About the Show

Regretting Almost Everything is a new, intimate, two-person musical comedy about a middle-aged woman, Anne, who loves her husband Clay and likes her job, but realizes she needs more – more passion in her marriage and fulfillment in her life – and sets out on a quest to get it.

We see Anne and Clay navigate the joyous, painful, confounding adventure that is Love, Sex and Kids: Finding your person; the awe you feel when you make a kid; the terror when, 18 years later, that kid doesn't come home all night; what to do when passion in the bedroom wanes; what it's like to gaze down on your newborn grandchild for the first time. These experiences, though common, are not ordinary; indeed, they are among the most extraordinary and profound in our lives.

The show is also transgressive: A middle-aged woman leaves her marriage for better sex and isn't punished by the Universe. In fact, a year and a half later, both she and her ex-husband have found new love, remain best friends, and, ironically, have no regrets.
