THEVIGIL

The Readings for the Vigil tell the history of our Salvation. If the full Vigil Service is celebrated, the Readings last until Dawn, and lead into the First Communion of Easter. We use a short selection of them here.

<u>The Easter Proclamation</u> (Exsultet), an ancient hymn for Easter Eve, is sung before and during the Vigil Readings.

The Proclamation celebrates this night as the night of deliverance from slavery and death.

Exult now all ye heavenly legions of angels; all ye that stand before the throne of God: and for the victory of our king let the trumpet of salvation sound.

Let the earth rejoice in the bright radiance of the light which is shed upon her: and illumined by the splendour of the Everlasting King, let her know that the darkness of the world has been banished.

And let our mother the Church, bathed in the brightness of this light rejoice and sing; and let this building resound with the praises of her people.

Wherefore I pray and beseech you, dearly beloved who here perceive the marvellous brightness of this heavenly light; join with me in supplication to the Almighty and most merciful Father; that we may praise the mysteries which by this light are signified.

Ist **READING:** Ezekiel 36:24-28

The word of the LORD came to me: ²⁴I will take you from the nations, and gather you from all the countries, and bring you into your own land. ²⁵I will sprinkle clean water upon you, and you shall be clean from all your uncleannesses, and from all your idols I will cleanse you. ²⁶A new heart I will give you, and a new spirit I will put within you; and I will remove from your body the heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. ²⁷I will put my spirit within you, and make you follow my statutes and be careful to observe my ordinances. ²⁸Then you shall live in the land that I gave to your ancestors; and you shall be my people, and I will be your God.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, that we should with all our heart and soul sing praise to God the Invisible and Almighty: and to his only begotten Son, Jesus Christ our Lord; who by his death hath cancelled the bond that was against us; and hath redeemed us unto God by the shedding of his blood.

For this is the true Passover, wherein the true Lamb of God is slain; by whose blood are hallowed the doorposts of his faithful people. This is the night, wherein the forefathers, the children of Israel, were brought forth out of Egypt, and passed through the Red Sea as if on dry land.

This is the night which by the light of the pillar of fire, hath purged away the shadows of sin. This is the night wherein all that believe in Christ throughout the world, delivered from the wickedness of this present age and out of the shadow of death are restored to grace and are made partakers of God's holiness.

This is the night wherein the bonds of death were loosed and Christ rose again from the grave in triumph.

2nd **READING:** Romans 6:3-11

³Do you not know that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? ⁴Therefore we have been buried with him by baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

⁵For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. ⁶We know that our old self was crucified with him so that the body of sin might be destroyed, and we might no longer be enslaved to sin. ⁷For whoever has died is freed from sin. ⁸But if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. ⁹We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. ¹⁰The death he died, he died to sin, once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God. ¹¹So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus.

O truly blessed night to thee alone was vouchsafed the honour to know the season and the hour of Christ's Resurrection.

This is the night whereof Scripture saith: Behold the night is as clear as the day then shall my night be turned into day.

THE HOLINESS therefore of this wondrous night putteth to flight the deeds of darkness, cleanseth away sin, restoreth innocence to the fallen, and joy unto them that mourn; casteth out hatred, bringeth peace to all the world, and humbleth the power of the mighty.

O night truly blessèd, wherein the children of Israel were enriched, and Egypt was despoiled! Night wherein heaven and earth are joined, and we are restored to communion with God!

3rd READING: Psalm 136:1-9, 23-26

- I. Give thanks to the Lord, for he is gracious, for his mercy endures for ever.
- 2. Give thanks to the God of gods, for his mercy endures for ever.
- 3. Give thanks to the Lord of lords, for his mercy endures for ever.
- 4. Who alone does great wonders, for his mercy endures for ever.
- 5. Who by wisdom made the heavens, for his mercy endures for ever.
- 6. Who laid out the earth upon the waters, for his mercy endures for ever.
- 7. Who made the great lights, for his mercy endures for ever.

May it continue to burn brightly and scatter all the darkness of this night: may it shine among the lights with which thou hast adorned the heavens; And let the Day Star when it riseth still find it burning; that Day Star which having risen knoweth no going down: Even Christ our Lord who rising from the grave casteth the bright beams of his light over all the human race.

THROUGH the same Jesus Christ, our Mediator and Redeemer, Who liveth and reigneth with Thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, ever one God, now and for ever and world without end.

THE GOSPEL READING: Luke 24:1-12

When the Gospel is announced the reader says Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke. Glory to you, O Lord.

On the first day of the week, at early dawn, the women who had accompanied Jesus came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. ²They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, ³but when they went in they did not find the body. While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. ⁵The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground but the men said to them, 'Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. ⁶Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, ⁷that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and be crucified, and on the third day rise again.' 8Then they remembered Jesus' words, 9and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. ¹⁰Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. 11But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. 12But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened.
