This week the readings are only going to Wednesday, when to our great astonishment the readings change. For on Thursday we reach one of the great festivals of the Christian church. Yet this is a day which we often forget. It is the festival of Ascension Day.

After the great festival of Easter, Jesus has risen and spends many days teaching and healing his people. He knows that the time is coming for him to leave the earth and take up his true home in heaven. He has told his disciples that he will give them the Holy Spirit, to help and encourage them, and to be their comforter. What a wonderful gift. John 15:9-17

Jesus tells the disciples that the fruit of their relationship with him must be love.

Jesus said to his disciples: ⁹ 'As the Father has loved me, so I have loved you; abide in my love. ¹⁰ If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love. ¹¹ I have said these things to you so that my joy may be in you, and that your joy may be complete. ¹² This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. ¹³ No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. ¹⁴ You are my friends if you do what I command you. ¹⁵ I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father. ¹⁶ You did not choose me but I chose you. And I appointed you to go and bear fruit, fruit that will last, so that the Father will give you whatever you ask him in my name. ¹⁷ I am giving you these commands so that you may love one another.

Reflection

"Then he led them out as far as Bethany, and, lifting up his hands, he blessed them. While he was blessing them, he withdrew from them and was carried up into heaven. And they worshipped him, and returned to Jerusalem with great joy; and they were continually in the temple blessing God." Luke 24: 50-53.

Forty days after the Resurrection is Ascension Day; this year Thursday 9th May.

Rev. Richard Warren was largely instrumental in having Hyde Church built in the middle of the nineteenth century and it was dedicated to the Holy Ascension. Therefore, Ascension Day at Hyde is nearest thing we have to a Patronal Festival, so how appropriate that we should share this and welcome the whole parish. We hope to involve as many people as possible from all our churches.

While at the service take time to wonder at the stained glass window at the East end. This was donated by Rev. Richard Warren and is rather unique; along with Jesus being raised up to heaven there are angels and the apostles with Mathias who had not got his halo at this stage. Rather controversially when it was dedicated, in the centre is Mary Magdalen dressed in red.
