The Storybook Walks that took place last fall in Arborg as a＂PIVOT＂ response for programming through the North Interlake Parent Child Coalition are making a return this Spring．The Storybook Walks held last fall were very purposeful in connecting the story to the path：The 3 Billy Goats Gruff was placed on the Icelandic River Walking Trail； The Little Engine That Could started at the Public Library，a former CPR Station；and A Map of Good Memories was hosted at the Arborg \＆District Multicultural Heritage Village．

# The Sandy Hook Pier Calls For Help!

The Famous Sandy Hook Pier (TFSHP) is like an old family friend: a friend who knows you, your parents, your grandparents... a familiar soul who you know you can count on. If there's any time in our history that we need to know a friend like that will be there for us, it's now.

The Famous Sandy Hook Pier is an iconic community place and landmark on the shore of Lake Winnipeg, located at 11th Avenue in Sandy Hook, Manitoba. This seasonal wooden pier has been part of the Sandy Hook landscape since 1939, serving both as an access point to the beach and as a community gathering destination. It is a place of generations of joyful summer memories. The pier is annually constructed and deconstructed, with much of it being stored for re-use in subsequent years. The Famous Sandy Hook Pier is the ONLY public wooden pier in the RM of Gimli, and in 2020 it was the ONLY public wooden pier in the entire Interlake. The 2020 version of TFSHP was constructed with a unique "COVID-Compliant" design so that people could safely enjoy and use the pier during the first summer of the COVID-19 pandemic. This COVID-Compliant design is the plan for 2021 as well.

Please donate to this GoFundMe to cover increased material costs of the 2021 Famous Sandy Hook Pier. Material costs are DOUBLE what they were in 2020 due to skyrocketing lumber prices. These increased costs cannot be absorbed by existing financial supports. Grassroots support from this GoFundMe will allow for the 2021 TFSHP to be built to at least the same scale as last year. Without additional financial support from the community, this year's pier will have to be scaled back significantly. The $\$ 2000$ goal of this GoFundMe represents the increase in material costs this year. Any additional funds raised will be held in trust for future versions of TFSHP.

My name is Cameron Adams, and I am from Gimli, Manitoba. I am a 4th year Education Student in the Integrated Faculty of Education at the University of Winnipeg. I am an active volunteer having been involved in numerous clubs and groups in Gimli High School. In high school, I was introduced to Habitat for Humanity by our Social Justice Club and Mr. Rob Jantz who led bi-annual Habitat Trips to El Salvador. I went to El Salvador in July of 2014 and upon returning, kept on fundraising to participate on subsequent builds to Portugal (2015 \& 2017), Indonesia - 2016, Halifax - 2018, and most recently Macedonia in 2019.

Besides Habitat, I have been a volunteer with the Bear Clan Patrol in Winnipeg and a member of our Indigenous Students' Association at the University of Winnipeg. I also started donating blood with Canadian Blood Services in 2018 shortly after moving to Winnipeg to start university. It was there that I became very passionate about giving back regularly. After having brain surgery twice, I figured it would be great to help out every couple of months.

Recently I joined the Next Gen Blood Group, a group of youth volunteers that work together to recruit blood donors in Manitoba. We participate in different events throughout the year. Currently we in a competition for a scholarship, called Assignment Saving Lives. From April 1 until June 30, 2021, our goal is to raise awareness about blood donation and have people join our team when they donate. Every donation counts and my goal is to recruit 100 donors!
