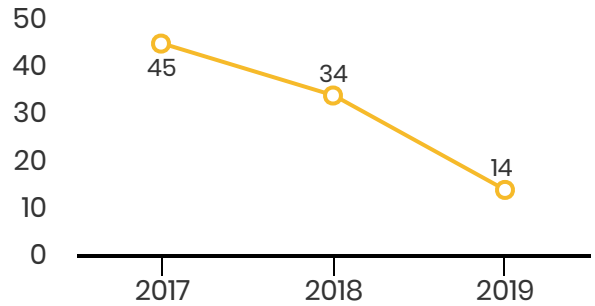

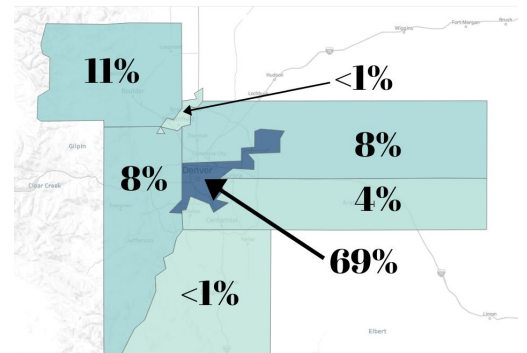

This report summarizes key data points for the County of Douglas in Colorado, for the 2019 Point in Time (PIT) Count. The PIT is a snapshot of those experiencing homelessness in our community on a single night. This data was collected for the night of January 28<sup>th</sup>, 2019. The full *Everyone Counts* Metro Denver Homeless Initiative's 2019 Point in Time report <sup>1</sup> goes into detail explaining the methodology used while preparing for the count, executing the survey throughout the seven-county region, de-duplicating and cleaning the data, and extrapolation methods utilized. Refer directly to the regional report when interpreting the data contained in this county specific report.

Four emergency shelter surveys were completed in Douglas County, though because of the proximity county lines at the rotating church location for Winter Shelter Network, these were incorrectly attributed to Arapahoe County. Due to the complexity of the collected data, MDHI will not be making changes to the original dataset for 2019. This correction does not impact the regional count data, as the completed surveys were only misattributed at the county level.
