#### PSALM 19

- I. The heavens are telling the glory of God and the firmament proclaims his handiwork.
- 2. One day pours out its song to another and one night unfolds knowledge to another.
- 3. They have neither speech nor language and their voices are not heard,
- 4. Yet their sound has gone out into all lands and their words to the ends of the world.
- 5. In them has he set a tabernacle for the sun, that comes forth as a bridegroom out of his chamber and rejoices as a champion to run his course.
- 6. It goes forth from the end of the heavens and runs to the very end again, and there is nothing hidden from its heat.

I Corinthians 1:18-25

<sup>18</sup>For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. <sup>19</sup>For it is written, "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and the discernment of the discerning I will thwart." <sup>20</sup>Where is the one who is wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the debater of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? <sup>21</sup>For since, in the wisdom of God, the world did not know God through wisdom, God decided, through the foolishness of our proclamation, to save those who believe. <sup>22</sup>For Jews demand signs and Greeks desire wisdom, <sup>23</sup>but we proclaim Christ crucified, a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, <sup>24</sup>but to those who are the called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. <sup>25</sup>For God's foolishness is wiser than human wisdom, and God's weakness is stronger than human strength.

The window in the North Chapel at St Mary's Fordingbridge will have the large panels removed during March 11<sup>th</sup> to March 13<sup>th</sup> inclusive for the stained glass to be re-leaded. This is necessary because when the window was made in the 1950s a composite material was used instead of lead and this window, along with many others in churches all over Britain are in danger of collapse because the composite material has deteriorated. Our window will be with Salisbury Cathedral Glass for approximately 10 weeks before it is replaced. The window will be made weatherproof during that time. Nigel Spratt

#### WOMENS WORLD DAY OF PRAYER - FRIDAY 1st MARCH 2024
