## **Palm Sunday**

All four of the gospels tell the great story of Palm Sunday. It is a story of Jesus sending two men to find the colt of a donkey, never ridden by humans, and bringing him to Jesus. They went

and found the colt and brought it to Jesus. He rode into Jerusalem, and the people went wild, throwing cloaks onto the road, cutting palm branches, and casting them, shouting



out, and ever getting louder, "Blessed is he who comes as king in the name of the Lord! Peace in heaven, glory in the highest heaven". At the temple he went in and drove the traders out. "Scripture says, My house shall be made a house of prayer; but you have made it a bandits' cave".

What a day of marvels to start Holy Week. I often wonder what it should have felt like to join the people who were coming with Jesus, shouting and hollering, praising God, and his Son, Jesus. Holy Week starts, and by the sixth day from now, we could well have been amongst those who had changed and were calling for his death. It is very strange how this happens, how we allow it. Today in this year 2024, we pray that we will not be amongst those who celebrate his coming, and then 6 days later, are calling for his death. We need to celebrate his coming on Palm Sunday and may we be amongst those who celebrate him on **Easter Day.**

#### **COLLECT:**

True and humble king, hailed by the crowd as Messiah: grant us the faith to know you and love you, that we may be found beside you on the way of the cross, which is the path of glory.

- Have mercy on me, Lord, for I am in trouble; 9. My eye is consumed with sorrow, my soul and my body also.
- 10. For my life is wasted with grief, and my years with sighing; My strength fails me because of my affliction, and my bones are consumed.
- II. I have become a reproach to all my enemies and even to my neighbours, an object of dread to my acquaintances; When they see me in the street they flee from me.
- 12. I am forgotten like one that is dead, out of mind; I have become like a broken vessel.

<sup>1</sup> When Jesus and his disciples were approaching Jerusalem, at Bethphage and Bethany, near the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of his disciples and said to them, <sup>2</sup> 'Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately as you enter it, you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden; until it and bring it. 3 If anyone says to you, "Why are you doing this?" just say this, "The Lord needs it and will send it back here immediately". 4 They went away and found a colt tied near a door, outside in the street. As they were untying it, 5 some of the bystanders said to them, 'What are you doing, untying the colt?' 6 They told them what Jesus had said; and they allowed them to take it. 7 Then they brought the colt to Jesus and threw their cloaks on it; and he sat on it. 8 Many people spread their cloaks on the road, and others spread leafy branches that they had cut in the fields. 9 Then those who went ahead and those who followed were shouting, 'Hosanna! Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord! 10 Blessed is the coming kingdom of our ancestor David! Hosanna in the highest heaven!' I Then he entered Jerusalem and went into the temple; and when he had looked around at everything, as it was already late, he went out to Bethany with the twelve.

# Reflection

Not so long ago, Janet and I had a long-standing problem involving a family member which was causing us a great deal of worry and stress. One Sunday morning after the service, a lady known to you all, with great perception, asked us how we were, and we opened up to her. She said shall we pray? And took us to the North Chapel where we prayed together. After a very short time, to our surprise the problem was resolved in a wonderful way that we could not have foreseen.

A cynic would say that was coincidence, and to be honest, at one point in my life, that cynic would have been me. However, that experience hit home to me, and since then there have been other examples of my prayers for other people being answered. – The power of prayer.

I am no longer cynical about it, but I believe the power is not in the prayer, it is with the God to whom we pray. He has the wisdom to use that power in ways we do not understand, and not all our prayers are answered in the way we hope.

If you come to church on Sunday to hear the Passion of Christ being read, you will hear Jesus' cry "Why hast thou forsaken me?" He came to us in human form, and he must have prayed for the pain and suffering to end before he breathed his last breath. His prayers could not be answered, he could not be taken down from the cross. He had to endure the pain and suffering for us. His death and resurrection, had to happen for us to have the right relationship with God whose forgiveness was made once and for all through the death of His son Jesus Christ.
