

Dear Friends,

It is my pleasure to report on the activities of the Natural Heritage Trust over the last year in support of our mission to further conservation, outdoor recreation, historic preservation, and waterfront revitalization in New York State.

This report highlights how the Trust has continued to successfully raise, manage, and administer funds to benefit public projects and programs in parks, historic sites, and public lands throughout New York State. At the close of our fiscal year (March 31, 2023), the Trust held just over \$62.5 million in total assets, including more than \$31.8 million for permanent endowments. We received over \$15.4 million in program and activity revenues, donations, grants, and corporate sponsorships, while expending approximately \$16.3 million in support of a wide variety of exemplary projects.

The Trust is honored to be a partner in New York's efforts to ensure that our parks, trails, historic sites, and open spaces are available to all. In 2022, we supported programs that expanded access to trails, connected communities with recreational activities, supported stewardship of our natural resources, and enhanced efforts to tell our state's diverse history.

ERIK KULLESEID, CHAIR Commissioner, Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (OPRHP)

Erik Kulleseid has been serving as Parks Commissioner and as the Chair of NHT since 2019. Previously, Mr. Kulleseid served as Senior Vice President, Parks and Policy Program for the Open Space Institute. He co-founded the Parks Program (originally the Alliance for New York State Parks) at OSI, along with former State Council of Parks Chair Lucy Waletzky and former State Parks Commissioner Carol Ash in 2010. During his tenure at OSI, Mr. Kulleseid secured \$30 million in private and public funds to support improvements and expand recreational access to state parks, including the Jones Beach Revitalization Plan, the Humphrey Nature Center at Letchworth State Park, Thacher Park Center, Denny Farrell Riverbank State Park, and a number of transformational projects at Minnewaska State Park Preserve. Commissioner Kulleseid graduated from Yale College, has a Law degree from Stanford Law School and a Forestry Master's degree from the Yale School of Forestry and Environmental Studies.

BRYAN ERWIN

Chair, State Council of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (SCOP)

Bryan Erwin is the current Chair of the Long Island State Park Commission, first appointed in December of 2008. He was reappointed in June of 2021 for a second seven-year term. In march of 2023, Bryan was named Chair of the New York State Council of Parks. Bryan has a master's degree from Cornell University in International Trade and Finance. He was selected by President Obama in 2010 to run the Trade Advocacy Center, to facilitate US Government advocacy on behalf of U.S. exporters. While Director, Bryan advanced US commercial interests by leading 177 successful campaigns resulting in \$199.7 billion in new business for US companies, supporting 1 million U.S. jobs. He also ed and facilitated Executive Order 13630, establishing an Interagency Task Force on Commercial Advocacy, signed by President Obama on December 6, 2012. He has spent much of his career promoting the growth of exports of U.S. goods and services around the world. A longtime advocate for State Parks, Bryan hails from the North Fork of Long Island where he and his wife, Danielle, are raising two daughters and a stuffed lemur, Coco.

BASIL SEGGOS

Commissioner, Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC)

Since his appointment in 2015, Commissioner Seggos has managed programs promoting a clean, healthy and accessible environment and supporting world-class outdoor recreation on state lands and waters. In addition to advising the Governor on environmental policy and issues, he serves on a variety of boards including the Adirondack Park Agency (APA), Delaware River Basin Commission, the Great Lakes Commission, Hudson River Park, the NYS Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC), the NYS Drinking Water Quality Council, the New York State Energy and Research Development Authority (NYSERDA), the Olympic Regional Development Authority (ORDA), the Susquehanna River Basin Commission, and the NYS Energy Planning Board. He received his B.A. from Trinity College and earned his law degree from Pace University. Commissioner Seggos is a Captain in the U.S. Army Reserve.

ROBERT RODRIGUEZ Secretary of State, Department of State (DOS)

Robert J. Rodriguez is currently serving as the Secretary of State. He was nominated by Governor Kathy Hochul to serve as New York's 68th Secretary of State. Mr. Rodriguez is a uniquely accomplished leader and former legislator, with civic and legislative successes that have been focused strategically on investing in and developing public-good infrastructure projects, creating good-paying jobs and addressing financial disparities for historically underrepresented minorities and low-income communities.



The Natural Heritage Trust administers grants and contracts with its agency partners that support efforts to protect, conserve and enhance the state's public lands.

STEWARDSHIP AND CONSERVATION

Projects at State Parks supported by the NHT include natural resource stewardship, environmental education programs, open space acquisition, and energy efficiency and sustainability initiatives. NHT supports the Department of Environmental Conservation's work to develop and manage several habitat improvement and public access projects throughout NYS, including the St. Lawrence River, Niagara River, and Hudson River. NHT supported programs at the Department of State protect, restore and educate the public about the South Shore Estuary and stewardship, further ecosystem-based management programs in the Ocean and Great Lakes watersheds, and protect natural resources along the state's coast lines.

EDUCATION

The NHT's partnerships support the development and implementation of environmental education through support of State Park nature centers, interpretive and educational staff and outreach programs in the Adirondack and Catskill areas, including the DEC Campership program which provides free or low-cost summer camp experiences that connect children with nature, conservation and ecology. The NHT also supports the state's historic sites and interpretation programs, including efforts that ensure New York's diverse stories are told and represent the experiences of all communities.

OUTDOOR RECREATION

The NHT supports a wide variety of programs in public lands that encourage park visitors to enjoy the outdoors through recreation including trail development and maintenance, youth sports and activities, athletic leagues, road races and sporting events, and outreach programs that provide instruction and equipment to break down barriers to access in communities throughout the state.









The Natural Heritage Trust collaborates with the Office of Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation (OPRHP), Department of Environmental Conservation (DEC) and Department of State (DOS) to identify sources of private investment to supplement state support for our natural, recreational and historic resources. Since 1968, millions of private dollars have been secured to support programming, capital projects, environmental and outdoor education, natural resource protection, and historic preservation throughout the state. The Trust is dedicated to building and sustaining relationships with private supporters to protect and enhance these programs and projects.

ENDOWMENTS AND MAJOR GIFTS

As of FY2022-23 the NHT managed over \$31.8 million in separate long-term investment/endowment accounts. The NHT manages 17 dedicated endowments statewide. NHT endowment funds are invested to provide an ongoing source of annual income. Earnings from these accounts support the restricted projects and programs for which the funds were raised. The NHT continues to actively expand its endowment portfolio.

FOUNDATION SUPPORT

During FY2022-23, the NHT received support from a wide array of foundations, trusts and not-for-profit organizations. In some instances, the NHT receives annual distributions from entities with funding dedicated for the benefit of specific parks and facilities. In other cases, the NHT is awarded foundation grants in support of specific programs and/or projects.

FRIENDS' GROUPS

As part of its overall mission, the NHT builds and maintains partnerships with a variety of Friends and other mission-congruent groups. The NHT collaborates in a number of ways—in some cases acting as a fiscal agent, and in some situations the NHT receives funds raised by the Friends in order to support a specific park or site.

STATEWIDE PROGRAMMING, AGENCY INITIATIVES AND COLLABORATIONS

The NHT provides support to its state agency partners by soliciting and securing public and private funding via grants, donations, program income and other funds to enhance the agencies' abilities to carry out their respective missions by supplementing limited state resources. Through our cooperative relationships, the NHT provides agencies and friends' groups with support in investment management and administrative functions for specific projects and programs.

2022 - 2023 Accomplishments & Highlights

SUPPORTING OUTDOOR RECREATION AND COMMUNITY EVENTS STATEWIDE

The NHT supports a wide range of programs that offer visitors to state parks a multitude of recreational, athletic, and exciting community events. The Bike Library at Shirley Chisholm State Park, located in Brooklyn, entering its third year, plays an important role in the community by connecting people with nature, providing free educational and cycling opportunities for kids of all ages and contributing to the physical and mental wellbeing of the park's neighbors. Since it began, the Bike Library has made over 28,400 loans! The Bike Library's programs taught 125 kids to ride a bike in the last year.

Also in New York City, the <u>Major League Baseball Foundation</u> contributes funding to the NHT that is used to operate a free tee ball program at Roberto Clemente State Park. The program serves over 140 kids, providing free uniforms, equipment and both coaching and game time.

On Long Island, the NHT works closely with our State Park partners to administer the funding that supports major

community events including the popular Summer and Winter Run series, the Memorial Day Air Show and July 4th Fireworks at Jones Beach State Park. These events draw millions annually to parks in the Long Island region.

CAPITAL DISTRICT NATURE BUS CONNECTS COMMUNITIES WITH NATURE

The Mohawk Hudson Land Conservancy (MHLC), the Capital District Transportation Authority (CDTA) and project partners offered a second year of free bus service to connect communities in the City of Albany to natural areas in Albany County. The NHT's Connect Kids to Parks program supported the 2022 Nature Bus as a partner. The complimentary service ran every Saturday from May 28 through September 24, 2022. On the heels of a successful pilot season in 2021, the Nature Bus saw a 30% increase in ridership in 2022. More than 1,200 residents used the free service to access and enjoy nature at nine outdoor locations. Nature Bus also gave riders access to the larger community events of the year including Five Rivers Annual Festival and Thacher Park's Hawk Watch.

LADDERS TO THE OUTDOORS AIMS HIGHER

The Ladders to the Outdoors (LTO) Program grew in 2022, with programs and activities held in three state park regions serving over 20,000 youth. LTO expands access to outdoor recreation in New York State Parks to underserved communities through partnerships and by breaking down barriers by providing access to recreational equipment, transportation to state parks and historic sites, and instructional programs including swimming, camping, biking, boating, hiking, sports and more.



Now in its fourth season, the Western NY LTO has served over 14,000 kids with over 200 programs and over 60 community-based partnerships. Highlights this year included overnight camping trips to Allegany State Park and an event that brought over 2,000 kids to Buffalo Harbor State Park in partnership with Say Yes Buffalo. The WNY LTO is funded through a grant from the Ralph C. Wilson Jr. Foundation. In 2022, the NHT was awarded a total of \$75,000 in grants from the Central NY Community Foundation and the Gifford Foundation to develop and implement the second LTO, serving the Syracuse, NY community. The funding supports the purchase of equipment, supplies, outreach expenses and instructors, as well as the renovation of a LTO camping and outdoor education area at Green Lakes State Park. The program has already served 12,000 youth and is working directly with many community-based organizations in Syracuse

In Harriman State Park, NHT partnered with the <u>Appalachian Mountain Club</u> (AMC), <u>State Parks</u>, and the <u>Palisades Interstate Park Commission</u> to offer daily outdoor engagement programming to visitors to the heavily visited Reeves Meadow Visitors Center and two campgrounds in the park in the summer of 2022. Interpretive programming developed and delivered by AMC focused on removing barriers to promote a more inclusive outdoor experience, stewardship education and hands-on naturalist experiences. The program served 7,400 people and was delivered in both English and Spanish. The program will continue in 2023.

WORK BEGINS ON NEW VISITOR CENTER AT BAYARD CUTTING ARBORETUM STATE PARK

In early 2023, work began on a \$9.3 million construction project for a new Visitor Center, improved parking, and enhanced exhibits at Bayard Cutting Arboretum State Park in Suffolk County. Work will include a new 1,600 square-foot Visitor Center to educate visitors about the Cutting family and their historic 60-room, Tudor-style mansion, the landscaped grounds with a wide variety of trees, shrubs and plants, and the impact of ongoing climate change on Long Island. The \$9.3 million dollar project has been funded by several partners including a \$1.5 million donation from the Bayard Cutting Board of Trustees through the Natural Heritage Trust.

NEW YORK CAMPERS LOVE THEIR PUBLIC LANDS



Through a unique partnership with NY's state campground reservation system, <u>ReserveAmerica</u>, campers have donated more than \$68,000 to support State Park and DEC campgrounds through "rounding-up" when making online reservations. More than 21,000 have participated in just over a year, demonstrating just how dedicated campers are to the stewardship of public lands and outdoor recreation.

NHT PROGRAM STAFF ADVANCING NEW YORK'S STEWARDSHIP & OUR WHOLE HISTORY GOALS

Waletzky Environmental Stewardship Fellow

In 2022, the first Lucy R. Waletzky Environmental Stewardship fellow began work in the State Park's Division of Environmental Stewardship and Planning. Emily Johnson was selected as the program's first fellow in late 2022. Emily's work as a Waletzky Fellow encompasses all things stewardship, from biodiversity conservation to holistic land management. At the park scale, she has been helping to coordinate the creation of a Stewardship Plan for Minnewaska State Park Preserve, which identifies top conservation targets within the park preserve and outlines action items for effective management of said targets. At the statewide level, she is leading the development of a climate change vulnerability assessment process for OPRHP facilities to evaluate how on-the-ground resources at a given park or historic site may be affected by various climate impacts such as flooding, sea level rise, and temperature increase. This analysis includes environmental resources such natural

shorelines and important bird habitat. The information gained from these assessments will be used to support facility-specific adaptation planning. Additionally, as part of OPRHP's emphasis on healthy habitats, she is researching how the Resist-Accept-Direct adaptive management framework can be incorporated as a guidance tool for stewardship practitioners within the agency to make strategic and informed management decisions for ecosystems under shifting ecological conditions.

Interpreter of Native American History



Yehehnakwáhstha? Kim Hill, Interpreter of Native American History

The NHT worked with State Parks to support a new position within the State Historic Preservation Office to inform and assist with the development and incorporation of Indigenous stories into the interpretation of its thirty-five state historic sites and state parks with historic resources. Within the first six months of her position as Interpreter of Native American History, Yehehnakwáhstha? Kim Hill has been making great strides within the agency to help develop and incorporate Indigenous stories and history into the interpretation of its historic sites and state parks. Her passion for interpretation, parks, and increasing the visibility of Native American communities and cultures through representation and education will support efforts to share a more complete and inclusive history with the public through State Park's Our Whole History initiative. Some of Kim's upcoming projects include John Jay Homestead's Capital project and Johnson Hall's Brightening the Covenant Chain partnership. Her priorities focus on creating Indigenous educational guides, interpretive materials, and guidelines around Indigenous resources, perspectives, and consultations.

WESTERN NEW YORK TRAILS AND STEWARDSHIP

The Trust continues to administer over \$26 million in Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. Foundation grant funding for Western New York greenway, trail, and park projects. In 2022, State Parks completed a \$6.5 million project to improve the Genesee Valley Greenway State Park from Rochester to the village of Avon. Rehabilitation of the 17-mile stretch at the north end of the Greenway was supported by a \$2.5 million grant from the Foundation. Work is also well underway on the new Welcome Center at Niagara Falls State Park. The state-of-the-art welcome center will be





named in honor of Ralph C. Wilson, Jr. in recognition of his remarkable legacy of support for tourism, parks, and outdoor recreation, trail development, and community revitalization in Western New York. The new center is expected to open in the summer of 2023. The Foundation contributed \$8 million toward the \$46 million project.

The Wilson Foundation is also having a big impact in Allegany State Park with its support of a new multi-use trail. Phase 2 of the Quaker Area Multi-Use Trail will extend the trail another 3.6 miles westward, from the Quaker General Store to the Quaker Lake Beach. This 10-foot-wide trail will include eight pedestrian bridges

and an elevated boardwalk crossing a wetland and will traverse through woodlands, across streams and other natural features, connecting with trailheads and park amenities along the way to the swimming beach. Work is well under way, and the trail is expected to open summer 2023. The Foundation provided a \$1.22 million grant toward the \$6.5 million project.

PROTECTING, CONSERVING AND EXPANDING ACCESS TO NY'S ADIRONDACK AND **CATSKILL REGIONS**



Conservation is to conserve, improve and protect New York's natural resources and environment and to prevent, abate and control water, land and air pollution, in order to enhance the health, safety and welfare of the people of the state and their overall economic and social wellbeing. The DEC also ensures the protection of more than three millions acres of open space in the Adirondack and Catskill regions that are renowned destinations for hiking, camping and wilderness experiences. Donations to the NHT support efforts to ensure these lands are conserved as well as innovate programs that expand access to them, like Adventure NY, I Fish NY and outdoor recreation education initiatives for youth and adults.






