## 17<sup>th</sup> December 2023 - 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent

One of the things about prophets like John the Baptist, is that they bring us up with a jolt. Their message is often uncomfortable to hear because they confront us with something about ourselves and others, which nudges us to question our faith and belief.

Sydney Carter, an American poet, and song-writer from the sixties, was such a man. In this song he challenges us to think again what this great event of Christmas means for you and me in the ordinariness of our daily lives.

"Your holy hearsay is not evidence. Give me the good news in the present tense. What happened 1900 years ago, may not have happened. How am I to know?

The living truth is what I long to see. I cannot hang upon what used to be. So shut your Bibles up and show me how the Christ you talk about is living now."

John the Baptist's message is quite clear-get rid of all distractions, all that blinds the view of God- 'make straight his path'. May I humbly suggest that sometimes the sugary and sentimental way we portray the Christmas Story, is a distraction from a much harder reality, it can be a hindrance to people seeing God. Some of our best loved Christmas Carols don't help either! John the Baptist and Sydney Carter both challenge me to get real, get human, get stuck in to the mess of our human lot-in a world in which God chooses to reveal the mystery of presence as a vulnerable child called Jesus. Perhaps when we see images of vulnerable children on our TV screens, let us remind ourselves that we are seeing God in Christ before our very eyes!

# Readings for this Week: 17<sup>th</sup> December 2023 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of Advent

## COLLECT:

God for whom we watch and wait, you sent John the Baptist to prepare the way of your Son: give us courage to speak the truth, to hunger for justice, and to suffer for the cause of right, with Jesus Christ our Lord. AMEN.

#### **PSALM 126**

- 1. When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, then were we like those who dream.
- 2. Then was our mouth filled with laughter and our tongue with songs of joy.
- Then said they among the nations,
  'The Lord has done great things for them.'
- 4. The Lord has indeed done great things for us, and therefore we rejoiced.
- 5. Restore again our fortunes, O Lord, as the river beds of the desert.
- 6. Those who sow in tears shall reap with songs of joy.
- 7. Those who go out weeping, bearing the seed, will come back with shouts of joy, bearing their sheaves with them.

#### A Reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah

Isaiah 61:1-4,8-11

# Isaiah, in words that Jesus will quote later, speaks of being empowered by God to proclaim salvation.

The servant of the Lord said: 1 The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; he has sent me to bring good news to the oppressed, to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and release to the prisoners; <sup>2</sup> to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all who mourn; <sup>3</sup> to provide for those who mourn in Zion - to give them a garland instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, the mantle of praise instead of a faint spirit. They will be called oaks of righteousness, the planting of the Lord, to display his glory. <sup>4</sup> They shall build up the ancient ruins, they shall raise up the former devastations; they shall repair the ruined cities, the devastations of many generations. <sup>8</sup> For I the Lord love justice, I hate robbery and wrongdoing; I will faithfully give them their recompense, and I will make an everlasting covenant with them. <sup>9</sup> Their descendants shall be known among the nations, and their offspring among the peoples; all who see them shall acknowledge that they are a people whom the Lord has blessed. <sup>10</sup> I will greatly rejoice in the Lord, my whole being shall exult in my God; for he has clothed me with the garments of salvation, he has covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decks himself with a garland, and as a bride adorns herself with her jewels. <sup>11</sup> For as the earth brings forth its shoots, and as a garden causes what is sown in it to spring up, so the Lord God will cause righteousness and praise to spring up before all the nations.

At the end, the Reader says: This is the word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God** 

#### THE GOSPEL READING

Please stand and turn to face the Gospel Reader When the Gospel is announced, the Reader says: Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John Glory to you, O Lord. (Glory be to thee, O Lord.) John the Baptist points to the one who will follow him.

<sup>6</sup> There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. <sup>7</sup> He came as a witness to testify to the light, so that all might believe through him. <sup>8</sup> He himself was not the light, but he came to testify to the light. <sup>19</sup> This is the testimony given by John when the Jews sent priests and Levites from Jerusalem to ask him, 'Who are you?' <sup>20</sup> He confessed and did not deny it, but confessed, 'I am not the Messiah.' <sup>21</sup> And they asked him, 'What then? Are you Elijah?' He said, 'I am not.' 'Are you the prophet?' He answered, 'No.' <sup>22</sup> Then they said to him, 'Who are you? Let us have an answer for those who sent us.What do you say about yourself?' <sup>23</sup> He said, 'I am the voice of one crying out in the wilderness, "Make straight the way of the Lord,'" as the prophet Isaiah said. <sup>24</sup> Now they had been sent from the Pharisees. <sup>25</sup> They asked him, 'Why then are you baptizing if you are neither the Messiah, nor Elijah, nor the prophet?' <sup>26</sup> John answered them, 'I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, <sup>27</sup> the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal.' <sup>28</sup> This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing.

## Reflection

Each year we celebrate the season of Advent in the weeks leading up to Christmas. We read the words of the prophets, and put ourselves back in that time and place of watching and waiting for the Saviour of the world, expectant and hopeful.

However, it seems that the prospect of Christmas quickly overshadows the season of Advent. Today is the third Sunday of Advent, but is dominated by Carol Services, thoughts, and plans for Christmas. Next Sunday, the final Sunday of Advent is Christmas Eve, when we will all be preparing for Christmas Day. It is as if we have lost at least two Sundays of this precious and penitential season, and the opportunity to reflect quietly and humbly on the gift that we will receive at Christmas in Jesus Christ.

This year, it is difficult to think of Christmas as a peaceful, happy time, with all the troubles in the world but especially in Israel and Gaza, the very place where our Christmas stories are set. So, what as Christians can we do this Christmas? The final verse of the carol '*In the bleak mid-winter*' gives us good advice.
