



RACIAL DISPARITIES

Native Americans or Alaska Natives in the City of Aurora are 4.7X overrepresented in homelessness relative to their makeup of the general population. The same is true for those identifying as Black or African American (2.3X). These inequities stem from systemic racism that directly causes homelessness.
