



LHCC Mentorship Program

Program Goals and Expectations

The LHCC mentor program has been formed out of a need to provide high school students with the information, tools, and connections to set them up to graduate high school, form a post-graduation plan, and help them grow into healthy adults. Almost all LHCC kids will be first generation college students or even first-time high school graduates. Most are also the oldest child in their family; therefore, their family needs guidance on what steps they should be taking throughout their high school career and beyond. Outside of academics, mentors are also able to provide students with social/emotional and spiritual support.

LHCC Commitment

LHCC will provide training and support for both the mentor and the student. The student and their family will be made aware of all commitments and sign a contract before starting the school year. Our goal is to pair each student with a mentor that aligns with their career aspirations and interests as best as possible. Students are all rising 9th graders or older.

The Details

- Each mentor/student pair will meet ***twice a month***
 - One meeting can be virtual, or they can both be in person, but there must be ***at least one in-person meeting a month.***
- Meetings will be on-site during LHCC programs on Tuesdays or Thursdays; 6-7 on Tuesdays or 5:30-6:30 on Thursdays. Off-site meetings must be approved by LHCC staff and the student's family.
- Mentors and students will receive a notebook with monthly checklists to fill out and submit, in addition to curriculum module information.
- All students will attend a bi-monthly (every other month) workshop at LHCC led by a mentor or other adult. This workshop will align with the monthly focus and program modules. Mentors are encouraged to attend and this counts as a monthly meeting.

Mentor Requirements

- 21 years of age or older
- Complete and pass a background check
- Submit the LHCC Mentor Application
- Sign a one-year commitment to the program
- Be able to meet and communicate with mentee as stated in the details above
