Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Be present with us now, Lord God, as we remember Jesus, who, on the night before he died, took bread and wine, gave you thanks, and offered them to his friends, saying, 'This is my body, this is my blood, eat and drink to remember me.'

Let us proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died.
Christ is risen.
Christ will come again.

Come freshly to us now, Lord God: call us again to be your friends; free us from the fear that the cost will be too great; nourish us always with the true bread; and transform the ordinariness of our lives with the wine of your abundant grace. May your love overflow through us, so that the world will come to know your glory, and to live your praise:

Blessing and honour and glory and power be yours for ever and ever. AMEN. We keep a period of silence at the end of the Prayer.
