COLLECT:

Almighty God, as your kingdom dawns, turn us from the darkness of sin to the light of holiness, that we may be ready to meet you in our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

PSALM 80:1-8 18-20

- Hear, O Shepherd of Israel,
 You that led Joseph like a flock;
- 2. Shine forth, you that are enthroned upon the cherubim, Before Ephraim, Benjamin and Manasseh.

Isaiah 64:1-9

Isaiah, writing during the Exile, acknowledges the people's guilt, and pleads for God's mercy.

O that you would tear open the heavens and come down, so that the mountains would quake at your presence - 2as when fire kindles brushwood and the fire causes water to boil - to make your name known to your adversaries, so that the nations might tremble at your presence! ³When you did awesome deeds that we did not expect, you came down, the mountains quaked at your presence. From ages past no one has heard, no ear has perceived, no eye has seen any God besides you, who works for those who wait for him. 5You meet those who gladly do right, those who remember you in your ways. But you were angry, and we sinned; because you hid yourself we transgressed. 6We have all become like one who is unclean, and all our righteous deeds are like a filthy cloth. We all fade like a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, take us away. ⁷There is no one who calls on your name, or attempts to take hold of you; for you have hidden your face from us, and have delivered us into the hand of our iniquity. 8Yet, O LORD, you are our Father; we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand. ⁹Do not be exceedingly angry, O LORD, and do not remember iniquity for ever. Now consider, we are all your people.

Mark 13:24-37

A warning of coming judgment, and encouragement to keep alert.

Jesus said to his disciples: ²⁴'In those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, ²⁵and the stars will be falling from

heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken.26 Then they will see "the Son of Man coming in clouds" with great power and glory. 27 Then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven.²⁸ From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. ²⁹So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. 30 Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. 31 Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. 32'But about that day or hour no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. 33 Beware, keep alert; for you do not know when the time will come. 34lt is like a man going on a journey, when he leaves home and puts his slaves in charge, each with his work, and commands the doorkeeper to be on the watch. 35Therefore, keep awake - for you do not know when the master of the house will come, in the evening, or at midnight, or at cockcrow, or at dawn, 36 or else he may find you asleep when he comes suddenly. ³⁷And what I say to you, I say to all: Keep awake.'

Church Wardens' News

I'm feeling quite conflicted at the moment. I am a staunch supporter of the Common Mission Fund. This is the sum of money collected right across the diocese which pays for our clergy, their houses, training and towards their pensions. They give their lives to us so I firmly believe we should make those payments, Yet the Local Church Area of Fordingbridge has just had to apply for a £35,000 reduction in the amount we were asked to contribute for 2024 because we just don't have the money. So along with the LCC I shall be looking at all sorts of ways to plug that gap so that we can make our full contribution again. And whilst not all LCAs have had to ask for a reduction, none of the parish finances are feeling very healthy right now.

What we all choose to give is a very personal matter and for some times are hard, but I wonder if I can encourage everyone to consider what you offer each week or month to whichever Local Church Area you are most attached to in readiness for us to begin our next chapter with our new vicar allowing him and us to concentrate on our mission and purpose rather than worrying if we can keep the lights on. God gives us so much, let's all try to do the right thing with what we have.
