



RACIAL DISPARITIES

Native Americans or Alaska Natives in Broomfield County, CO are 15.5X overrepresented in homelessness relative to their makeup of the general population. The same is true for those identifying as Multiracial (1.9X). These inequities stem from systemic racism that directly causes homelessness.
