12th May 2024 - Sunday after the Ascension

This Sunday, the seventh Sunday of Easter and the Sunday after Ascension Day, our gospel reading taken from the Gospel of St. John, is a beautiful, inspiring prayer offered by Jesus for his disciples.

It is such a gift and blessing to be prayed for. I know that I personally appreciate anyone who offers to pray for me, and I consider it a privilege to remember people in my prayers too. Prayer is a remarkable gift, because it opens us up to God's promises, and invites Him to help us, and those for whom we are praying. Every prayer is heard by God, which means that every time we pray, or are prayed for, something quite wonderful happens.

However, sometimes when we pray, we may feel that we are praying alone. However, this is certainly not the case, as in monastic houses from ancient times and still today, prayers were and are said seven times daily, spread at roughly three-hourly intervals. This means that throughout the world, there must be someone praying during every minute of the day and night.

Prayer is how we actively practice believing, and it should never be the last resort of God's people, it should always be our first point of action. Throughout His life, we have so many accounts of Jesus praying, not forgetting that He taught us all how to pray with The Lord's Prayer.

During the days between Ascension Day and Pentecost we are encouraged to participate in the national and international prayer initiative — *Thy Kingdom Come*. This global ecumenical prayer movement invites Christians around the world to pray for more people to come to know Jesus. So please take this opportunity to join with thousands of Christians around the globe to light up the world in prayer.
