Father's Day ...

Not so well known and recognised as Mother's Day, or better still, Mothering Sunday, but we do well to spare a thought for fathers this week.

We've all had one, and are grateful. For some, memories are dark, of "distant" fathers, difficult fathers, fathers who bullied. But mostly we have good memories. Sometimes we wish we had communicated better, dialogued more — "I wish I had asked more about ... I wish I had been more grateful ... I miss the time spent together". Think about how we almost subconsciously learnt lessons in behaviour and obedience, surprised when attitudes were challenged — and yet grateful. In our senior years we notice how fathers behave today, how differently. With differences in age come judgements about words, attitudes and behaviour: "I wouldn't have said or done that ... are swear words learnt at school, or at home ...?" Is there some way we can encourage and support fathers, with practical help or a careful chat?

It makes our relationship with God all the more amazing, when His Son invites us to call His Father, "our Father"! Jesus taught us how to speak with His Father, and how to listen. He guides us about our daily walk with God (did we enjoy walks with our earthly father?). Are we grateful for every expression of His love for us – the beauty of His creation, His care and consideration for our well-being, health and friendships? He not only creates, but sustains and renews. When we are sick or injured, He renews and restores. When we are perplexed over decisions made or positions challenged (I have an election in mind!), do we seek His will and direction in our prayers? Are we grateful for His forgiveness?

So is Father's Day an occasion when we can review and renew our relationship with our heavenly Father, looking at our personal and corporate prayer life? In our requests, can we also be grateful? Can we carefully prepare for meeting with fathers who might be struggling today? To guide without judging?

May our heavenly Father lead us into a deeper relationship with Him, and a greater understanding of fathers who we might meet this week?

⁶So we are always confident; even though we know that while we are at home in the body we are away from the Lord—⁷ for we walk by faith, not by sight. ⁸Yes, we do have confidence, and we would rather be away from the body and at home with the Lord. So whether we are at home or away, we make it our aim to please him. 10 For all of us must appear before the judgement seat of Christ, so that each may receive recompense for what has been done in the body, whether good or evil. ¹⁴For the love of Christ urges us on, because we are convinced that one has died for all; therefore all have died. Is And he died for all, so that those who live might live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised for them. 16 From now on, therefore, we regard no one from a human point of view;* even though we once knew Christ from a human point of view, we know him no longer in that way. 17So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new! ¹⁸All this is from God, who reconciled us to himself through Christ, and has given us the ministry of reconciliation; ¹⁹that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself,* not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us. ²⁰So we are ambassadors for Christ, since God is making his appeal through us; we entreat you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. ²¹For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

THE GOSPEL READING

Please stand and turn to face the Gospel Reader When the Gospel is announced, the Reader says:

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark

Glory to you, O Lord.

Mark 4:1-20

Again he began to teach beside the lake. Such a very large crowd gathered around him that he got into a boat on the lake and sat there, while the whole crowd was beside the lake on the land. ²He began to teach them many things in parables, and in his teaching he said to them: ³'Listen! A sower went out to sow. ⁴And as he sowed, some seed fell on the path, and the birds came and ate it up. ⁵Other seed fell on rocky ground, where it did not have much soil, and it sprang up quickly, since it had no depth of soil. ⁶And when the sun rose, it was scorched; and since it had no root, it withered away. ⁷Other seed fell among thorns, and the thorns grew up and choked it, and it yielded no grain. ⁸Other seed fell into good soil and brought forth grain,

growing up and increasing and yielding thirty and sixty and a hundredfold.' And he said, 'Let anyone with ears to hear listen!' When he was alone, those who were around him along with the twelve asked him about the parables. 11 And he said to them, 'To you has been given the secret* of the kingdom of God, but for those outside, everything comes in parables; 12 in order that "they may indeed look, but not perceive, and may indeed listen, but not understand; so that they may not turn again and be forgiven." And he said to them, Do you not understand this parable? Then how will you understand all the parables? 14The sower sows the word. 15These are the ones on the path where the word is sown: when they hear, Satan immediately comes and takes away the word that is sown in them. 16 And these are the ones sown on rocky ground: when they hear the word, they immediately receive it with joy. 17 But they have no root, and endure only for a while; then, when trouble or persecution arises on account of the word, immediately they fall away.* 18 And others are those sown among the thorns: these are the ones who hear the word, 19 but the cares of the world, and the lure of wealth, and the desire for other things come in and choke the word, and it yields nothing. ²⁰And these are the ones sown on the good soil: they hear the word and accept it and bear fruit, thirty and sixty and a hundredfold.'

Reflection

This Sunday is Father's Day - something relatively new in our society in this country.

Whereas Mothering Sunday (often now called Mother's Day) has a clear tradition in this country linked to the people returning to their 'mother' church -the place they were baptised – and therefore often to reunite as families if working away, there is no such background to Father's Day. We appear to have just joined in a celebration of fathers which started 100 years or so ago in the USA.

If as a church we want to recognise Father's Day, what does this background mean to us? Whilst this day is an opportunity to engage with the society around us and the relationships they (perhaps some) will celebrate, we have to find a way to bring the good news about our God and the relationship he offers to us through Christ into this.

It seems to me that we can do so by reflecting on how God relationship with us as His adopted children, through Christ, is (or should be) so much greater and more complete that any earthly relationship.

The words of one song by Graham Kendrick which give us a glimpse of this:

O Father of the fatherless in whom all families are blessed, I love the way You father me. You gave me life, forgave the past; now in Your arms I'm safe at last – I love the way You father me.
