Mother's Day and Mothering Sunday

'Woman, here is your son' and, to the beloved disciple 'here is your mother'

The appalling events in Gaza and Israel remind all too clearly of what breaks human communities. Hostility and accusation lead to rejection and expulsion. On route to the cross Jesus has seen the disintegration of the little community of his followers. Peter has denied him, Judas has betrayed him, and most have simply fled and forsaken him. Jesus has taken upon himself all the hostility and accusations which human beings are so capable of. But in this darkest hour something remarkable happens and it is the birth of a new community formed at the foot of the cross.

Mary is called Woman -the new eve, the mother of a new humanity, the mother of all who live by faith. The disciple loved by God and, who loves God, is born of God and becomes a son. In this small cameo we see the birth of the church. Here is our family, our mother and our brother.

On Mothering Sunday we rightly honour our mothers but we also celebrate the wider family of the church to which we belong and in which all are our sisters and brothers. This is the family that can only be formed at the foot of the cross where, in the words of the writer and theologian James Alison, 'God is among us as one who is cast out.'

The window in the North Chapel at St Mary's Fordingbridge will have the large panels removed during March 11th to March 13th inclusive for the stained glass to be re-leaded. This is necessary because when the window was made in the 1950s a composite material was used instead of lead and this window, along with many others in churches all over Britain are in danger of collapse because the composite

material has deteriorated. Our window will be with Salisbury Cathedral Glass for approximately 10 weeks before it is replaced. The window will be made weather-proof during that time. Nigel Spratt
