# DISTINGUISHED CATHOLIC FAMILY

#### **DON AND JANICE ARTH**

We are created for relationships and missions, so it is natural to wonder exactly what God wants us to do with our lives. We know He created us uniquely and for a purpose – so what is that purpose? The foundational purpose of our lives is to know, love, and serve the Lord. We do this primarily by following His commands and living a sacramental life. Beyond that, it looks different in our individual lives.

Don Arth has enjoyed and shown interest in vocations for many years. Don was born in Kansas City, and his father was killed in an accident when he was about a year old. His mother moved to Pilot Grove, Missouri, to be close to her parents. He grew up surrounded by five nuns on his mother's side of the family. It was the time of the great depression, and money was scarce. Don was a recipient of a scholarship from an unknown donor that enabled him to attend the prep school at the Conception Seminary in 1946. During that freshman year, he realized he was not "designed" to be a priest – God had another plan for him.

Don joined the Air Force because he wanted to fly. He began his career as a B-29 gunner and after went on to pilot training. Don flew many missions, but one, in particular, he will never forget. Don was flying a C-121 recon plane off the coast of Vietnam, when another aircraft, flying far above him, dropped its load of bombs. He passed through the bombs that were showering down around, above and beside him and somehow, by the grace of God, he was unharmed after 30 years of service. He retired from the military in 1980 and then worked another ten years in the commercial finance farm equipment industry.

As the years went by, that unknown donor who paid for his first year of seminary school remained in Don's heart. Don and his wife, Janice, wanted to help get something started to assist the Director of Vocations with a scholarship. A scholarship that could help out a young man or woman in need of financial assistance.

The Archdiocese of Kansas City, in Kansas, has been blessed with vocations to the priesthood and consecrated life for 135 years.

While the need for vocations is perennial, there has never been a greater need than in the 21st century.

As members of the Serra Club, Don and Janice saw a need to make funds available to individuals considering the priesthood or consecrated life. In 2021, Don and Janice, together with the Catholic Foundation of Northeast Kansas, founded the Heart to Heart Scholarship Fund to defray expenses associated with the path to a priestly or religious vocation. Motivated by God's abundance and Don's recollection of his personal vocation story, Don and Janice recognized the need to give back to God through this gesture. Their participation with the Heart to Heart Scholarship Fund has given them a feeling of spiritual reward and the feeling of fulfillment of what God had meant for them to do.

The Heart to Heart Scholarship fund is funded annually from proceeds from The Master's Cup Invitational golf tournament. The Master's Cup is an annual golf outing and luncheon

directed to anyone interested in helping increase vocations to the priesthood or consecrated religious life. The Master's Cup is all about coming together around golf, a meal, and the Master Himself while building relationships that foster vocations to the priesthood and consecrated religious life in the archdiocese. The Master's Cup generates fellowship among people



discerning vocations, priests and lay faithful while generating financial resources for the Heart to Heart Scholarship Fund.

# DISTINGUISHED CATHOLIC ORGANIZATION

#### CATHOLIC EDUCATION FOUNDATION

Catholic schools offer a safe, high-quality, faith-focused education, giving children the tools they need to succeed and helping lift them out of poverty. However, Catholic school tuition costs can be a significant barrier for families in need.

In the past 25 years, the Catholic Education Foundation (CEF) has provided \$28 million in tuition assistance scholarships for students most in need. As a result, the Foundation has helped stabilize and strengthen enrollment growth at K-12 schools throughout the Archdiocese.

#### Impact on Families

Today, at least *one out of every three students* in most Catholic schools in the Archdiocese relies on a Catholic Education Foundation scholarship to help them afford tuition.

This financial assistance relieves burdens for struggling families and single parents who turn to the Church to support them in their responsibility as their children's first teachers. CEF's work is an essential part of Catholic social teaching to serve those most in need and a catalyst for the evangelization of the family by bringing them to a deeper understanding of the faith.

No ministry in the Archdiocese is doing more to cultivate the next generation of Catholics than the Catholic Education Foundation – helping students come to know the heart and mind of Jesus.

#### **Impact on Communities**

As a result of CEF's consistent support, these schools – one of the primary service institutions of the Church – have been stabilized in many northeast Kansas communities (both urban and rural) that have faced economic and cultural distress.

Parish schools – and those supported by multiple parishes – provide a wealth of resources for families. Basic human needs, as well as intellectual and spiritual development, are supported by parishes and school communities. By ensuring access to Catholic schools and their communities, CEF opens doors to families



through educational and fellowship opportunities they may not otherwise have access to.

Despite the social and economic challenges that CEF scholarship students face, their experience in our Catholic schools is transformative. These CEF scholars overcome a myriad of obstacles as their teachers, counselors, priests and support staff educate "the whole student" in a way no public school can. As a result, 100% of our CEF scholarship students have graduated and advanced to the next grade in the past few years. They are prepared for college and career paths, often returning to their home communities to live and work.

CEF is helping to deliver our community's most productive young workers and families by supporting these scholarship students in Catholic schools. The average CEF scholarship graduate will make a positive net fiscal contribution of \$292,000 to their community. In addition, CEF scholars are collectively saving taxpayers millions each year.


#### Supporting the Catholic Education Foundation

Founded by a group of Catholics intent on making Catholic schools accessible for more than just affluent families, the Catholic Education Foundation, a 501c3 charity, has grown in scope to now support 1,800 students in 27 schools with \$4 million in scholarships annually.

You can support CEF through traditional cash/check donations, donor-advised funds, dedicated endowments, and gifts of stock, property, retirement accounts, life insurance and other assets. Certain qualified donations are also eligible for Kansas income tax credits. All gifts support our scholarship programs for students most in need.









After putting together a loaded speaker lineup, the Catholic Foundation of Northeast Kansas put on its first live St. Thomas More Continuing Education Program since 2019 on June 3 at Savior Pastoral Center.

The 12th annual continuing education program went from 8 a.m. –  $2 \, \text{p.m.}$  to assist lawyers, financial advisers, accountants and insurance professionals in earning the continuing education hours they need to maintain their various licenses and do it in a spiritual setting.

The morning began with registration and check in followed by Mass celebrated by Archbishop Joseph F. Naumann. After a continental breakfast, the archbishop and CFNEK executive director, Bill Maloney, offered opening remarks.

Alice L. Walker of the Kansas Disciplinary Office presented the first session on "Professionalism, Personal Beliefs and the Rules of Professional Conduct." In our second session, Rochelle Falk, JD, from Polsinelli, and Counts Law Firm's Michelle Burge, JD, teamed up to discuss the probate and estate planning changes since COVID.

Martin Seay, PhD., CFP, of Kansas State University, opened

the afternoon sessions with "Rethinking Annuities: Focusing on Client Well-Being." Robert Hofmann, a fundraiser for the University of Minnesota, Duluth, concluded the day's offerings by discussing "Strategies to Avoid Litigation Due to Dementia."

We offered CLE credits for Kansas and Missouri, Insurance CE for Kansas, CFP CE credits and CPE hours for Kansas. The Continuing Education Planning Committee thanks all the speakers, participants and sponsors who contributed to making this in-person event a very successful program. 


## ASSET GROWTH 2002-2022



  reviewed to protect you from unintentionally supporting

At least 50 percent designated to Catholic organizations, with a minimum of 25 percent of the total funds going to charitable entities within the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas. Up to 50 percent of the distributions may be designated to any non-Catholic qualified charity in accordance with Catholic teaching.

#### Online giving makes it easy to support your favorite ministries

For the first time ever, the Catholic Foundation of Northeast Kansas (CFNEK) is offering online giving as an option for its wide variety of funds.

The simple digital process allows Catholics in the Archdiocese of Kansas City in Kansas to make a difference for a cause they care about from the comfort of their own homes.

The online giving platform helps archdiocesan parishes, schools, cemeteries and ministries grow and market their funds held at the Catholic Foundation of Northeast Kansas.

Part of the mission statement of the Catholic Foundation is to collaborate with parishes and institutions to help develop additional resources and support. This is a great opportunity for the Catholic Foundation to provide a convenient resource to ensure the vitality of the church and its ministry.

The online giving platform — **givecentral.org/cfnek** — is desktop and mobile friendly, and one-time, monthly, quarterly and annual payment frequencies are available. Gifts can be made using a bank account, credit card or debit card.

The Catholic Foundation utilized GiveCentral for its GivingTuesday fundraising campaign last year and had a positive experience. GiveCentral uses Secure Sockets Layer (SSL) encryption, the industry standard in online payments. This is a safe website platform for donors. SSL ensures that your credit card or checking account number is stored securely with First American Bank. Once your payment method is saved online, only GiveCentral and your chosen organization can see the last four digits of these numbers.

CFNEK's goal is to help parishes, schools and organizations market their endowments and reach parishioners who were previously unaware of their existence. In an effort to build awareness that these endowments and scholarships funds exist and that these funds are open to receiving gifts from parishioners, the Catholic Foundation hopes parishes, schools and ministries will take advantage of the portal. It may even spark the idea for a new fund to be created.

Although the online giving option is designed to make giving easier and more accessible, sending gifts by mail is still welcome and encouraged.
