THE LABYRINTH AT TANGLED GARDEN

A LABYRINTH IS NOT A MAZE

Where a maze is intended to confound and amuse,
a labyrinth is meant to quiet and clarify.
(You can't get lost in a labyrinth.)

◆ LABYRINTHS ARE ANCIENT

Labyrinths are found all over the world. The earliest known labyrinth dates from 4,000 years ago. For people who could not travel to holy sites in distant lands, labyrinths became symbolic pilgrimages.

◆ LABYRINTH IS A SPIRAL

In cultures everywhere, the spiral is sacred, often representing the journey into and out of existence. The geometry of the spiral, described by the Fibonacci sequence, recurs at every scale of existence, from the arrangement of DNA to the formation of stars in their nebulae.

◆ SACRED GEOMETRY

Certain ratios have been used since Neolithic times in creating sacred spaces. These ratios, including Pi (3.1416 etc.) and Phi (1.618 etc.), are all irrational numbers, meaning that they go on forever without repeating themselves and cannot be written as fractions.

◆ WHAT THEY DO

Spaces based on this geometry are tuned like musical instruments to resonate at frequencies that assist one in entering the non-rational intuitive realm.

From the center of the labyrinth there is a long view across
the historic dyke lands of Grand Pré to the Minas Basin.

The labyrinth at Tangled Garden was created in 2004.

HOW TO WALK A LABYRINTH

It takes about 15 minutes
to walk at a meditative
pace. At the Labyrinth's
ENTRANCE, quiet your
mind and allow a question
to form.

If one doesn't present itself,
try asking "*what do I need
to know at this time?*"

The physical act of walking
balances body and spirit.
Your feet may lead you to
the answers you seek.
