


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Features of the CA Essential Webcam Flex



Connecting the CA Essential Webcam Flex

Insert the end of the USB Webcam Flex cable into the USB Type A port on your computer as shown.



The CA Essential Webcam Flex features full plug and play support for Windows, OS X / MacOS and Chromebooks. After plugging the webcam into the computer's USB Type A port, you may start any application that accepts a USB video stream, such as Skype, and begin using your webcam.


Important:

To use the webcam's internal microphone you will have to select it as a USB audio input in your application settings.

If the computer does not automatically recognize the webcam when it is plugged into the USB Type A port, try plugging the USB Webcam Flex Cable into a different USB Type A port. If this does not work then restart the computer. This will cause the webcam to be recognized in most instances.


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Attaching the CA Essential Webcam Flex to Your Monitor



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Manipulate the Camera View



Button Functions

The Webcam Flex features three different buttons that control the focus and orientation functions of the camera. These buttons ensure your viewers properly see what you are sharing.

Zoom Button - This button controls the five available levels of zoom to enable proper framing of your subject matter.

- Press the button once to increase the level of zoom. This can be repeated four more times.
- When the zoom reaches the highest level, the next press of the Zoom Button will return the Webcam Flex to the full image.

Image Button - This button controls image rotating and mirroring functions for Table View mode. Please note that the default settings may cause the image seen by your audience to be upside down, and in some situations your application may also mirror the image in a horizontal direction, so the left side of the image will be seen on the right, and the right side will be seen on the left. The image button corrects both of these functions.

To rotate an image:

- Press the Image Button once to rotate the image 180 degrees so it is seen in the proper orientation by your audience.
- When returning to Center View or Traditional View, press the button again to rotate the image back to the previous orientation.



Button Functions

To correct mirroring:

- Press and hold the Image Button for two seconds to flip the image horizontally.
- To return the image back to the previous setting, press and hold the Image Button for two seconds.



Focus Button - The Webcam Flex comes in auto focus mode by default (the light will be solid, indicating auto focus is active). If your image is blurry, or if the camera keeps re-focusing and won't stabilize, such as in a busy environment where the camera can't determine the proper focal point, the Focus Button enables image re-stabilization.

Manual

 If your image is blurry and won't focus, press the Focus Button once to re-focus the camera. The light will flash once.

Auto Focus and Fixed Focus

- If you see the camera re-focusing and won't stabilize, change to fixed focus. To change to fixed focus at a location 18-24 inches from the camera, press and hold the Focus Button for two seconds. The light will flash slowly when in fixed focus.
- Press and hold again to return to auto focus. The light will be lit solid.

Using the CA Essential Webcam Flex with Your Windows and Mac Computer

To use the webcam with your Windows computer you may need to allow applications installed on your computer to access the webcam in the Windows security settings.

- Select the ## Start button
- Select 'Settings'
- Select 'Privacy' (Scroll down to bottom of page)
- Select 'Camera'
- Turn on the 'Allow access to the camera on this device'

To use the webcam with your Mac computer you may need to allow applications installed on your computer to access the webcam in the Mac OS security settings.

- Select the Apple menu in the top left corner of the screen and choose 'System Preferences'
- Select 'Security & Privacy' preference panel
- Select 'Privacy'
- Select 'Camera' from the list on the left side
- Locate the application(s) you want to allow access to the webcam and check the box alongside the application name to enable the application to access the webcam

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Using Camera Applications on Your Windows 10 Computer

Camera application - Allows you to preview the webcam image, capture still frames and video clips.

- Select the # Start button
- Select 'Camera' from the list of applications

After you open the Camera app:

- Select Photo or Video then select it again to take a picture or start a video.
- If you are making a video, select Video again to finish recording.
- To see your new photo or video, or ones you've taken before
 - Select the **#** Start button
 - Select 'Photos' from the list of applications

Note:

If you are using a laptop with an integrated camera or have a second camera installed, you will need to change the camera selected in the app so that CA Essential Webcam Flex is selected.

- To select between cameras, select the camera icon with the circular arrow in the top right corner of the application. Selecting the icon will switch between installed cameras.
- If only one camera is installed on your Windows computer, the camera icon with the circular arrow will not be displayed.

Using Camera Applications on Your Mac Computer

Photo Booth Application - Allows you to preview the webcam image, capture still frames and video clips.

Note: You will need to enable the webcam in the Mac OS security settings, refer to instructions on page 7.

- Select the Finder button, select 'Applications' and then select 'Photo Booth'.
- At the top of the screen, select 'Camera' in the Photo Booth application menu and select 'CA Essential Webcam Flex' from the list of options.
- To capture images from the webcam, select the red camera icon.
- To switch to video mode, select the film strip button in the bottom left corner of the application. The red camera icon will change to a video icon .

QuickTime Player - Allows you to easily create video recordings that use the full webcam resolution.

Note: You will need to enable the webcam in the Mac OS security settings, refer to instructions on page 7.

- Select the Finder button, select 'Applications' and then select 'QuickTime Player'.
- Select 'File' and then select 'New Movie Recording'.
- To select the webcam input, select the small downward facing arrow next to the round record button .
- Select the record button to capture video.

Fixing Video Flickering

Video flickering can be fixed by following the recommended settings:

- The Flicker Control setting is preset at 60Hz.
- When traveling to another country where the PowerLine Frequency is 50Hz, you may find that the video is flickering. This will require switching the Flicker Control to 50Hz.
- When returning back to your home country, switch the Flicker Control back to 60Hz.



There are two ways to stop your video from flickering:

- Utilize a third-party application called AMCap
- (see instructions below)
- Change through the settings of your Video Messaging application

AMCap:

- Download and install AMCap Demo version from
- https://amcap.en.softonic.com/download?ex=NB-6.2
- Launch AMCap
- Select Options --> Video Device --> Properties
- Select appropriate Flicker Control to 50Hz or 60Hz in Light Source row.

Fixing Video Flickering

Skype Application:

When using Skype with the CA Essential Webcam Flex:

- Launch and sign in to Skype
- Go to Tools > Options > Audio & Video Settings
- Click the Webcam settings button
- Change the PowerLine Frequency (Anti Flicker) based on the recommended settings as mentioned on Page 11
- Click Apply and then click OK

Safety and Precautions

- Read and follow all instructions All operating and use instructions should be followed.
- Protect the USB Type A Cable from being pinched, particularly at the connectors. Unplug during lightning storms or when unused for long periods of time.
- If the webcam becomes hot after running for a long time, stop using the webcam for a period of time to let the webcam cool down.
- Do not place near any heat sources that produce heat.
- Do not make alterations to the webcam.
- Do not place near naked flame sources, such as lighted candles
- Do not expose to excessive heat (e.g. from storage in direct sunlight, fire or the like).
- Avoid touching the lens with fingers, sharp or coarse materials; use a clean, soft cloth for cleaning.
- Avoid dropping the webcam; impacts may cause damage to the lens, internal malfunction or scratches to the camera surfaces.
