




2019 Point in Time City and County of Denver







#### **DENVER COUNTY PIT DATA 2019**

This report summarizes key data points for the City and County of Denver in Colorado, for the 2019 Point in Time (PIT) Count. The PIT is a snapshot of those experiencing homelessness in our community on a single night. This data was collected for the night of January 28th, 2019. The full *Everyone Counts* Metro Denver Homeless Initiative's 2019 Point in Time report goes into detail explaining the methodology used while preparing for the count, executing the survey throughout the seven-county region, de-duplicating and cleaning the data, and extrapolation methods utilized.
