MHSA REGIONAL PROGRAM CHAMPIONSHIPS



All MHSA Divisions are by invitation only. Letters of invitation for the MHSA Regional Championship Horse Show will be e-mailed after the qualifying period has ended. Approximately the top 20 horses/riders in each division, will be invited. To be eligible a horse/pony/rider must have shown at least two MHSA Regional Horse Shows, between the qualifying period of December 1, 2024 - October 22, 2025, and earned points in the division they would like to enter at the Championship Horse Show. Horse and rider must be members of MHSA. The same horse/pony and rider combination that competes at any of the fall indoor shows such as Pennsylvania National, Washington International (Exception Local Hunters) or The National Horse Show is not eligible to compete at the MHSA Regional Championship Horse Show.

COLONIAL CLASSIC QUALIFYING



In order to qualify for the 2025 Colonial Classic you must first be a member of a participating local horse show series. You will then accumulate points through the season. The top 3 riders from each qualifying division will be selected by their horse show series to show at the Colonial Classic.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

MHSA LEAD LINE EQUITATION

For children seven years of age and under on a pony. To be judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk. No martingales allowed. Children in this class are eligible to compete in Morningside Lead Line Eq, Mini Stirrup or Walk/Trot 8 & Under only.

1 On Lead Walk

MORNINGSIDE LEAD LINE EQUITATION

For children seven years of age and under on a pony or horse. To be judged on equitation and suitability of mount at a walk off lead and walk/trot on lead. No martingales allowed. Children in this class are eligible to compete in MHSA Leadline Eq, Mini Stirrup or Walk/Trot 8 & Under only.

MORNINGSIDE WALK/TROT DIVISIONS (RING 2)

For riders on a pony or horse who only show at the walk and trot. No martingales allowed. Riders may not enter any class requiring a canter at any show. Pleasure: to be judged on suitability of horse or pony to purpose, manners, and ability to give a safe, comfortable ride. Equitation: to be judged on rider's hands, seat, guidance, control and suitability of mount.

Open to junior exhibitor who have not reached their 9th birthday by December 1st of the current competition year.

MHSA MINI STIRRUP

Open to ponies ridden by a junior exhibitor who have not reached their 11th birthday by December 1st of the current competition year. A rider may not cross enter into any other MHSA Regional division or class except Lead Line, where shows permit. Riders in this division may also not cross enter into any classes that involve cantering and/or jumping. Stallions shall be barred from all classes. No martingales allowed. To be judged on rider's hands, seat, guidance, control and suitability of mount. To be show over a course of 4 ground poles at the trot.

BEGINNER EQUITATION DIVISIONS

Open to riders in their 1st or 2nd year of showing over cross rails on ponies or horses. Judged on position and overall ability and turnout. To be shown over a course of no more than 6 jumps not to exceed 18" in height. No penalty for simple changes. No oxers may be used. Riders may not cross-enter any other division where fence heights exceed 18".

Open to junior exhibitor who have not reached their 11th birthday by December 1st of the current competition year.

CROSS RAIL HUNTER

Open to all riders on horses or ponies. Judged on soundness and way of going. To be shown over a course of no more than 8 cross-rail jumps not to exceed 18" in height, no penalty for simple changes. Riders may not cross-enter any other division where fence heights exceed 2'. (Child and adult amateurs qualify for Colonial Classic only)

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

LOW ADULT EQUITATION

Open to amateur adults only. Judged on position and overall ability and turnout. To be shown over a course of no more than 8 jumps not to exceed 18" cross-rails in height. No penalty for simple changes. No oxers may be used. Rider's may not cross-enter into any other division where fence heights exceed 18".

MHSA SHORT STIRRUP EQUITATION

Open to ponies ridden by a junior exhibitor who have not reached their 11th birthday by December 1st of the current competition year. A rider may not cross enter into any other MHSA Regional hunter, pleasure, or equitation division or class. In addition, riders may not compete in any jumper classes or classes where the height exceeds 18". Stallions are barred from all classes. No martingales allowed in flat classes. A course consists of a minimum of 4 fences and a maximum of 8 fences. No oxers may be used. Fences shall be 18". Spreads not to exceed height of fence. To be judged equally on hands, seat, control of mount, and suitability of purpose.

MHSA LONG STIRRUP EQUITATION

Open to horses and ponies ridden by a junior exhibitor who have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current competition and adult amateur exhibitors. Senior Amateur exhibitors must meet the requirements of USEF Rule GR1306. Your signature as rider on the entry blank and annual membership form will verify that you understand and are in compliance with the rule. A rider may not cross enter into any other MHSA Regional hunter or equitation division or class, except Pleasure Horse and Pony, where permitted. In addition, riders may not compete in any jumper classes or classes where the height exceeds 2'. Stallions are barred from all classes. No martingales allowed in flat classes. A course consists of a minimum of 4 fences and a maximum of 8 fences. No oxers may be used. Fences shall be 18" – 2'. Spreads not to exceed height of fence. To be judged equally on hands, seat, control of mount, and suitability of purpose.

10-minute schooling sessions of no more than 10 horses at a time.

MHSA PLEASURE HORSE/PONY

Horses and ponies shall be of any breed or combination of breeds suitable for English riding and normally used for pleasure. To be shown under English tack. Martingales are prohibited. Good manners are essential both in executing the gaits and while lined up in the ring. All horses and ponies must be serviceably sound. In the English Pleasure Division, all animals over 14.2 hands are horses and all animals under 14.2 hands and under are ponies. Classes may be divided by horses and ponies. Horse and pony classes with less than three entries will be combined. Pony classes may be divided by height of ponies. Small/Medium ponies under 13.2 hands. Large ponies over 13.2 hands and not exceeding 14.2 hands. Ponies must have a current MHSA measurement card (if USEF card is not available) on file with MHSA office prior to showing in this division. Ponies must be ridden by and handled by junior exhibitors in all phases of a class. Junior exhibitors shall not have reached their 18th birthday. Stallions are barred from all classes limited to junior exhibitors. For the purposes of the pleasure division the term "suitability" shall mean suitability to purpose as a pleasure mount. Jump height to be 2'. To be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot, and canter. To be judged on suitability of horse or pony to purpose, manners, and ability to give a safe, comfortable ride. May be asked to perform an extended trot or similar gate, asked to readily back and stand quietly, may not be asked to hand gallop.

Open to all riders on horses and ponies. Judged on soundness and way of going. Fence height 2' or 2'3". Oxers will be used.

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

MHSA Junior and Adult Eq O/F to be shown open card concurrently by fence height.

MHSA JUNIOR EQUITATION

Open to horses and ponies ridden by junior exhibitor that have not reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current competition year. Junior Equitation may be split by age or by horse/pony. If split by age, it shall be split 13 & under and 14 – 17. To be judged equally on hands, seat, and control/suitability of mount. The over fences class fence heights shall be 2', 2'6", and 3'. The flat class to be shown at a walk, trot, and canter both ways of the ring. At the judge's discretion, other tests may be performed. Maybe combined with the Adult Equitation if there are less than 4 entries.

MHSA ADULT EQUITATION

Open to horses and ponies ridden by amateur exhibitor who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1st of the current competition year and who are Senior Amateur members. If split by age, it shall be split 18 – 35 and 36 and older. May be combined with Junior Equitation if there are fewer than 4 entries. To be judged equally on hands, seat, control, and suitability of mount. The fence heights for the over fences class shall be 2', 2'6", and 3'. The flat class is to be shown both ways of the ring at a walk, trot and canter. Additional tests may be required.

MHSA LOW CHILD/ADULT HUNTER

Open to horses ridden by junior exhibitors who have not reached their 18th birthday and Adult Amateur exhibitor who have reached their 18th birthday by December 1st of the current competition year. Members competing in classes restricted to amateurs must meet the requirements of USEF RULE GR1306. Your signature as rider on the entry blank and annual membership form will verify that you understand and are in compliance with the rule. A rider in the Low Children's / Adult's is not eligible to cross enter into any other divisions where the fences exceed 2'6" at the same show. Course shall consist of no less than eight fences. Fence height shall be 2'6". Spreads not to exceed the height of the fence. To be judged on performance, soundness, and suitability of mount. If a rider in Low Children's / Adult cross enters into other division where multiple heights are offered, the rider may not jump higher than 2'6".

Open to all riders. Open to horses and ponies. Fences set at 18" in height with no oxers. Entries in this division may not enter any other jumper division at the same show, or any non-jumper class where fence heights exceed 2' at any show.

Open to all riders. Open to horses and ponies. Fences set up to .60 meters (2') in height with 2' to 2'6" spreads. An entry in this division may not enter any hunter or jumper division with fences over .65m (2'3") in height at any show.

MHSA .65M JUMPERS (2'3")

Open to all riders. Open to horses and ponies. Fences set up to .65 meters (2'3") in height with 2'3" to 2'9" spreads. An entry in this division may not enter any hunter or jumper division with fences over .75m (2'6") in height at any show.

MHSA .70M JUMPERS (2'6")

Open to all riders. Open to horses and ponies. Fences set at .75 meters (2'6") in height with 2'6" to 3' spreads. An entry in this division may not enter any hunter or jumper division with fences over .80m (2'9") in height at any show

MHSA .80M JUMPERS (2'9")

Open to all riders. Open to horses and ponies. Fences set up to .80 meters (2'9") in height with 2'9" to 3'3" spreads. An entry in this division may not enter any hunter or jumper division with fences over .90 meters (3') in height at any show.

RING RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Hunter ring schooling 6 AM – 8AM for flatwork up through 2’ only. We will have a schooling break after Long Stirrup Equitation. No schooling in the jumper ring.
- A 3-minute gate call will be enforced. If conflicts arise, please notify the gate in advance.
- Hunter ring ties: In case of a tie score, the championship and/or reserve are awarded to the horse or rider that accumulated the most points over the fences.
- Jumper ring ties: Competitors who are tied for other than first place in all jumper sections will be placed according to “Closest to the time allowed on the initial course”.
- Jumper ring rounds are judged on horse and rider combination.
- Management reserves the right to change the location of any class if necessary and to cancel or combine any classes if entries so warrant.
- 8 Ribbons awarded in all classes.
- Champion & reserve champion ribbons awarded in all divisions. Championship Points:

1st Place - 10 points	5th Place - 2 points
2nd Place - 6 points	6th Place - 1.5 points
3rd Place - 4 points	7th Place - 1 Points
4th Place - 3 points	8th Place - .5 points
- There is no charge for classes added or scratched. Once a class begins, it may not be scratched.
- Every class follows rules set forth by the MHSA & USEF rule book.
- Every horse on grounds must be entered in the office whether showing or not and must present negative Coggins. Any horse that is at the show but not entered in classes will be charged the Non-Show Fee of \$20.00/ per horse in addition to the office fee and schooling fee if applicable.

JUMPER CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

Optimum Time in Jump-Off: Table IV Sec. 2 (b) The first round and first jump-off are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, the competitor will, without leaving the ring, upon an audible signal, commence the designated jump-off course. In the case of equality of faults in the jump-off, ties will be broken on the following basis: an “Optimum Time” (defined as 4 seconds less than the Time Allowed for the course) will be posted on the course plan; the horse with the time on course closest to this Optimum Time (over or under) will prevail in the tie, next closest next, etc. If there are no clear rounds, a jump-off, scored as described above, will take place among those tied for first place.

Optimum Time Power & Speed: Table IV Sec. 2 (c) The first round and first jump off are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed if any. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, he will, upon crossing the finish line, commence the designated jump-off, with time starting as the horse crosses the finish line for the initial course. In the case of equality of faults in the jump-off, ties will be broken on the following basis: an “Optimum Time” (defined as 4 seconds less than the Time Allowed for the course) will be posted on the course plan; the horse with the time on course closest to this Optimum Time (over or under) will prevail in the tie, next closest next, etc. If there are no clear rounds, a jump-off, scored as described above, will take place among those tied for first place.

Time First Jump-Off: Table II, Sec. 2 (b) The first round and first jump-off, if any, is decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed. If a competitor has gone clean in the first round, the competitor will, without leaving the ring, upon an audible signal, commence the designated jump-off course. A competitor with a clear round may dismount, and with assistance if necessary, adjust tack and/or equipment; however, upon the audible signal to begin his/her round, the competitor is responsible to adhering to the 45 seconds rule as per JP134.3. A competitor who leaves the arena after a clear round (before or after the tone) will be considered to have retired from the jump-off. If there are no clean rounds and a tie exists for first place, there will be one jump-off in which time will decide in the event of equality of faults. It is recommended that no more than ten numbered obstacles be included in the first round when the class is scored under this table.

Power & Speed: Table II, Sec. 2 (c) Two Phase Competitions - The first phase to consist of 8 to 10 jumping efforts and the second phase of 5 to 7 jumping efforts. Scores are decided by adding together the faults incurred over the course and any penalties for exceeding the Time Allowed if any. If a competitor has gone clean in the first phase, he will, upon crossing the finish line, commence the second phase course. Time starts as the horse crosses the finish line of the first phase. If there are no clear rounds and a tie exists for first place, the results will be determined by the scores and time from the first phase. The use of a Time Allowed is optional in the first phase. If a Time Allowed is not used in the first phase, then those with equal faults will remain tied.

GENERAL RULES & INFORMATION

- Proof of current negative Coggin's Certificate required. In accordance with MHSA rules, all MHSA Regional Program shows have adopted the USEF GR845 Equine Vaccination Rule. All horses entering the show grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the show grounds.
- The age of an individual on December 1st of the prior year will be maintained throughout the entire competition year.
- Proper show attire required for Hunter Ring. Jumper Ring allows neat & tidy. Jumping vests are allowed in the jumping ring. **ASTM/SEI approved helmets must be worn at all times while mounted on the show grounds.**
- All decisions by the judge are final.
- No smoking is allowed in or around the barns or in-gate areas.
- Food truck on premises.
- Trailers park in paddocks. Over flow parking also in the paddocks.
- Please, clean up after yourself and your horse.
- **No dogs allowed.**
- Returned check fee \$50.00.
- First three shows are qualifiers for Colonial Classic. All 6 shows qualify for MHSA year end points and the 1st 5 shows will qualify for MHSA regional finals. Must pay membership fee to qualify for Morningside series end awards.
- The phone number for the on-call veterinarian will be on display in the show office.
- All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show manager whose decision shall be final.
- Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show.
- Morningside Stables, MHSA, and Columbia Association will assume no responsibility, nor is liable for any injury to person or horse at any time while on the show grounds. Morningside Stables, MHSA, and Columbia Association will not be responsible for lost or damaged items. All owners, exhibitors, and attendees will be held responsible for any damage incurred to them or their agent's properties on the show grounds.
- An Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) will be on the horse show grounds during all riding activities the day of the show.
- Owners of all ponies showing in MHSA classes must possess a valid measurement card or a copy of a valid measurement form to be presented to the Show Secretary.
- Stalls are available overnight (\$65) and for the day (\$45). Limited availability.
- There is a \$10 late fee for same day entry registrations. There is a \$15 late show scratch fee.
