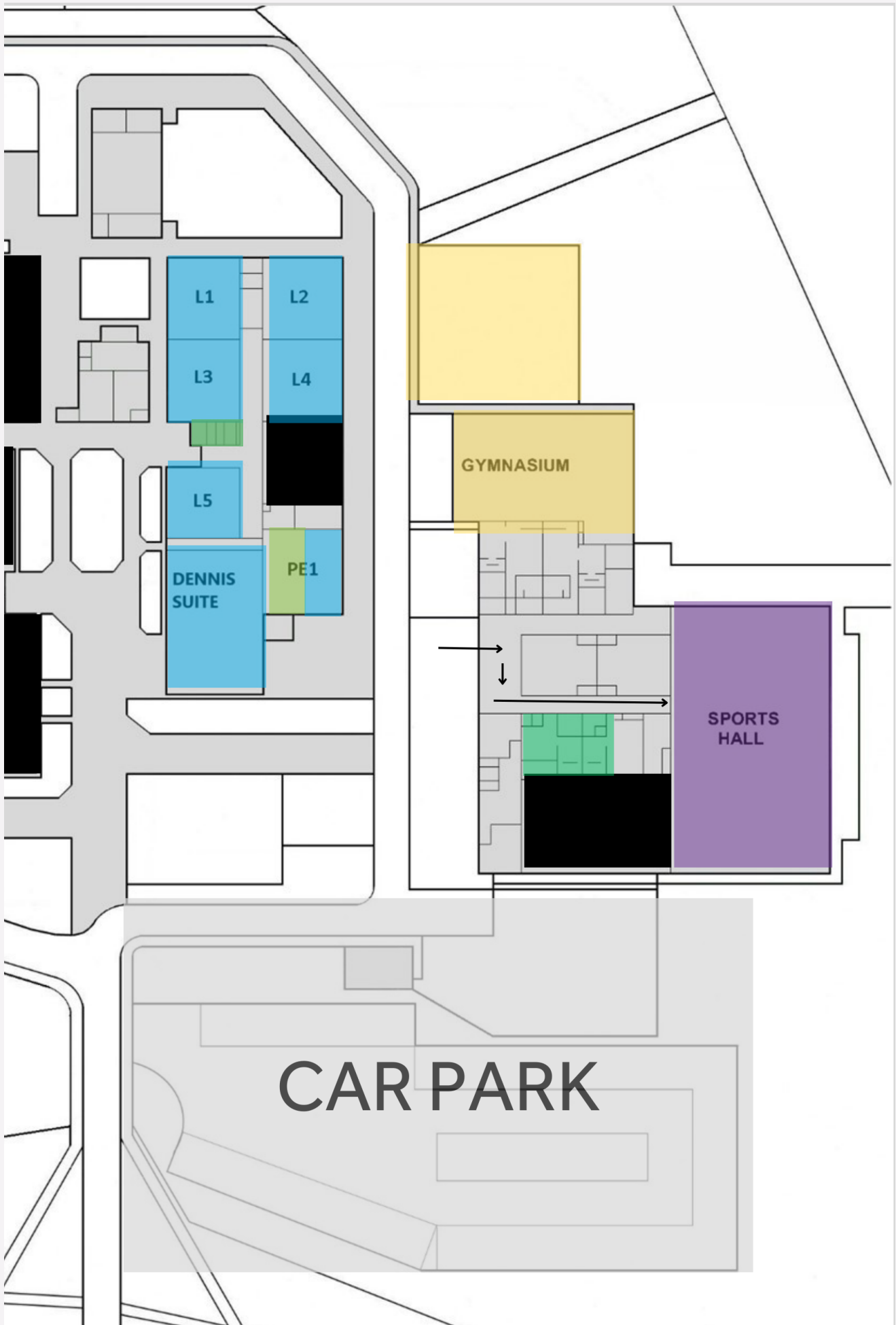
Map of the building

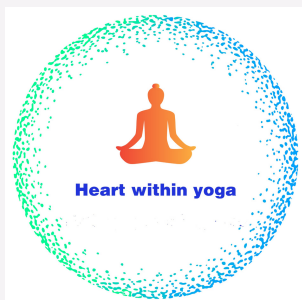
