Reflection

With the death of Judas Iscariot the remaining eleven apostles decided to fill the position that was vacant. There were two candidates, Matthias and Joseph who was also known as Barsabbas. Both were known to the apostles having worked with John the Baptist and being part of the outer circle of disciples.

On the day of the assignment Simon Peter read two passages from The Psalms, one as follows "Let another take over his charge". They all then knelt down in prayer asking for guidance and finally drew lots. The lot came to Matthias who accepted the position. Some historians have criticized his appointment saying that they should have waited for Paul to join them, also that Matthias was not mentioned again in the Bible, But many were not mentioned but only the once, besides Paul was his own man, he created and coped with his own affairs, his travel, letters, and his opinions speak for themselves.

After receiving the Holy Spirit at Pentecost the apostles dispersed, each travelling to different countries preaching the gospel and baptising. Matthias travelled to Judea, the Caspian sea and to Turkey where he lost his life. There is more than one account of his death, one says that he was crucified, another says that he was stoned and beheaded, but according to a Roman official he died in Jerusalem. It is claimed that his remains are buried at St Matthias Benedictine Abbey in a town named Tier in West Germany. However another story tells that St. Helena mother of the Roman Emperor Constantine the Great transported his remains from Jerusalem to Rome. We shall never be certain of the Truth.
