# SummaryThe Bipartisan Infrastructure Law provides \$1 billion to OCED for the five-year period<br/>2022-2026 to improve in rural or remote areas of the United States the resilience,<br/>safety, reliability, and availability of energy and environmental protection from adverse<br/>impacts of energy generation. OCED intends to implement these activities as the<br/>Energy Improvements in Rural or Remote Areas (ERA) Program. The purpose of this<br/>RFI is to solicit feedback on topics such as rural and remote clean energy needs and<br/>opportunities, optimal clean energy outcomes, barriers, stakeholder engagement,<br/>community benefits, and financing mechanisms that will inform the structure, strategy,<br/>and execution of the ERA Program.

### Background

The overall goal of the ERA Program is to demonstrate innovative and replicable approaches to improve the resilience, safety, reliability, and availability of, and reduce the adverse impacts from, energy generation by rural or remote areas.

The ERA Program may provide support using a number of mechanisms and tools to rural or remote areas for the purpose of:

- Improving the overall cost-effectiveness of energy generation, transmission, or distribution systems
- · Siting or upgrading transmission and distribution lines
- Reducing greenhouse gas emissions from energy generation by rural or remote areas
- Providing or modernizing electric generation facilities
- Developing microgrids
- Increasing energy efficiency

Responses to this RFI will be used by DOE for planning purposes to develop the ERA Program, which may include the use of Technical Assistance, Prizes, Funding Opportunity Announcements (FOA), Other Transactional Authorities (OTAs), or Partnership Intermediary Agreements (PIAs).
