As we approach the time of 'mists and mellow fruitfulness' within the Benefice the first of our Harvest Thanksgiving Services begins this Sunday at St Boniface Church, Woodgreen. Others are not far ahead...

Some of us will sing the words of a traditional hymn 'Come ye thankful people, come' which includes the line **All is safely gathered in.** In this context of course, the words refer to the crops which we hope are gathered in by the farmers. But I would like us to use those words to consider who we might safely gather in, in our churches. Do we really gather safely people in? Historically, and sadly currently, churches have not been a safe space for many people, we are all to aware of the harm caused by some people to others in the church.

It's no accident, I think, that part of our church buildings is called the Sanctuary, usually the part closest to the altar.

As Christians we are called to welcome and **gather all people** into our churches, whoever they may be providing them with a safe place, a sanctuary from the world. Something that we are need sometimes...

A thought for us as we consider who we might accept into our sanctuaries, recognising that as the Psalmist says we are all wonderfully and fearfully made. How could we humans be any different, being made in God's image?

The Gospel message is one of God's love being freely given to us all, whatever shape, size, age, background, character we may be.

So, next Sunday, as we meet for our Benefice wide Service let's celebrate our diversity and the diversity of others, not seeking to change others but to offer respect and sanctuary to all.

COLLECT:

Gracious God, you call us to fullness of life: deliver us from unbelief and banish our anxieties with the liberating love of Jesus Christ our Lord. **AMEN.**

PSALM 39

- I I said, 'I will keep watch over my ways, so that I offend not with my tongue.
- 2 'I will guard my mouth with a muzzle, while the wicked are in my sight.'
- 3 So I held my tongue and said nothing; I kept silent but to no avail.
- 4 My distress increased, my heart grew hot within me; while I mused, the fire was kindled and I spoke out with my tongue:
- 5 'Lord, let me know my end and the number of my days, that I may know how short my time is.
- 6 'You have made my days but a handsbreadth, and my lifetime is as nothing in your sight; truly, even those who stand upright are but a breath.
- 7 'We walk about like a shadow and in vain we are in turmoil; we heap up riches and cannot tell who will gather them.
- 8 'And now, what is my hope? Truly my hope is even in you.
- 9 'Deliver me from all my transgressions and do not make me the taunt of the fool.'
- 10 I fell silent and did not open my mouth, for surely it was your doing.

- I Take away your plague from me;I am consumed by the blows of your hand.
- 12 With rebukes for sin you punish us; like a moth you consume our beauty; truly, everyone is but a breath.
- 13 Hear my prayer, O Lord, and give ear to my cry; hold not your peace at my tears.
- 14 For I am but a stranger with you, a wayfarer, as all my forebears were.
- 15 Turn your gaze from me, that I may be glad again, before I go my way and am no more.

A Reading from the book of Corinthians

II Corinthians 9: 1-14

Now it is not necessary for me to write to you about the ministry to the saints, ² for I know your eagerness, which is the subject of my boasting about you to the people of Macedonia, saying that Achaia has been ready since last year; and your zeal has stirred up most of them. ³But I am sending the brothers in order that our boasting about you may not prove to have been empty in this case, so that you may be ready, as I said you would be; otherwise, if some Macedonians come with me and find that you are not ready, we would be humiliated—to say nothing of you—in this undertaking. 5So I thought it necessary to urge the brothers to go on ahead to you, and arrange in advance for this bountiful gift that you have promised, so that it may be ready as a voluntary gift and not as an extortion. The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. ⁷Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 8And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work. As it is written, He scatters abroad, he gives to the poor; his righteousness endures for ever.'10He who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity, which will produce thanksgiving to God through us; 12 for the rendering of this ministry not only supplies the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God. 13 Through the testing of this ministry you glorify God by your obedience to the confession of the gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your sharing with them and with all others, ¹⁴while they long for you and pray for you because of the surpassing grace of God that he has given you.
