WE HAVE ORDINANCES

The City of Freeman has ordinances in place for the safety of our residents, guests, & businesses.

Ordinances specify expectations about building permits, sidewalks, parking of vehicles on city streets, tree limbs, garbage containers, alcohol, zoning, pets, fireworks, & more.

Familiarity with ordinances helps to ensure that you're in compliance for a variety of situations that impact our Freeman residents & businesses.

In order to receive official approval,
your application will need
to be reviewed by our
Planning & Zoning Administrator.
Application fees vary with regard to
the type & size of the project.

Getting Hooked Up for Services in Freeman

WATER, SEWER, GARBAGE PICK-UP

Upon arrival in Freeman, new residents & business owners will want to arrange for water, sewer, & garbage/sanitation services.

This can be done at City Hall, located at the corner of Third & Poplar, between the hours of 7 AM – 4 PM,

Mon. through Fri. A \$100 deposit is required for providing services to rental homes.

NATURAL GAS & ELECTRICITY

Northwestern Energy provides natural gas & electricity for Freeman.

INTERNET & CABLE

Golden West Telecommunications provides internet & cable services for Freeman. Channel 90 is our local cable station. Contact them at 855.888.7777.

Payment for water, sewer, & garbage pick-up becomes due on the 20th day of each month, with a \$10 fee assessed for late payments. Payments may be made in person at City Hall, done online at CityofFreeman.org, or placed in the deposit slot (available 24/7) at City Hall. We're happy to arrange for automatic withdrawal payments. Forms are available online.

SANITATION SERVICES

The City of Freeman's sanitation truck makes its routes beginning in the early morning hours on the following days:

Tuesdays — Properties North of Sixth Street Fridays — Properties South of Sixth Street

Containers of the following sizes & rates can be made available to residents & businesses for weekly service:

90-gallon container - \$15

2nd 90-gallon container - \$14

300-gallon container - \$52

2nd 300-gallon container - \$42

Additional pick-ups are available for an added fee. Service is also available to those within a mile of Freeman.

Accepted for pick-up: disposable diapers, food waste, clothes, fiberglass light bulbs (incl. fluorescent), punctured aerosol cans, plastic not labeled 1-5; plastic bags, small dead animals, window panes & mirrors, Styrofoam, empty (& dried) paint cans

Please deposit grass clippings, leaves, branches, & trees in the Compost Area of the Rubble Site.

To avoid forgetting, garbage receptacles may be rolled out to the edge of the sidewalk the night before, with the hinge toward your property & the portion of the lid that opens to be placed toward the street.

City ordinance requires receptacles to BE ROLLED AWAY FROM THE CURB FOR THE REMAINDER OF THE WEEK.

RECYCLING

The City of Freeman operates a self-service Recycling Center on the west edge of town at 109 S. Cedar Street. This facility is available 24/7, though materials need to be sorted on site or in advance. The following items are accepted for recycling:

Tin Cans

Plastic Bottles Labeled 1-5

Plastic Containers Labeled 1-5

Glass

Computer Paper & Glossy-Finish Paper

Shredded Office Paper

Newspaper Magazines

Phone Books

All Types of Clean Cardboard

Please Note: All Containers MUST BE EMPTY!
The Recycling Center does NOT accept Styrofoam.





RUBBLE SITE

Freeman's Rubble Site is located one-half mile west of town on North County Road. Hours of operation are as follows:

April - September

Wednesdays 3 PM - 7 PM Saturdays Noon - 5 PM

October – March Wednesdays Noon – 4 PM Saturdays Noon – 4 PM

The following fees are assessed for loads of materials deposited at the Rubble Site:

Car Load - \$5

Pickup Load - \$10

Trailer (8-ft. or less) - \$10

Trailer or Truck (10 cubic yds. or less) - \$20

Trailer or Truck (11-15 cubic yds.) - \$32

Trailer or Truck (16-30 cubic yds.) - \$45

CRT TV or Computer Monitor Disposal - \$20

The City of Freeman typically offers free access to the Rubble Site two days each year in late spring or early summer. Watch for announcements on social media, on our website & in the local newspaper.

Please do NOT place leaves or branches in garbage containers.

The Compost, Tree, & Branch Areas of the Rubble Site is FREE of charge & open 24/7.

The compost area is for grass clippings, leaves, & garden waste. Trees & branches less than 6 inches in diameter should be placed in the branch area; thicker branches are to be deposited in the tree area.

The City of Freeman requires pets to be registered, along with proof of rabies vaccination. The new license fee is \$10. Renewals are \$5 & become due annually on June 30. In the event a pet is lost, pet registration also increases the likelihood of a pet owner being reunited with their furry friend.
