We all love a Royal Wedding-the pageantry and wedding paraphernalia that accompanies the ceremony. Those of us who are or have been married will also remember the decisions made in planning.

Today's gospel story from Matthew talks about a Royal Wedding Banquet. All extensive preparations had been made and the invitations sent. But, whoops! Those invited would not come. The father sent his servants to enquire why. Apparently, they were all too busy getting on with their lives and seized and killed the servants.

The king sent out more servants and with a mandate to invite all they could find both good' and 'bad'. Whoops, again! One of these guests was not dressed befitting a wedding garment and the king threw him out.

What do you make of this parable? Notice that the parable is addressed to the Jewish religious leaders. God had been faithful throughout their history. The killing of the servants alludes to the killing of the prophets. Yes, a faithful remnant of Israel existed. With the coming of his son Jesus, God again demonstrates his faithfulness and gift of wholeness (salvation) of the kingdom; but this time there are no barriers to whom that gift is given-it is for everyone.

Sadly, this storyline has taken a turn this week in the conflict raging between Israel and the Palestinians. Whilst judgement lies with all who kill and maim other human beings, both the 'few' and the 'many' remain God's concern. The kingdom is built on being clothed with the wedding garment of peace, humility, powerlessness, compassion and above all costly love. We pray earnestly for all caught up in these hostilities, and for a cessation of these hostilities.

The parable of the marriage feast, which emphasizes the importance of responding to God's invitation to be part of his kingdom.

Once more Jesus spoke to the chief priests and Pharisees in parables, saying: 2 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding banquet for his son. 3 He sent his slaves to call those who had been invited to the wedding banquet, but they would not come. ⁴ Again he sent other slaves, saying, "Tell those who have been invited: Look, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready; come to the wedding banquet." 5 But they made light of it and went away, one to his farm, another to his business, 6 while the rest seized his slaves, maltreated them, and killed them. ⁷ The king was enraged. He sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. 8 Then he said to his slaves, "The wedding is ready, but those invited were not worthy. 9 Go therefore into the main streets, and invite everyone you find to the wedding banquet." 10 Those slaves went out into the streets and gathered all whom they found, both good and bad; so the wedding hall was filled with guests. 11 But when the king came in to see the guests, he noticed a man there who was not wearing a wedding robe, 12 and he said to him, "Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding robe?" And he was speechless. 13 Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot, and throw him into the outer darkness, where there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth." 14 For many are called, but few are chosen.'

Reflection

During Jesus Christ's ministry here on Earth he had many followers who loved him and his teaching. However there were those who had contempt for him, questioning him and asking under whose authority was he preaching. The four Gospels often mention the hostility directed at Jesus by members of the priesthood. We ask ,who were they, and what part did they play in the running of the Temple and Synagogues?

Firstly there were three groups, the Sadducees were motivated by wealth and power, they were traditionists and only depended on the written laws to make decisions and to discipline their fellow Jews. They accepted only the words from the Pentateuch (the first five books of the Bible) and rejected all ideas of resurrection after death.

The Pharisees were more in step with the spiritism of Judaism and believed that our actions on Earth affected our life after death, they were believers of resurrection after death - very similar to our own Christian faith. The Pharisees spent a lot of time updating laws such as Sabbeth day—observance, tithing and ritual cleaniness. Although Jesus often criticised the Pharisees for their pious actions, he did have friends among them who became Christians.

Then there were the Scribes, they were students of law whose job it was to pass on their knowledge of the scriptures and the law . They were able to draft legal documents for marriages, loans, inheritance, mortgages etc. They were mainly associated with the running of the Temple with the high priests. Here we have the background against which Jesus worked, constantly being questioned and opposed by these religious officials.
