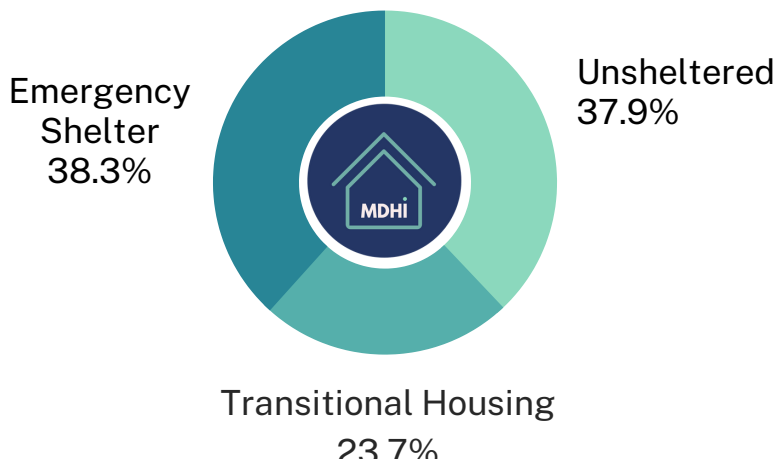

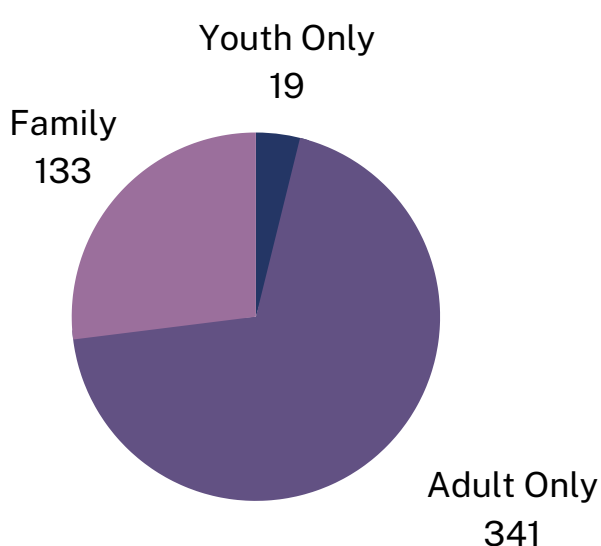
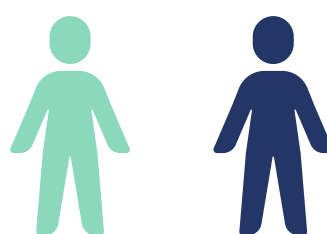
WHERE THEY STAYED

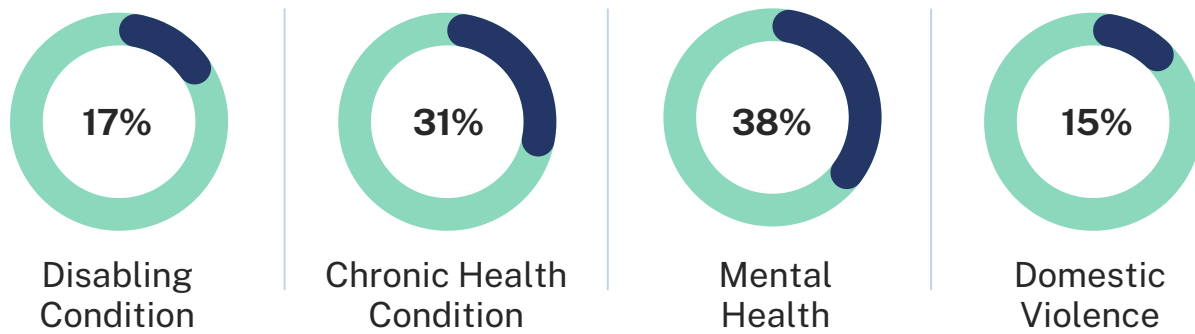
Experiencing homelessness for the first time



HOUSEHOLD TYPE

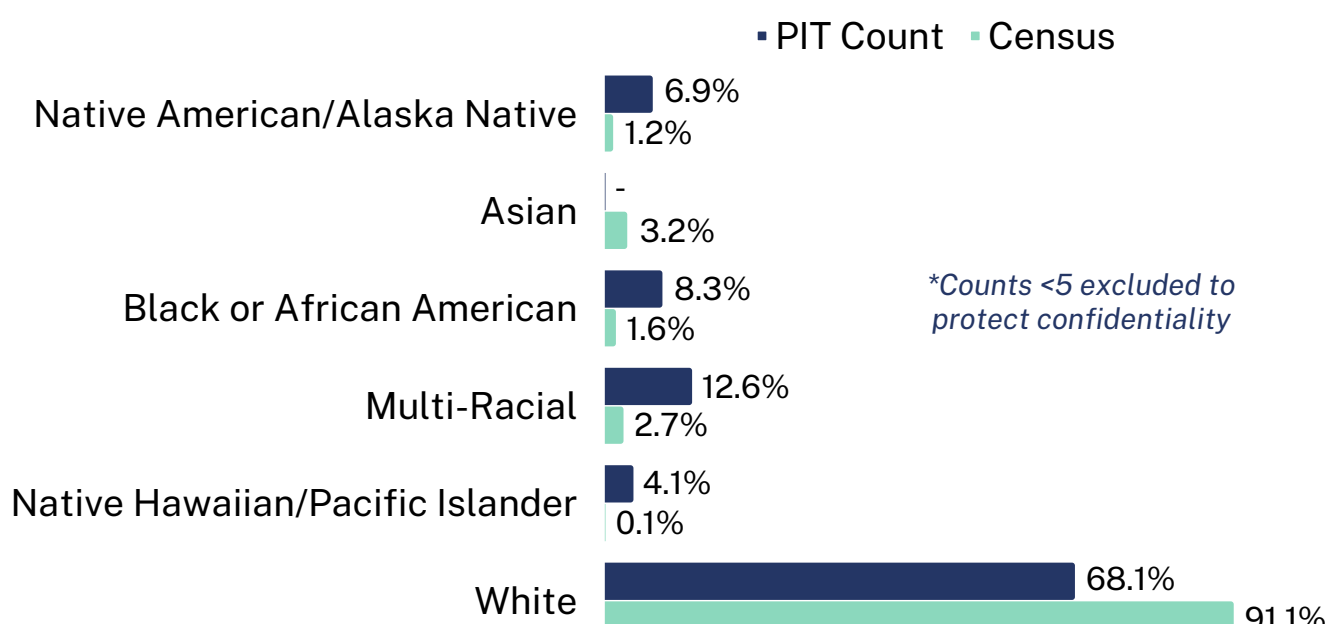

RACIAL DISPARITIES

Native Americans/Alaska Natives are overrepresented (5.8X) in homelessness relative to the general population in Jefferson County. The same is true for those identifying as Black/African American (5.2X), Multi-Racial (4.7X), & Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander (41X).
