Description

The Rural Placemaking Innovation Challenge (RPIC) provides planning support, technical assistance, and training to communities to foster placemaking activities in rural communities. Placemaking is a collaborative engagement process that helps leaders from rural communities create quality places where people will want to live, work, play and learn. Funds can help enhance capacity for broadband access, preserve cultural and historic structures, and support the development of transportation, housing, and recreational spaces.

Eligible Recipients

1. Federally recognized Tribes and Tribal Entities
2. Institutions of higher education
3. Nonprofit organizations
4. Public bodies (including local, county, and state governments)
5. Small private entities that meet the size standards established by the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA)

Applicants must demonstrate their organization's capacity to deliver and support rural placemaking planning activities within at least one of four regions (Northeast, South, Midwest, or West), and show that they have previous experience with federal or state grant administration.

Matching Grant Requirements

15% matching grant required

Eligible Projects

Grant recipients can use funds to provide technical assistance and training to help rural communities identify and gather partners, establish community needs, and develop placemaking plans. USDA particularly encourages applications that support planning projects to improve capacity for broadband infrastructure, deployment and access.

Recipients must develop a placemaking plan that includes implementation stages. The plan can focus on the technical assistance the organization intends to provide, or applicants can instead strengthen an already-existing placemaking plan.

The proposal must identify in detail the region or regions the applicant intends to serve (Northeast, South, Midwest, or West), and it must also describe any multisectorial or multijurisdictional plan elements.

Planning must directly benefit cities or towns with populations of 50,000 or fewer.

Tips for Being Competitive USDA encourages applicants to consider projects that will advance the following key priorities:

- Assisting rural communities recover economically from the impacts of the COVID–19 pandemic, particularly disadvantaged communities
- Ensuring all rural residents have equitable access to Rural Development (RD) programs and benefits from RD funded projects
- Reducing climate pollution and increasing resilience to the impacts of climate change through economic support to rural communities.

Examples of Prior Award Recipients In 2020, McClure Engineering Company was awarded a \$215,000 grant to develop a plan to support housing, workforce and broadband development in the city of Sheffield, Iowa, and the cities of Atchison and Lola in Kansas. McClure is providing support through partnerships with the capacity-building organizations Sheffield Betterment Foundation and Thrive Allen County.
