PASTOR'S LETTER



Those of us on Atonement's staff who attend our weekly staff meetings (Wednesdays at 1pm, if you're wondering) have started reading a book together called Growing Young by Powell, Mulder, and Griffin. The book grew out of a three-year research study in which the Fuller Youth Institute (at Fuller Theological Seminary in California) studied congregations across the country who were effectively loving and serving young people. They describe these churches as "growing young" because they 1. engage young people between the ages of 15 to 29; and 2. they are growing spiritually, emotionally, missionally, and sometimes numerically.

Pastor Kevin suggested this book to me as something we as staff could use to gain some shared language around youth ministry as we prepare to begin a search for a new youth director. It is worth reading for that reason alone. But I am excited about reading this book with staff – and sharing this with you – because this book takes a large enough view of ministry that I expect it to have an effect on many aspects of our ministry together.

For instance, the first of six core commitments they discuss is "Unlock Keychain Leadership." They present this kind of leadership as it relates to working with youth and young adults. How are we sharing leadership responsibilities - and authority - with youth? In what ways do leaders in our congregation hold onto the "keys" of leadership instead of sharing them with young people? Important questions for our youth ministry - but remove the language about "youth/young" and they are still important guestions for all of us. How do we invite new people into leadership roles? How do we prepare them to lead well? What barriers do we put in the way of new people who are willing to lead?

Why am I sharing this with you? A few things... First, I want you simply to know that this is the kind of thing we do on staff (which I understand isn't new). It is also probably good for you to know that you may begin to hear shifts in how we on staff talk about ministry, particularly as it relates to youth and young adults. And, of course, if you find this interesting you are welcome to get yourself a copy of the book to read as well – if you do, I would love to know that and hear your thoughts about the book. If you are involved in our youth ministry in some way, we may ask you to join us in reading this book. Those of us on staff who have begun reading it together are already excited about the discussions we're having. In particular, as we begin to invite people to serve on a new search committee for the purpose of seeking a new youth director, we will be using this book as part of the foundation for our discussions.

Troy brought many gifts to his work as our youth director, and did a wonderful job for us for over eight years. We are not reconsidering the direction of our youth program due to any deficiency in what has been done. What we are doing is using this interim period as an opportunity, after eight years, to consider how society has changed, how our congregation has changed, and therefore what changes would be beneficial in our youth ministries so we can make them now – and so that we can be clear about our expectations while hiring a new youth director. Don't worry, this won't be as involved a process as what you went through during the interim time that led to my call as your new senior pastor.

On the other hand, we don't have the benefit of having done some of this work already, like those on the contemporary musician search committee could rely on the worship surveys done the previous year.

Lastly, I would like to ask you to keep us in prayer – to hold those of us who serve on your staff in prayer as we lead our congregation and see to the day to day realities of ministry; to hold in prayer everyone who does ministry with and for youth and young adults here at Atonement, especially during this interim time; to hold in prayer the process of putting together a youth director search committee, and the people who will be invited to serve on that committee; and, last but not least, all of the youth and young adults of our congregation, that they may experience this congregation as a community that loves them, supports them, cares for them, and values the gifts for ministry that they have to share.

AIR QUALITY + OUTDOOR WORSHIP

A reminder that we have started to monitor the Air Quality Index (AQI), primarily through Wisconsin's air quality map. This map uses the same basic data as the EPA's national map (gispub.epa.gov/airnow). Anytime air quality is rated "unhealthy" or worse, we will move our 10:00 a.m worship indoors. Due to how quickly wind and weather patterns can affect air quality, we will wait until Sunday morning to make decisions related to air quality, and will do so by 7:00 a.m. If outdoor worship is moved indoors for a particular Sunday we will share that information through all of our normal channels.

Please be aware that even before air quality reaches the "unhealthy" level it can be "unhealthy for sensitive groups." Individuals who are considered more sensitive to poor air quality include children, older adults, and those who spend lots of time outdoors, as well as those with heart or lung issues. **Please make the best decision for you related to attending outdoor worship.** Our 8:30 a.m. worship service is always indoors, and both the 8:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. service are live streamed each week.
