A message from the Chief Executive Officer... Trivia Night

Are you a LifeBridge Partnership trivia buff? Here are the answers to the questions:

LifeBridge Partnership was founded in 1927 and originally known as St. Louis Society for Crippled Children.

The agency was started to ensure children with physical disabilities received an education, provide orthopedic equipment, and advocate for accessibility in public buildings. When public school education became widely available to children with disabilities in the 1950's, the agency pivoted to providing counseling services and recreational services to children and adults.

Today, LifeBridge Partnership serves clients through three community-based programs: Out & About for adults and Leaders Club and LifeBridge Camps for youth. We also provide accessible, door-to-door transportation for clients who do not have access to their own transportation.

From 1934 to 1981, the agency was affiliated with the National Easter Seal Society. The Board of Directors chose to yield this affiliation in 1984 so the agency could focus fully on the St. Louis community.

We operated the Daniel Boone Camp from 1957 to 1979. This camp was a summer residential camp serving individuals with orthopedic disabilities. It was located in St. Charles.

Before rebranding the agency to LifeBridge Partnership in 2014, the agency had changed its name from St. Louis Society for Crippled Children to St. Louis Society for Children & Adults with Physical Disabilities. We were commonly known as St. Louis Society.
