17th March 2024 - Passion Sunday (Lent 5)

Today, the fifth Sunday of Lent is Passion Sunday, and marks the beginning of Passiontide, the final part of Lent. It signals the movement towards Holy Week, a time when Christians take part in God's Passion, Jesus's journey to Jerusalem, His last days with His friends and then His death on the cross. 'Passion' is derived from the Latin word meaning 'to suffer' and it is the time when our focus is on the physical, mental and spiritual torments that Jesus endured for us in his final days.

Passiontide is possibly the most holy and solemn of all our Christian Festivals. It can seem to be a time of darkness and despair. However, the gospel story is the good news that offers shards of light in the darkness. We are an Easter People, even if at the moment it feels that is a long way off. Hope is at the centre of the Christian faith, the enduring knowledge of a God of Love who makes things right.

Some of the Church's most beautiful hymns are sung during Passiontide. These hymns are also food for reflection and contemplation when read slowly. The well-known verse from the hymn 'O sacred head surrounded' serves this purpose

In this thy bitter Passion,
Good Shepherd, think of me.
With thy most sweet compassion,
Unworthy though I be.
Beneath thy Cross abiding
Forever would I rest,
In thy dear love confiding,
And with thy presence blest.

May the presence of the risen Jesus, his body once broken and now made whole, bring peace and healing always. St Mary's

This is a very lovely service which celebrates the Last Supper that Jesus had with His disciples. It is an adaptation of a fourth century service. It begins with a simple supper and we share communion as we hear the story of the passion and one by one the candles are extinguished. The growing darkness represents Jesus' last hours. Then at the end, after a period of silence we light a single candle as a symbol of the resurrection.
