I spoke to a friend today in floods of tears. Her neighbour's son, aged 42, has had a massive heart attack as a result of complications due to the coronavirus. He had had his vaccination just two days before but his body was already fighting the virus. He has severe brain damage as a result of the heart attack and is now described as a 'vegetable'. His life support machine is going to be turned off this week.

I have really struggled during lockdown 3.0 but today I feel grateful to be writing this for the front of Partners. One of the challenges of loving others as Jesus taught us is trying to avoid giving 'reasons' for why people are ill or die in the way that they do. Because the person in question has underlying health conditions and is overweight, somehow we think it is our right to 'share' this information with others. Statistics in the public domain encourage us to judge life and death using worldly definitions but the Bible tells us that death is not the end and that God is in control and loves us.

I am reminded that this human being is going to be a statistic but created in His image, deserves to be remembered for more than his health. I am also reminded to be more careful with the information I have and the information I share. It is not my job to explain.
