



RACIAL DISPARITIES

Native Hawaiians or Pacific Islanders in Denver County are 18.5X overrepresented in homelessness relative to their makeup of the general population. The same is true for those identifying as Native American or Alaska Native (2.7X), Black or African American (2.4X), and Multi-Racial (1.8X).
