Today we recall the prophets and especially Isaiah and John, called The Baptist. John called out to those in the desert areas make a straight road for the Lord! As the Exile comes to an end, Isaiah speaks of God coming to save his people.

Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. ² Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the LORD's hand double for all her sins. ³ A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD, make straight in the desert a highway for our God. ⁴ Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. ⁵ Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.' 6 A voice says, 'Cry out!' And I said, 'What shall I cry?' Reflection

In 1863 five men from Geneva in Switzerland set up an international committee for relief to the wounded, later to be known as The Red Cross. This all came about by a young man named Henry Dunant when he witnessed a bloody battle in Solferino in Italy. On the battlefield 40,000 men lay dying or wounded desperate for medical attention. There was none. Dunant was appalled, he quickly set about helping the wounded, directing local volunteers to dress their wounds and comfort them. After this initial encounter Dunant then turned his attention to creating 'Relief Societies' whose object it was in time of war and conflict, was to have the wounded cared for by devoted volunteers, fully qualified for the task.

By 1863 Henry Dunant had achieved his objectives with the emblem of a red cross against a white back ground and within a year twelve countries had adopted the Geneva Convention which was a giant step forward. People administering care were regarded as neutral on the battlefield, and were not to be targeted by the opposing forces.

The charity has become indispensable in times of conflict and provided humanitarian aid to many parts of the world. Ever careful not to take sides The Red Cross has built a non partisan reputation which allows entry into countries, prisons, and camps denied by other organisations.
