# 5<sup>th</sup> November 2023 - 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday before Advent

In this season of 'remembering' on Monday the Church remembers and commemorates the life of William Temple.

I think we have much to thank William Temple for, William became Archbishop of Canterbury in 1942 and spent his life trying to link Christian Theological concerns to everyday life, whilst also trying to connect the Church to wider society.

William was the son of an Archbishop of Canterbury, born in 1881, in Exeter, he had a traditional education, became a headmaster, a lecturer and served as a parish priest from 1914-1917. One of his passions was to improve the social conditions for workers. He also worked to improve ecumenical connections between people of differing faiths.

He was a scholar who acted out his faith by trying to improve the lot of poor people, standing up to governments at home or abroad. Some of his theological views prevented his ordination to the diaconate at his first attempt in 1906 but in 1908 the then Archbishop of Canterbury made him a deacon.

William became the first president of the newly formed Workers' Educational Association which sought to provide the best educational opportunities available for all.

As Bishop of Manchester, he was instrumental in founded the separate Diocese of Blackburn believing the Manchester Diocese to be over large.

Although William Temple was only Archbishop of Canterbury for just over 2 years, his life's work on equality, justice, inclusion and ecumenical working together can be seen in many spheres of our everyday life, not least in the creation of the British Welfare State.

Truly I tell you, not one stone will be left here upon another; all will be thrown down.'3 When he was sitting on the Mount of Olives, the disciples came to him privately, saying, 'Tell us, when will this be, and what will be the sign of your coming and of the end of the age?" Remember those who flew from our Parish - At Ibsley, a wartime airfield was created in WWII. Volunteers from foreign air-forces, joined with 'Brits' in flying from there.
