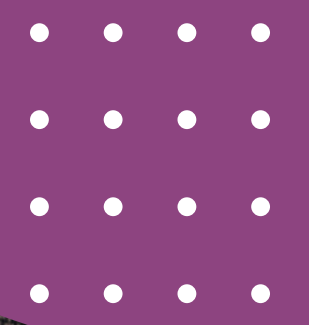

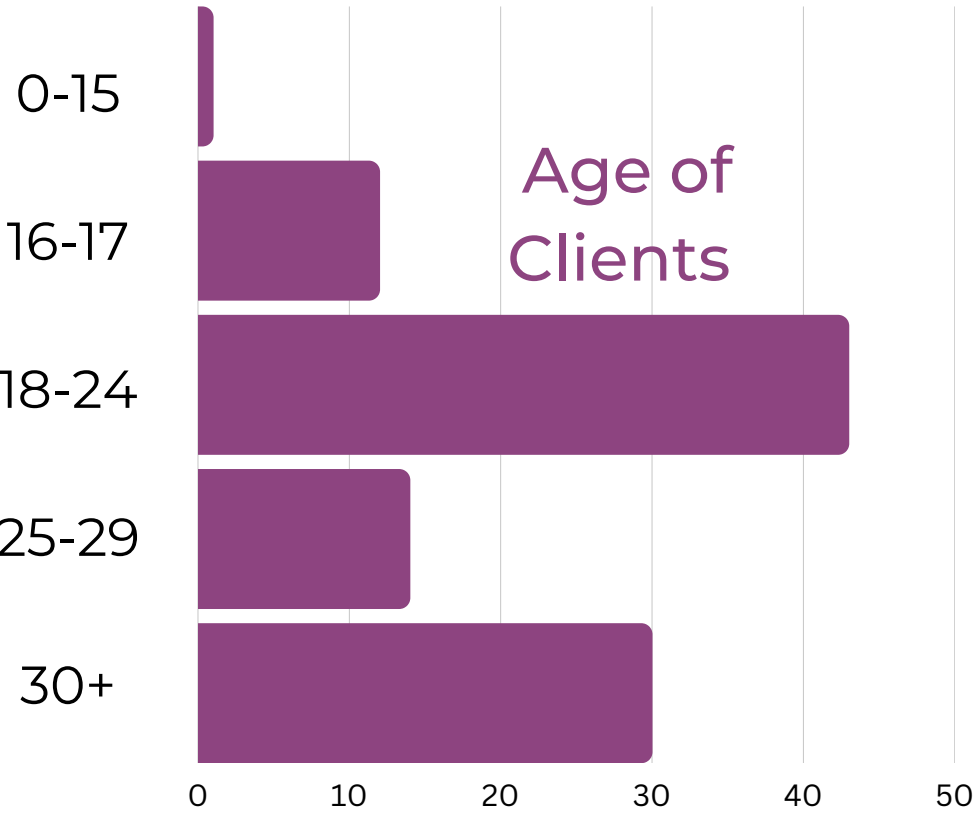

Specialized Healthcare

Our health clinic was very busy with the number of appointments increasing by **132.5%** over the previous year. The establishment of virtual healthcare within the clinic at the start of the pandemic served us well and was particularly helpful when the truckers convoy effectively closed access to our clinic at the end of January.



Services at The Clinic are by appointment only, and clients tell us they feel safe and heard by the team. Many other service providers in the city bring their clients for trauma-informed health care and we are grateful to be able to offer this support.

Human Trafficking Programs and Services

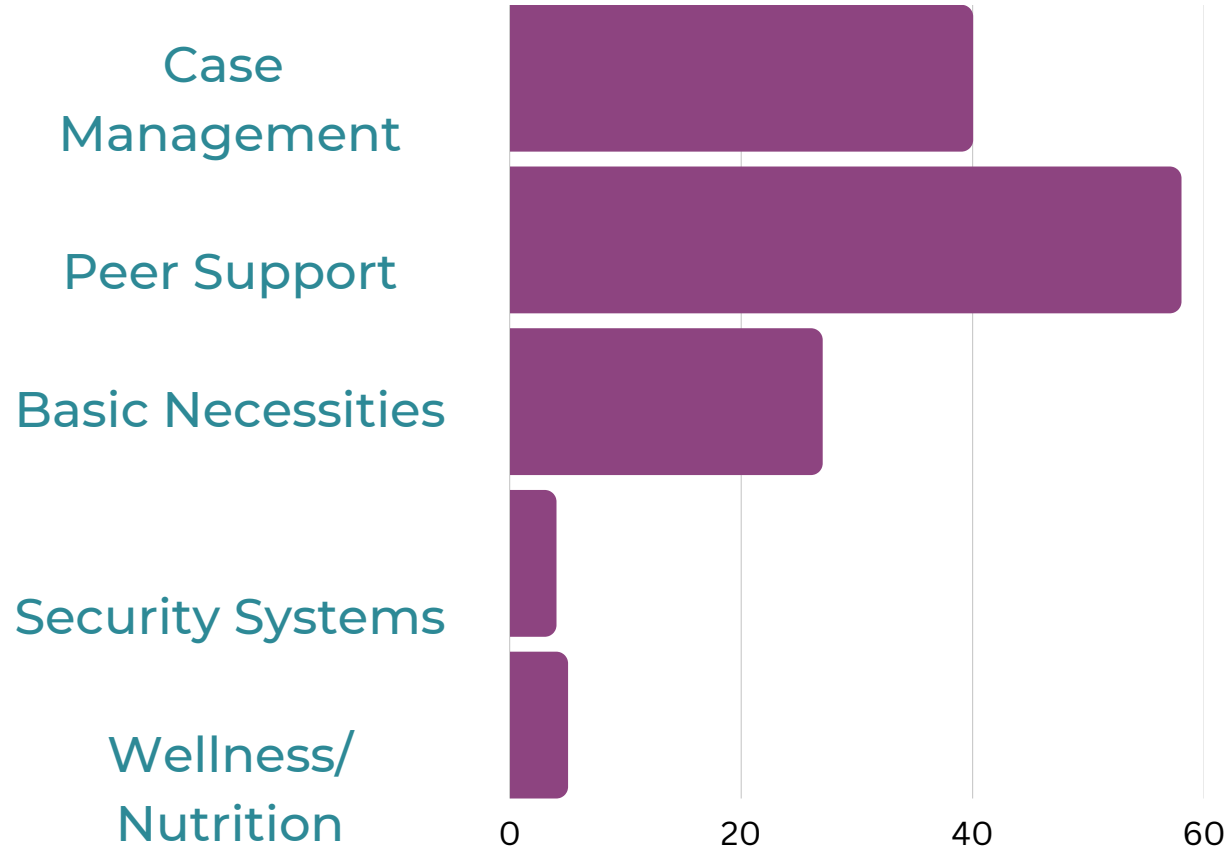
Service provision continued uninterrupted during the COVID-19 pandemic with support provided to 68 people.

65% remained exited from trafficking.



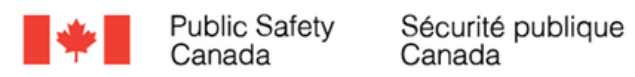
*Through the **Hope Found Project** we provide crisis, intervention and stabilization.*

Launched during the pandemic - this program has made a significant difference in the lives of adults who were sexually abused as children/youth.



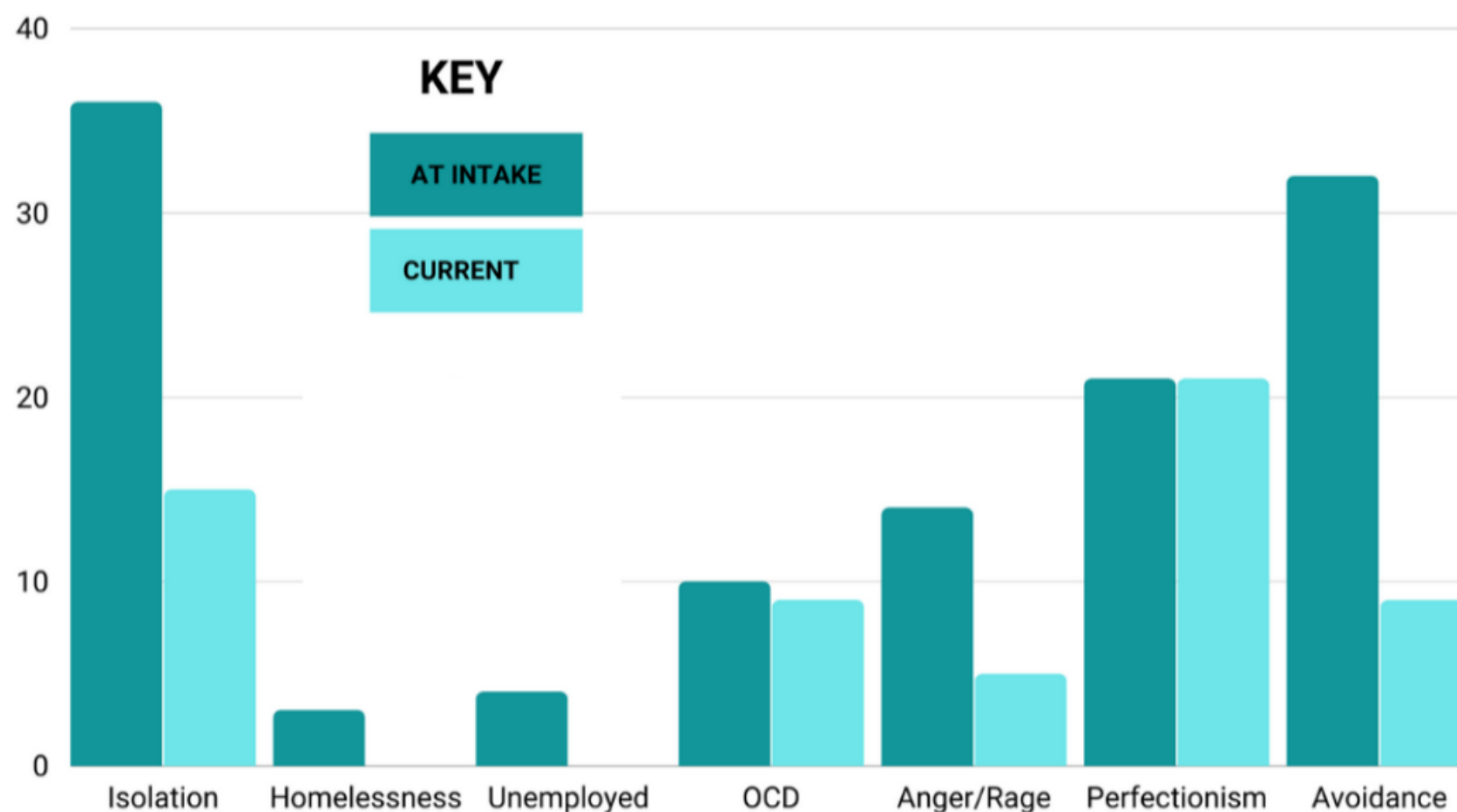

Message from Board Chair

The fiscal year from April 2021 to March 2022 presented not only Voice Found, but the entire world with profound challenges as the Covid pandemic changed everything.

As Chair, I am proud of the amazing work that has been done to continue to advocate and support those who've experienced child sexual abuse, sexual exploitation and trafficking.

Our team successfully pivoted and continued excellent client care. We learned how to provide care virtually and by phone throughout these challenging times.

Our Path Found and Hope Found programs were busier than ever serving some of our most vulnerable clients who faced increasing struggles during the pandemic.

Voice Found redefined and rebranded our health clinic that serves clients with a trauma-informed approach.

Most people do not understand the special care and time that is needed to care for our clientele in a supportive manner after they have suffered traumatic events. Our team has developed and is providing training for many in the medical field so that more people can receive the care they need without being re-traumatized.

We were able to introduce a brand-new program, Strength Found set to start just as the pandemic occurred. Our staff revamped the entire program, brought it online and created a great space for adult survivors of child sex abuse to get the support they require. The responses from participants have been heart-warming and remind us why Voice Found needs to continue to exist long into the future. I wish these programs were not needed but until we can stop childhood sexual abuse the need remains.

With several new Directors, our board has an array of strengths that have helped us guide Voice Found through one of the most challenging couple years in health care and social services. The board partnered with Girls On Board to mentor a young woman as a Director, giving her a great new experience and giving our board new perspectives.
