The writer describes the work of Jesus in terms of High-Priestly sacrifice.

¹⁴ Since the children share flesh and blood, Jesus himself likewise shared the same things, so that through death he might destroy the one who has the power of death, that is, the devil, ¹⁵ and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by the fear of death. ¹⁶ For it is clear that he did not come to help angels, but the descendants of Abraham. ¹⁷ Therefore he had to become like his brothers and sisters in every respect, so that he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make a sacrifice of atonement for the sins of the people. ¹⁸ Because he himself was tested by what he suffered, he is able to help those who are being tested.

THE GOSPEL READING

Please stand and turn to face the Gospel Reader
When the Gospel is announced, the Reader says:
Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke
Glory to you, O Lord.

(Glory be to thee, O Lord.)

Luke 2:22-40

Jesus, six weeks old, taken to the Temple is recognised as the one who will bring salvation to Jews and Gentiles.

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord ²³ (as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord'), ²⁴ and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons.' ²⁵ Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. ²⁶ It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. ²⁷ Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law,

During the Gospel: Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying...

Lord now you let your servant go in peace: your word has been fulfilled My own eyes have seen the salvation: which you have prepared in the sight of every people; a light to reveal you to the nations: and the glory of your people Israel....

(The Nunc Dimittis)

³³ And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. ³⁴ Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed ³⁵ so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed - and a sword will pierce your own soul too.' ³⁶ There was also a prophet, Anna the daughter of Phanuel, of the tribe of Asher. She was of a great age, having lived with her husband seven years after her marriage, ³⁷ then as a widow to the age of eighty-four. She never left the temple but worshipped there with fasting and prayer night and day. ³⁸ At that moment she came, and began to praise God and to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem. ³⁹ When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. ⁴⁰ The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.

Reflection

This issue of partners is dated January 28th. On February 28th our new Rector will be inducted, and the difficult vacancy period will be over. I have not yet met Luke and I am very much looking forward to meeting him. When I do, I must avoid bombarding him with my personal agenda of things which I feel our parish needs from him. He will need time to see for himself what we do and draw his own conclusions from what he sees.

Sadly, most of the topics discussed at the various meetings that take place across our parish, and most of the time and energy given by the people attending those meetings on your behalf, is taken up by worrying about money and maintenance of the buildings. Ideally, we should keep these worries and the time taken up by them away from Luke, He can then concentrate on the discipleship needed to spread the word of Christ and the good news it brings in our community; at the same time providing the comfort, guidance, and care that a priest should have time to give to those who need it.

We must demonstrate to Luke that he can trust us to deal with the mundane but vital tasks with his guidance and advice available when we need it. We must also give him and his family a warm welcome and be ready to give him help guidance and advice when he asks for it.

The vacancy has been long and came at a very bad time when the individual parishes were struggling with the inevitable difficulties caused by the process of joining together in a single parish. Those difficulties have now largely been resolved. With Luke's leadership and our hard work, we can go forward with the renewed enthusiasm needed to bring new people into our churches, at the same time catering for the different needs of each of our existing congregations.

Thank God for bringing Luke and Sarah to us.
