ALL SOULS' DAY - SERVICES OF THANKSGIVING FOR THOSE WHO HAVE DIED: Each year the Church remembers those we love who have died. Reflection

The situation in Israel and Gaza dominates our news and is very depressing. Before the troubles erupted our last curate, Tom Burden, had decided his new direction would be to lead the Anglican International School in Jerusalem. So it was very moving, to hear a message, read out at the Morning service in Hyde, from Tom who has only recently returned to Jerusalem. He returned to that city at a time when many Westerners are fleeing. Of course it is very challenging for him but he retains his sense of humour. We learned he was missing the delicious cakes that Heather bakes for our coffee time after services!

Looking on the internet I found the school website and was struck by the following extract from Tom's statement about the school:-

"We believe that each child is precious in the sight of God, therefore we are committed to the advancement of education to children from all faiths and none, and every background to promote a culture of respectful coexistence. We have students from many ethnic backgrounds and cultures representing the world in every way.....

....Please take the time to explore more of the information we provide and discover more about our extraordinary School which brings together Arab and Jew, Christian and Muslim; a School where students discover what they have in common and begin their journey to a better future".

Please continue to pray for Tom as he leads his school through these turbulent times.
