I wonder if, like us, you find it all too easy to "drop off" during the day, yet wake during the night, yes, for a wander to the bathroom, but then a time awake thinking of things that have happened, things to be done, and "things" getting all out of proportion?

Jesus fell asleep in the back of the boat, the disciples slept in the garden as Jesus was betrayed, and Eutichus fell asleep during a sermon (that surely could not happen today?!). We all need to be refreshed and renewed by sleep, but what of those waking hours? What do you do?

It's just as well that God is awake and ready 24/7 to hear us, and speak with us, as our loving heavenly Father. So, in the dark reaches of the night, we can open our hearts and minds to Him in prayer, bringing our hopes and fears, family and friends to a Father who is concerned to hear and answer. How does He answer? I believe it can be a great help if we pray a well-known prayer – the Lord's Prayer, a familiar collect or blessing, recall a verse, passage of scripture – a psalm, 23, 121, 139 perhaps. It's so important to try to memorise such verses for times such as this, when we can be encouraged in the dark hours. Many testify as to how God reminds them of a promise or word of encouragement from scripture, just at the time they need it. Perhaps keep a book of prayers or Bible readings beside the bed, even if you peacefully fall asleep – with the light still on!

Praise and thank God that He is there, is awake and ready to reassure you of His presence at all hours of the day and night. Sleep well!

⁵ The Jewish rulers, elders, and scribes assembled in Jerusalem, ⁶ with Annas the high priest, Caiaphas, John, and Alexander, and all who were of the high-priestly family. ⁷ When they had made the prisoners stand in their midst, they inquired, 'By what power or by what name did you do this?' ⁸ Then Peter, filled with the Holy Spirit, said to them, 'Rulers of the people and elders, ⁹ if we are questioned today because of a good deed done to someone who was sick and are asked how this man has been healed, ¹⁰ let it be known to all of you, and to all the people of Israel, that this man is standing before you in good health by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead. ¹¹ This Jesus is "the stone that was rejected by you, the builders; it has become the cornerstone." ¹² There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved.

John 10:11-18

Jesus the Good Shepherd willing to lay down his life.

Jesus said to the Pharisees: ¹¹ 'I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹² The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away - and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³ The hired hand runs away - because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. ¹⁴ I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, ¹⁵ just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶ I have other

sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. ¹⁷ For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. ¹⁸ No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father.'

To follow our readings in church over the last few weeks, a poem written by Amy Robinson:
