28th April 2024 - 5th Sunday of Easter

I was driving back from Gatwick just last week and, as Sarah and I drove south we saw the spring lambs in fields and, as I reflected upon that today I was reminded of the words of Jesus in John chapter 10 where he reflects upon a similar image from his day.

Firstly, Jesus reflects upon the image of a sheepfold and says of himself, "I am the gate for the sheep," (John 10v7). That is, he is the one who 'opens the door of heaven' for you and for me. What a wonderful truth that is. As a vicar I have done hundreds of funerals over the years, and visited countless people in hospital as the end of their life approaches. In all such cases I have sought to bring Christ's comfort to the dying, and his comfort to their relatives. It is a great privilege to do so. Wonderfully, as Christians, death is nothing to fear, rather it is a gateway to an eternity of blessings with God. And Jesus is the gate; he opens that gateway for us.

Jesus then goes on to change his imagery and states in verse 14, "I am the good shepherd." Like a shepherd caring for his sheep Jesus is the one who knows us, who loves us and who cares for us throughout this life and, when the time is right, into the next. Jesus is indeed the good shepherd and we can entrust ourselves, and those whom we love, into his care, now and for eternity.

But Jesus then goes on to say in verse 15 that, like a good shepherd he 'lays down his life for the sheep.' Now, I suspect that only an exceptional shepherd would go that far to protect the sheep, but Jesus is, of course, exceptional. His love for us is so great that he did indeed lay down his life for us, as we celebrated on Good Friday.

So, perhaps as you enjoy the new life of Spring, and if you see the sheep and the lambs in the fields you might reflect upon these wonderful truths: Jesus is the gate for you and for me, and he is the Good Shepherd. We can therefore entrust ourselves and those whom we love to him, now and for eternity.

Philip baptises a Gentile, whose affirmation of faith is an early form of the creed.

²⁶ An angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.) ²⁷ So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to

worship 28 and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. 29 Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.' 30 So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' 31 He replied, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. 32 Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this: 'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. 33 In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth.' 34 The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?" 35 Then Philip starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good began to speak, and news about Jesus. 36 As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?' 38 He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. 39 When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more, and went on his way rejoicing. 40 But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea.

At the end, the Reader says: This is the word of the Lord.
