Artist Statement: I cut myself for the first time when I was twelve. I remember deciding that day at school, I'd had enough, I was being bullied and my self-hatred grew like a mangled weed in my chest. I hurt so bad, the mere thought of me was sickening, there were a thousand locusts swarming in my head, threatening to leak out. The walk home was cold, shutting myself in the upstairs bathroom, cracking the cheap red plastic of a dusty old pencil sharpener. And when the blade dug in and the blood spurted out I knew I couldn't go back. It felt powerful to ruin myself. I opened Pandora's Box. The truth of me spilled into the sink.

like an open wound is a meditation on the cycle of self-harm; the build up, the act, the comedown, and the suffocating shame spiral. Rinse, repeat, release. Roll down my sleeve and I'm new again like a moth bursting from its pupa, leaving behind the squelching, squirming helplessness of its caterpillar stage. But people are not insects, our transformation is perpetual, one minute I'm flitting in warm moonlight and the next I'm the worm, crawling towards the last green leaf in my tiny universe; winter is coming. I cut because I couldn't cope, because it was comforting to know that nobody could hurt me like I could hurt me.

The blade steals something from you, every time it split my skin a piece of me left, slipping down the drain, no amount of band aids, and "this is the last time I promise" could shove it back inside. This work is a documentation of that loss, of damage, of grotesque transformation. It aims to hypnotize with disgust, to confront you with the ugly truth of vices; their pretty, empty promises. The blood is on my hands, the blood is mine, and there is no escaping me. There is no happy ending, only sharp edges, smears of red, and the faint buzzing threatening to swallow me.

Madi Brunetti is an aspiring mixed media artist from Denver, Colorado. She works primarily with oil paint, hand-embroidery, and even insects! Madi leans into contradiction, distorting and zooming in on the figure in unexpected ways to communicate struggles with the self and the body. Her work has been a part of several art shows exhibited at the History Colorado Center and the Museum of Contemporary Art Denver. Most recently her work was featured in The Portrait Gallery, a group exhibition at the Dairy Arts Center in Boulder, CO.

After receiving her BA in Studio Art from Fort Lewis College in December 2021 Madi completed a 6month residency at The Art Gym, a shared studio space and gallery. She hopes to continue her education to become a college Professor of Art with a focus on blending her passion for insects, painting, drawing, and embroidery.


