




Prizegiving Awards





Excellence in at least two curriculum areas, combined with at least three citations for diligence. Excellence citations are gained by being in the top 10 percent of students in that curriculum area. Diligence citations are based on the learning skills feedback throughout the year. All other junior students will receive their certificates later in the week.

Year 10 Excellence Award

Distinction or Excellence in at least three curriculum areas, combined with at least four citations for diligence. This reflects the greater number of subjects in Year 10.

Poutama Award

A motivational award involving three levels. To attain Poutama Kairangi, students must demonstrate excellent achievement and effort in Mathematics, Literacy, Science, and a performing art or sport, as well as completing voluntary community service and leading prayer in their classrooms.

Whanake Award

Builds upon the foundations of the Poutama award. Recipients of the Whanake Kairangi have demonstrated excellence in Mathematics and Reading, along with consistently applied learning skills, demonstrated our school values through active service, and have had an ongoing, active involvement in a performing art or sport. This award is the pinnacle of Year 9 achievement.

Raka me te ki (Lock and Key) Awards

Continues on from the Writer's Ribbon Awards of Year 8. They aim to foster a love of writing and the purposeful development of skills in our students.

Christine Davidson Cup for Commitment to Special Character

Awarded to a Junior student who by their actions has shown commitment to the special character of the college.

Year 10 Graduation

Recognises that the students are entering a new phase in their school life. Senior school ties are presented to the Junior Head Boy and Girl as a symbol of the new and exciting challenges that lie ahead.

Junior Principal's Awards

Based on the academic standard reached by the student in relation to their potential, reflect student's involvement in school life outside the classroom, along with the display of positive personal qualities and ROCK expectations.

ROCK Awards

Presented to two students at each level who have shown an understanding and application of ROCK expectations in all aspects of their school life.

The Duke of Edinburgh's Hillary Award

This international award programme provides a framework for personal discovery and growth through Service, Skills, Physical Recreation and Adventurous Journeys; developing perseverance and responsibility to self and to the community.

The Bronze Award is the motivational award for our Year 10 students and completed awards are presented at assemblies.

Silver Awards are the major leadership opportunity for Year 11 students. A special Mayoral Ceremony is held every year.

The completion of a Gold Award by a student is a major achievement and is acknowledged here at prize giving A formal presentation being made to these outstanding young people in due course.

Academic Excellence Awards

Are for students who have achieved at a very high level for their year level.

Subject Awards

Are made to the top students in their subjects.

Beryl Bartlett Awards

Given through the generosity of a bequest from Cora and Beryl Bartlett, which is used for the promotion of Music and Languages at St Peter's.

Library Awards

(Funded by the Alfred, Isabel and Marion Reed Trust) are for students who have served in the library. Excellence and Distinction badges are awarded for excellent and exemplary service over many years.

Year 13

Year 13 students receive a number of Special Awards and Scholarships, presented by the college, Universities and other organisations.

The Service Scholarship

Presented to a student who display the qualities associated with service - commitment to servant leadership, including taking an active role in social justice projects at St Peter's College.

Service to School Awards

Are made to students who have contributed a high level of service in a particular.

The Westpac Scholarship

Is awarded to a student who intends to study in a Business-related field at tertiary institution.

Board of Trustees and St Peter's College Trust Scholarships

Are for school leavers going on to tertiary study. The students should have a consistent record of service to the College and/or involvement in extra-curricular activities and should be considered persons likely to uphold the ideals and values espoused by the College.

Parent, Teachers and Friends Association (PTFA) Scholarships

Are for students that are attending further or higher education, or to assist with expenses associated with students undertaking vocational education or humanitarian/voluntary work.

The Palmerston North RSA Welfare Trust Scholarship

Presented in commemoration to a senior student who displays leadership and citizenship.

The Mary Quin Scholarship

Mary Quin's a past pupil and every year awards a scholarship to a female student who intends to study the Sciences, Technology, Vet, Medicine or Engineering.

The Moana Clarke Memorial Cup

Is presented to a senior student who has shown significant strength of character.

The Te Atawhai Award

(Gifted from the Pritchard Whanau) is for a student who embodies the spirit of the College Prayer at St Peter's College, in particular, a student who has "eyes that see the needs of others".

Class of 2022 Award for Resilience and Integrity

Is awarded to a student who has overcome challenges and has kept the school values in high regard. In doing this they are notably resilient.

The Claire Tippet Rosebowl

Is presented to a school leaver who, has exhibited excellence in all school values during their time at the College.

The Pasifika Achievement Award

Is awarded to a Pasifika student who shows academic excellence, contribution to the wider life of the college, role-modelling to Junior students and leadership of Pasifika.

The Jonasen Family Cup for Creative Technologies

Is awarded to a student who has shown significant creative success using technology.

The Joseph Grayland Award

Is presented to a student who shows integrity, service and support of the special character of the college.

The Cameron O'Brien Memorial Scholarship

Is presented to a student who, by his or her integrity and loyalty, exemplifies the Special Character of St Peter's College and intends to proceed to University or other educational institution.

Laurie McCool Scholarship

Is awarded to a student who demonstrated commitment to their studies, and intends studying in a business related field at university.

The Prime Minister's Vocational Excellence Award

Recognises the winning student's success in vocational training through Gateway or the Trade Academies.

USkills and Gateway Merit and Excellence Awards recognise students who have shown outstanding commitment to their chosen course or work placement.
