11th February 2024 - The Sunday Next Before Lent

The late Ian Ramsay, Bishop of Durham tells the lovely story of a man when passing a fish and chip shop, takes in the smell, the busyness of the people waiting in the queue for their supper, and the crackling frying noises, and is momentarily struck by a sense of something/someone beyond himself and his surroundings. What the Bishop calls 'a disclosure situation'. We might say he had an 'aha' moment or a 'wow' moment. In the mystery of that moment our man catches but a glimpse of 'otherness', the mystery of God.

For it is in the ordinariness of life that God is to be found-yes, even in fish and chip shops!

Mark in his economic account of what we call the Transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain, God discloses himself through the figure of Jesus to the three disciples Peter, James and John. Mark records-'his clothes became dazzling white' (a reflection of divine glory); and 'there appeared to them Elijah and Moses', two significant characters from the Old Testament story maybe representing the law (Moses) and the prophets (Elijah).

Of course, Mark's gospel was written after the resurrection so reflects the view that Jesus is God's son in the sense of a oneness with God.

For the three disciples it is a moment to be savoured, indeed captured in the desire to build three shelters, to somehow capture the experience. I guess if they had had mobile phones they would have clicked away!

The good news for us is that glimpses of the divine are to be found anywhere. God is disclosed where love, truth, beauty, suffering, justice and horror abound. Jean-Pierre de Caussade, a 17th century French Jesuit priest counsels, 'We can find all that is necessary in the present moment.'

Can we wholly be present to catch a glimpse of the divine in our midst!
