VNEW is a specialized dermal allograft used by surgeons in gynecological and urological procedures when repairing pelvic organ prolapse (POP) and other pelvic floor conditions including:

- Fistula
- Cystocele
- Rectocele
- Enterocele
- Rectal prolapse
- Synthetic mesh removal
- Stress urinary incontinence

VNEW is a next-generation decellularized dermal allograft, made with human donor tissue that is processed with dCELL Technology. This process removes > 99% of the DNA and does not damage the graft.

Pelvic organ prolapse occurs when the connective tissues and/or muscles of the pelvic floor become weak or damaged. These muscles can no longer hold pelvic organs in place.

TYPES OF POP

- **CYSTOCELE** - dropped bladder (not feeling empty after urination)
- **RECTOCELE** - bulge at the bottom of the vagina (difficulty moving your bowel)
- **ENTEROCELE** - herniation of the small bowel (a pulling sensation in your pelvis that eases when lying down)
- **APICAL PROLAPSE** - descent of the uterus, cervix or vaginal vault

WHO IS AT RISK

- Post-menopausal women
- Overweight or obese women
- Women who have had a hysterectomy
- Women who have given birth vaginally

SYMPTOMS OF POP

- Pressure or fullness in the pelvic area
- Lower back pain
- Painful intercourse
- Feeling of something bulging or falling out
- Recurring UTI
- Chronic urge to urinate
