Georgetown ISD Board Calls for May Bond Election

The Georgetown ISD Board of Trustees unanimously approved an order calling for a \$649,510,000 bond election to be held on May 4, 2024.









The bond addresses district growth, aging facilities, safety, technology, fine arts, and athletics. The proposed projects will be presented to voters in four separate propositions on the ballot.

Role of the Citizens' Advisory Committee (CAC)





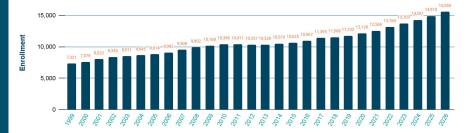


- 80 representatives consisting of community leaders, staff, and parents from every campus
 - Six months of study to prioritize the district's facility, programmatic and fiscal needs
- More than 60 maintenance, replacement, and expansion projects analyzed to provide equitable offerings for students across all feeder patterns
- Result of the committee was a recommendation for a comprehensive bond package with a maximum 1-cent tax rate impact

PROP A



- Safety & Security infrastructure & equipment
- Construct a new elementary school, middle school and high school
- Renovate current Benold MS as new Frost ES



PROP A, CONT.



- Renovate and expand fine arts and athletics classrooms at Forbes MS, East View HS and GHS
- Renovate vacated labs/classrooms at EVHS and GHS
- Renovate/replace flooring, lighting and paint at aging campuses
- Replace of playground equipment at Cooper ES
- Replace or upgrade HVAC at 3 campuses
- Instructional equipment
- Replace risers and sound systems
- New buses
- Parking lot repairs, additions and driveway adjustments
- Land acquisition for future development



PROP B



- Replace and add student and staff devices to accommodate for enrollment growth and lifecycle replacement
- Technology infrastructure replacements/upgrades to include phone gateway, data center, firewall and electronics
- Replace aging or broken equipment used for classroom instruction and business operations



PROP C



- Construct a performing arts facility at East View HS
- Continued maintenance of Klett Performing Arts facility at Georgetown HS
- Replace fine arts concert attire and uniforms



PROP D



- Renovate athletic facilities to accommodate for growth
- Track repairs

* Georgetown ISD is classified as a Chapter 49 or "property wealthy" district and will be required to send recapture dollars back to the State's General Fund. This amount will change when actual tax collections are updated.



All funds generated by a bond election remain in Georgetown and cannot be recaptured by the State.

Principal and interest payments on the bonds approved by voters for district facilities

Property Tax Rate

School taxes involve two figures:

Maintenance & Operations (M&O)

tax rate provides for the day-to-day operation of the district and funds items such as salaries and benefits, utilities, transportation, supplies, etc.

Interest & Sinking (I&S) tax rate provides funds for payments on the debt that finances district facilities.

I&S	\$0.3475
Total Tax Rate	\$1.0467

The tax rate was approved at the September 2023 board meeting and is 16.69 cents lower than last year.

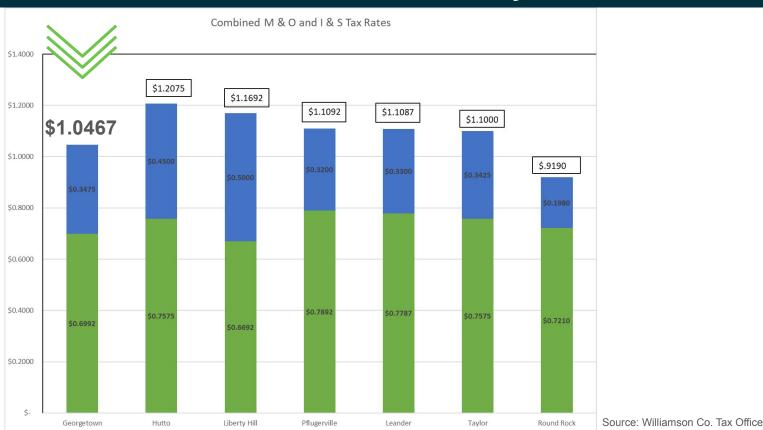

Election Information

State-Required Ballot Language

Georgetown Independent School District Proposition A

The issuance of \$597,470,000 in bonds for school facilities, the purchase of school security technology, the purchase of the necessary sites for school facilities, and the purchase of school buses and the levy of taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds. This is a property tax increase.

Georgetown Independent School District Proposition B

The issuance of \$20,330,000 in bonds for District-wide school technology and the levy of taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds. This is a property tax increase.

Georgetown Independent School District Proposition C

The issuance of \$27,850,000 in bonds for District performing arts facilities and the levy of taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds. This is a property tax increase.

Georgetown Independent School District Proposition D

The issuance of \$3,860,000 in bonds for District athletic facilities and the levy of taxes sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds. This is a property tax increase.
